# "CHRISTIAN RE-EXAMINATION of JUDAISM AND THE JEWS"

Rabbi Marc Tanenbaum is National Director of the Department of Interreligious Affairs of the American Jewish Committee. Formerly Executive Director of the Synagogue Council of America, he was recently characterized as "One of The Nation's Leading Rabbis". He served as Vice-Chairman of the Executive Committee of the White House Conference on Children and Youth, as Program Chairman of the National Conference on Religion and Race. A recognized authority on Christian-Jewish relations, he has an impressive number of interreligious firsts:

He arranged the First Agape on American soil for Augustux Cardinal Bea in April 1963; he was the first rabbi ever to serve as a member of the international faculty of the Sister Formation Conference, which educates 180,000 teaching nuns. He was the first rabbi ever to attend as an official observer the Annual Assembly of the National Association of Evangelicals. He was the first Jewish speaker to address the National Catholic Welfare Conference. He was the first rabbi ever to address the Congress of the Third Order of St. Francis, one of the largest laymen's groups of the Catholic Church. His articles have appeared in the **New York Herald Tribune**, **World View, Ave Maria, Cross Currents, The Ecumenist, The Reconstructionist.**




His Eminence Terence Cardinal Cooke upon his return from the Consistory in Rome

Rabbi Tanenbaum served as Program Chairman of this potent threeday Conference of national religious leaders.

Rabbi Tanenbaum has held many positions as officer, director and consultant in government and voluntary agencies. RABBI MARC H. TANENBAUM NATIONAL DIRECTOR INTERRELIGIOUS AFFAIRS DEPARTMENT AMERICAN JEWISH COMMITTEE

Rabbi Marc H. Tanenbaum is National Director of the Interreligious Affairs Department of the American Jewish Committee. Hailed by the United Press International as "one of the nation's leading Rabbis," he was the only Rabbi in Vatican City at the time of the introduction of the Jewish decree at the Ecumenical Council, where he was consulted by numerous Cardinals, Bishops, and Protestant observers. Rabbi Tanenbaum has held a number of significant government, civic, and religious positions of national prominence.

Regarded as an authority on Christian-Jewish relations, he is the Jewish Consultant to the Pius XII Religious Education Resource Center and The Sister Formation Conference. He has worked closely with Cardinal Bea's Secretariat and the American Catholic hierarchy to advance Catholic-Jewish understanding and has been active in a similar program of cooperation with the World and National Council of Churches Committee on the Church and the Jewish People. He has written for Catholic, Protestant, Jewish, and general publications, and has appeared on numerous network and local radio and TV programs.

Rabbi Tanenbaum is a dynamic speaker, and this meeting is an important one for all who are interested in learning more about interreligious affairs and putting them in their proper perspective. It is a rare privilege to have him with us. Be there!
