IN AMERICA: Hadassah helps interpret Israel to the American people; provides basic Jewish education as a background for intelligent and creative Jewish living in America; conducts a program for American Jewish youth; educates members to their responsibilities as American citizens and provides information on vital issues so they may work to safeguard democracy, promote peace; is a constituent member of the American Zionist Federation.

IN ISRAEL: Hadassah supports a medical healing, teaching and research network radiating from the Hadassah-Hebrew University Medical Center at Kiryat Hadassah and Mt. Scopus, Jerusalem. It is a paramount force in the development of Youth Aliyah, providing substantial funds for maintenance and education as well as for special projects undertaken periodically. Hadassah also provides education through a comprehensive high school and community college and participates in a program of Jewish National Fund land purchase and reclamation.

HASHACHAR: Hadassah is sole sponsor of this youth movement for boys and girls, 9 to 25, organized in four age levels. Club and summer camp programs in the U.S., Summer Institutes, Year Study Courses, etc. in Israel, help youth understand problems they face as Americans, Jews and Zionists, and help develop links with Israel.

HADASSAH carries out the program described above through two corporations: Hadassah, the Women's Zionist Organization of America, Inc., which administers the American program, and Hadassah Medical Relief Association, Inc., which administers the Israel program.

Thank you for agreeing to participate in Yeshiva University's Summer Institute on The Holocaust which will be held from June 30 to July 17, 1980.


