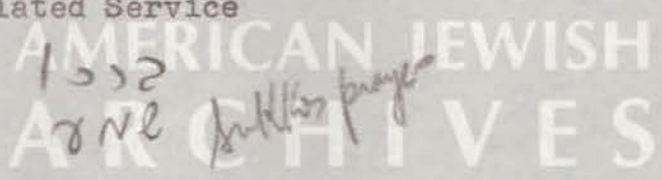
11:15 1. Service begins; children to be consecrated <sup>all</sup> not in Temple, but in Community Hall
