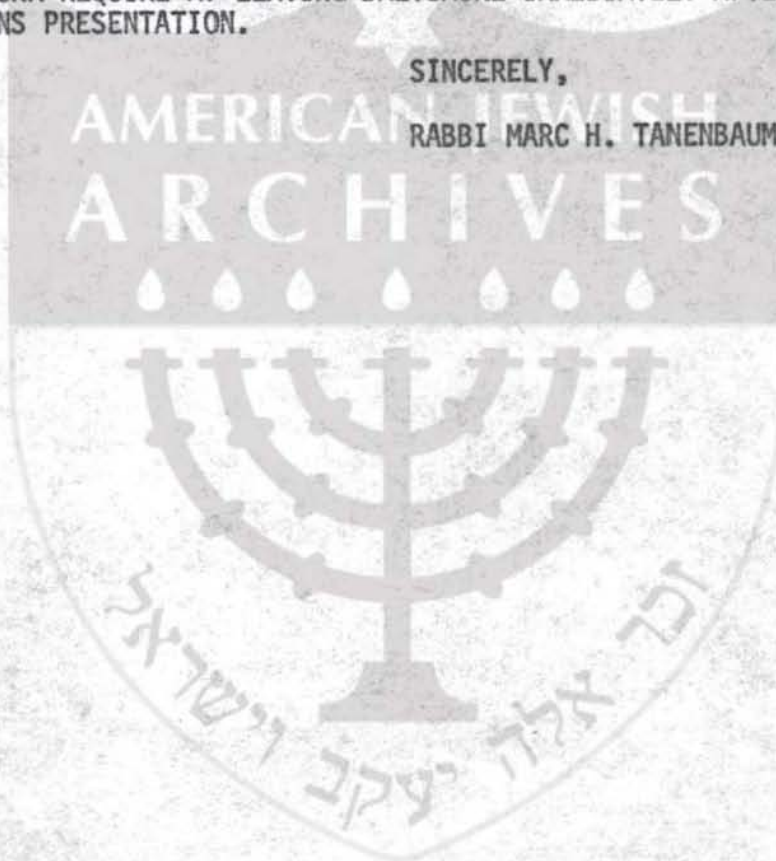

Dear Marc:

Since I have not been able to contact you by phone, I would like to extend an invitation for you to participate in a program scheduled for the same day you will be in Baltimore (April 20^{2:00 p.m.}) under the auspices of the (Baltimore) Citizens Holocaust Committee of which Dr. Wickwire and I are co-chairmen.

This public meeting will feature two presentations on the theme "The Holocaust: Historic Causes; Present Responsibilities". Dr. Samuel L. Banker, director of social studies for the public schools of Baltimore (which have this year initiated required Holocaust ~~segments~~ ^{components} of their curriculum) will speak on Holocaust education in the public schools. What makes that particularly noteworthy is that Banker is Black and the Baltimore schools are about 75 percent Black and only 9 percent Jewish. Dr. Norman Levine, professor of history at the University of Maryland, will speak on the causes of the Holocaust. Levine has published in both historical journals and magazines like Judaism. We would like you to comment on both presentations. Hopefully, an outline if not the papers themselves, would be sent to you beforehand.

The program on April 20 is supported by a grant from the Maryland Committee on the Humanities so we are in a position to provide you with an honorarium of \$100.

Because of the nature of the meeting and of our Citizens Holocaust Committee ^(see enclosure) we expect a good turnout of clergy and educators and substantial media coverage. We think your participation will add greatly to the quality and impact of the event.
