

Dear Rabbi Tanenbaum,

This letter will confirm your appearance at Temple Emanu-El, in Palm Beach, Florida, on January 23d, 24th, and 25th, 1987, as our Scholar in residence.

As set forth in our previous conversation, the fee will be \$3,000, to include lodging and meals.

The weekend activities begin at Friday evening services, where you will make your initial presentation, in lieu of the Rabbi's sermon. On Saturday morning, some of our previous scholars have discussed the Torah portion of the week, inasmuch as the second presentation is made at the luncheon session, following services. Actually, our committee has not as yet met to discuss the format, but that will be the time for your second presentation. A reception for subscribers is held Saturday evening, beginning with Havdalah, at which time an informal question and answer period has formerly been held. Following the Shaharit service on Sunday morning, a brunch is scheduled, when the final and summarizing presentation is made.

The brochure which you enclosed, circling topics of a previous seminar, lists an overall topic, "JEWISH UNITY-THREATS AND CHALLENGES", and two other topics based on the above. We will require the third presentation for Sunday morning, so we would appreciate your giving that some thought and then informing us, for future publicity.

Thank you for the biographical material, Rabbi Tanenbaum. My overall chairman has requested that I ask you for some "personal" background, as to your education, etc. If you can comply, we will appreciate it.

Should you be able to arrive on Thursday the 22nd, or early in the day on Friday, the 23d, we would be able to perhaps arrange for an interview with the local TV station as well as the Jewish press. Please advise us accordingly.

I will appreciate hearing from you at your earliest possible convenience so that we will have it, officially, in writing, that you will appear here on the above given dates. Also, your response to my questions will be very much appreciated.

I hope that you will be able to relax and enjoy a pleasant summer.
