MEMORANDUM

To: Foreign Affairs Department
From: Nives E. Fox
Subject: Turkey

Finally met with Emil Franko, our former correspondent in Turkey.

Having been away for close to a month, he knew nothing about the specific problem of the genocide meeting in Israel and inclusion of the Armenian question. He promised to check it out and let us know. In spite of the touchiness of the Armenian issue, he was most doubtful that this kind of situation would lead to any serious repercussions against the community in Turkey. Moreover, he says that there is a group in government that would like to handle the Armenian problem by admitting responsibility in the massacre and persecution instead of denying it ever took place. But those opposed to any admission of wrong remain stronger for the time being (Ministry of Interior people). It is not excluded, however, that a more frank and intelligent approach to all this might take place one day.

The community is not subjected to any greater annoyances than customary. If anything, things are calmer and quieter and more normal. Yes, new synagogues are difficult to build; old ones hard to repair: but this problem is more complicated than serious. In general, the Jewish community still fares very well. As a matter of fact, the poor having notably decreased, there is even an "excess" in the community funds. This diminution in poor has given rise to the idea that perhaps the best way to help them from now on is to make individual cash payments available for medical care or other needs, instead of keeping up structured institutions such as the hospital, etc.

There is definitely less of an urge among Jews to provide for a future outside of Turkey: emigration is down, the buying of apartments and homes abroad for such an eventuality has decreased. There are even letters from those who have left which speak of a possible return to Turkey. In other words, the regime is good for the Jews, at least to

the extent that it provides order and security of the kind the more democratic governments could not insure when extremist parties and groups did their best to fan fires of disestablishment and disequilibrium. It is our friend's profound conviction that the authorities have chosen to remain open to the West, counting on this as the sole source for aid and technical progress they believe is essential for Turkey's survival.

One new law bothers him, though for the moment it has not been applied. It was put through when the Ecevit party was in power and after the Papandreu Socialists got into office in Greece, because the last passed a law in Greece concerning the property of Turks or those of Turkish origin that permits the state to take over the property of this group. To match it, therefore, the Turks passed a somewhat similar decree; but their's had no specific mention of Greeks, and simply provides for the eventuality of a state takeover of properties belonging to minority groups. Given this vague form it is obvious that such a law, if put into action, could also be applied to Jews should the government so decide. A worry, therefore, though for the moment nothing has happened.

Mr. Frankö took great pains to repeat how welcome the military regime was and remains for most of the population. The Turkish military, he says, cannot be compared with South American juntas; and he insists that in the case of Turkey it was an absolute necessity to return to military rule because murder, Mafia-type intimidation, etc. made the simplest daily routine a dangerous excursion, and life had become impossible. He has great faith over their return to democracy, given the several precedents of previous military rule when this took place.

There is presently no question about strengthening relations with Israel. Israel's technical assistance role in the country has become virtually nonexistent. The road and construction work of Israelis everyone talked about ten years ago now no longer exists: it is the Turks who go to Arab lands to build roads now.

Behind the Gray Wolf: Anatomy of an assassin

MEHMET ALI AGCA, the young Moslem Turkish fanatic who shot the Pope, is accused by Interpol and Turkish authorities of having been linked to a right-wing extremist group called the Gray Wolves. A stunned and horrified world naturally asks:

Was this the act of a single demented man? What was there in the ideology of the Gray Wolves and its mentor, the neo-fascist National Action Party, that may have attracted the warped mind of the assassin? In what way was his act influenced by the new wave of fundamentalist Moslem fanaticism that has recently swept through much of the Middle East?

The first target of Mehmet Ali Agca was Abdi Ipekci, editor of *Milliyet*, Turkey's leading independent newspaper. Shortly before being gunned down by Agca on February 1, 1979, Ipekci had started a series of articles exposing the neo-fascist tendencies of the National Action Party of Colonel Alpaslan Turkes. Like the Pope, Ipekci had been an outspoken opponent of violence and fanaticism.

During his interrogation by Turkish police after his capture, Agca said he had killed Ipekci because he was a defender of the Turkish political and social system. Agca, who had just enrolled in the economics faculty at Istanbul University, said he acted as "an international terrorist who desired a reformed, democratic order" in the world. He hoped Ipekci's assassination would create "an uproar and panic."

In the strange world of political fanaticism the extremes of right and left use the same terrorist tactics, each hoping to profit from the resulting chaos. As Turkey was governed by a series of weak coalition governments and as the economic situation deteriorated, Marxist and other leftist groups proliferated and their influence spread among students, workers and the unemployed.

THE TERRORISM ON THE left spawned terror on the right. The far right National Action Party (NAP) sponsored the formation of the militant commando bands called the Idealistic Youth Association, popularly known as the Gray Wolves. They took this name from the legendary gray wolf who had led the Turkish tribes out of a narrow valley in which they were trapped in central Asia, enabling them to spread out from Mongolia to the Middle East.

It is not accidental that NAP leader Alpaslan Turkes chose the Gray Wolf as the symbol of his party. Born among the Turkish minority in then British-ruled Cyprus, Colonel Turkes was a young military officer, who participated in the military

junta that took power in a bloodless coup in 1960. Turkes was purged when he was in a minority calling for an authoritarian government. The majority of the army backed restoration of civilian multi-party rule after a new constitution had been drafted to strengthen civil rights and prevent the abuses that had led the army to intervene.

Turkes then went into politics advocating Pan-Turkism or Pan-Turanism, meaning the political unification of Turkey with the Turkic-speaking populations in Iran, the Soviet Union and China. While this union was theoretically on a linguistic-ethnic rather than on a Moslem religious basis, Turkes's brand of extreme nationalism worried the non-Moslem minorities—Greeks, Armenians and Jews who now constitute less than 1 percent of Turkey's population. When the NAP had controlled the Ministry of Culture as part of a coalition government in 1977, it permitted publication of articles blaming the "minorities" for the "deterioration of ethics in Turkish society." Also, editor Ipekci was descended from Donme, the Jewish followers of Sabbatai Zevi, who converted to Islam when his

messianic movement failed. This non-Turkish element in Ipekci's origin may have played a role in Agca's choice of him as a target.

In any case, Agca came of age at a time when Turkish political arguments were waged in the streets—with guns.

By the time Agca was captured by the Turkish authorities the ideological fragmentation of Turkish society had penetrated even to the police-and-prison authorities. Persons sympathetic to the NAP helped arrange his escape from the maximum security prison at Kartal-Maltepe. He managed to flee to West Germany where he may have been aided by neo-Nazi groups. When first arrested by Turkish authorities he was in possession of a passport and explained that he had been invited to attend a terrorist training course in Germany.

Agca, who was born and raised in the traditional community of Malatya in eastern Anatolia, may also have come under the influence of Necmettin Erbakan's pan-Islamic National Salvation Party (NSP), active in Malatya. Erbakan was arrested and his party banned in September 1980 for attempting to "base the state on religious principles" in violation of the Constitutional principle of secularism. NSP Malatya Deputy Recai Kutan opposed Turkey's entry into the European Common Market, charging this would put Turkey under "Christian domination." Erbakan called instead for creation of an

Islamic Common Market.

AT A MASSIVE Rally last Sept. 6 Erbakan called for an Islamic state and the rally ended with the burning of the flags of the U.S., the USSR and Israel—for Erbakan as for Ayatollah Khomeini the three Satans threatening Islam.

NSP spokesman Sevket Kazan had openly opposed the Pope's visit to Turkey in Nov. 1979 declaring it ominously significant that the leader of Catholicism came "at a time when there is a powerful awakening among the Islamic countries." He charged that the visit was intended to "prevent progress in relations between Turkey and other Islamic countries." Did this influence Agca, who wrote that he escaped from prison to stop the visit or else to "shoot the Pope" because he was "the masked leader of the Crusades?"

While it was Agca who pulled the trigger, he had accomplices—all those who sow hatred and fanaticism must share the responsibility for this terrorist act.

Dear Ambassador Elekdag,

In behalf of the American Jewish Committee and its nationwide membership, I wish to express to you the feelings of outrage we share with you over the violation of the national sovereignty of Turkey by this small group of terrorists who have brutally murdered some 25 Turkish citizens who are our Jewish co-religionists.

That these criminals could cold-bloodedly enter a sacred house of worship during Sabbath morning services and wreak their violence and hatred on innocent civilians is a revelation of the depth of barbarism to which they and their like have sunk.

We express to you our appreciation of the forthright statements of moral condemnation of these heinous acts issued by your Prime Minister Dr. Gurgut Ozal as well as by yourself.

Over the past five centuries, Turkey has often been a nation of haven for Jewish refugees from persecution and bigotry and we ~~trust~~ trust that that tradition of providing security and safety for Jews and other citizens will continue.

May we also use this occasion to acknowledge the importance of the Turkish Government's recent decision to upgrade its diplomatic representation to the State of Israel. We are confident that such acts in time will contribute to the eventual peace and stability in the Middle East that all people of reason and good-will devoutly seek.

STATEMENT BY THEODORE ELLENOFF², PRESIDENT OF THE AMERICAN JEWISH COMMITTEE², IN RESPONSE TO THE ATTACK ON THE TURKISH SYNAGOGUE ON SATURDAY, SEPT-6, 1986- - - - -

The American Jewish Committee is outraged by the savage attack of Arab fanatics which resulted in the brutal murder of 28 innocent Turkish Jewish civilians - among them seven rabbis - in the midst of Sabbath morning prayers in the Neve Shalom Synagogue in Istanbul.

This criminal act comes on the heels of the equally horrible killing of 18 innocent civilians and the wounding of scores of others in the hijacking of the Pan Am airplane at the Karachi airport by Arab-speaking terrorists.

Clearly we are facing another wave of Islamic fanaticism and violence which is nothing less than attack on the very foundations of Western democratic societies and their core values which respect life and liberty.

The international community, especially those who uphold the sanctity of each human life and support law and civility, must strengthen their resolve and join forces to assure that this criminal element is brought to justice for their murderous deeds.

The American Jewish Committee is heartened by the forthright statements of moral condemnation of these heinous acts issued by Turkish Prime Minister Turgut Ozal and Turkish Ambassador to the United States, Dr. Sukru Elekdag. We are especially appreciative of their strong declarations of solidarity and support of their 40,000 Jewish Turkish citizens of the Jewish faith. The AJC joins in those expressions of fraternal concern with our Jewish coreligionists in Turkey, which has been a country of haven for Jewish refugees over the past four centuries.
