Dear Mare:

Since I have not been able to contact you by phone, I would like to extend an invitation for you to participate in a progrem scheduled for the same day you will be in Baltimore (April 20) under the arepices of the (Battimore) Citizens Holoearst Committee of which Dr. Wickwire and I are co-chairmen.

This public meeting will feature two presentations on the theme "The Holocarpt: Historic Carpes; Prepent Responsibilities" Dr. Samuel L. Banks, director of social studies for the public schools of Baltimore (which have the year initiated received Holocaret segments of their corriculum) will speak on Holocavet education in the public schools. What makes the particularly noteworthy is that Banks is Black and the Baltimore schools are about 75 porcent Black and only 9 percent Jewish. Dr. Norman Levine, professor of history at the Unwersity of Manyland, will speek on the causes of the Holoesvet. Levine has published in both historical journals and magazines like Judaism. We would like you to comment on both presentations. Hopefully, an authore if not the papers themselves, would be sent to you beforehand.

The program on April 20 is supported by a grant from the Maryland Committee on the Humanities so we are in a propition to provide you with an honorarium of \$100.
