INTRODUCTION

A CYCLE IS COMING TO AN END. THE FIRST GENERATION OF YOUNG LEADERSHIP IS FINISHED. IT IS ALMOST 20 YEARS. THOSE MEN DID A BEAUTIFUL JOB, BUT IT WAS ONLY PIONEERING -- IN THE SENSE THAT THEY CONCENTRATED ON BUILDING A TRADE NAME; ON IMPROVING THEIR OWN KNOWLEDGE, PERCEPTIONS AND EMOTIONS; ON ADDING CAMPAIGN STRENGTH LOCALLY AND NATIONALLY BY SETTING HIGHER STANDARDS FOR GIVING AND WORKING.

THE SECOND GENERATION MUST BEGIN ITS WORK, AND THIS CONFERENCE COULD BE CONSIDERED THE SECOND WATERSHED, TO PROPEL THE CABINET INTO A MORE ADVANCED STAGE OF ACTION AND ACHIEVEMENT.

Where DID THE AMERICAN JEWISH COMMUNITY COME FROM? WHAT DID IT DO?

- A. 1880-1914 -- IT WAS CREATED BY MASS MIGRATION OF POVERTY-STRICKEN EAST EUROPEAN JEWS. (THEY FOUND A SMALL BASE OF SEPHARDIC AND WEST-EUROPEAN ASHKENAZI).
- B. FIRST PHASE 1900-1940 -- IT TOOK CARE OF ITSELF -- AMERICANIZATION; FIGHTING ANTI-SEMITISM; BUILDING SYNAGOGUES AND HOSPITALS AND CENTERS -- GROWTH OF FEDERATIONS.

- C. SECOND PHASE 1940-1967 -- REACTION TO HOLOCAUST; CREATION OF ISRAEL; MERGING OF WELFARE FUNDS AND FEDERATIONS.
- D. JHIRD PHASE 1967-1980 -- STRONG EMOTIONAL SUPPORT FOR ISRAEL; BEGINNING OF CREATING A SENSE OF WORLD-PEOPLEHOOD.

I. SETTING UP A MONITORING SYSTEM, TO TEST PROGRESS TOWARD THESE GOALS -- REMOVE OBSTACLES -- SOLVE PROBLEMS -- FIND ERRORS -- SUGGEST CHANGES AND IMPROVEMENTS.

IV. A NEW RATIONALE FOR SURVIVAL

- A. WE ALWAYS INTERPRETED OUR ROLE AS MESSIANIC -
 I.E. IMPROVEMENT OF SOCIETY ON THIS EARTH BY

 APPLICATION OF OUR VALUE SYSTEM TO HUMAN PROBLEMS.

 WE WERE CHOSEN TO OFFER MORAL INSPIRATION.
- B. As the population of the Earth Grew Larger, and we remained small (or even smaller, by genocide) -- some Jews saw the above role-definition as pretentious and even untrue, and lost their messianic zeal, deliberately preferring to be "Like everybody else". This attitude will lead to quick death -- in 2-3 generations.
- C. EVEN THOSE JEWS WHO CLUNG TO A SENSE OF OUR UNIQUENESS, NEVERTHELESS FOUND IT INCREASINGLY DIFFICULT TO ARTICULATE THEIR EMOTIONAL ATTACHMENTS. THAT HAS BEEN THE PRESENT PROBLEM -- AND THAT HAS BEEN ONE OF THE SUCCESSES OF THE YOUNG LEADERSHIP CABINET -- NAMELY ITS ABILITY TO HELP ITS MEMBERS ARTICULATE THEIR SENSE OF IDENTITY AND EXPLAIN WHY THEY THOUGHT JEWISH SURVIVAL WAS IMPORTANT, FOR THE JEWS AND FOR THE WHOLE WORLD.

- D. BUT NOW -- WE ARE CONFRONTED WITH A NEW PROBLEM -THE SPACE AGE. IF WE ALREADY FOUND IT DIFFICULT TO
 BELIEVE IN JEWISH UNIQUENESS AS WE DIMINISHED TO
 A SPECK ON THIS PLANET -- HOW MUCH MORE SO WILL WE
 BE AFFECTED WHEN MAN EXPLODES OFF THIS GLOBE AND
 STARTS TO COLONIZE OTHER PLANTS AND OTHER SOLAR
 SYSTEMS. HOW TRIVIAL AND UNIMPORTANT MIGHT JEWISH
 VERBIAGE SOUND IN THE LOUNGE ROOM OF THE SPACE
 STATION ON ORION OR BETELGUSE.
- E. Your generation had better begin the preparations for the writing of a document which will spell out for the next 10 generations (a span of 200-300 years) a rationale for Jewish survival as man begins to explore the stars and colonize the world of far space.
