
As I understand that you are planning to come to the United States during that time, I wanted to write you to see


Dear Rabbi Friedman:

Thanks for the article from the Carlisle Evening Sentinel. If we have room, we will certainly use it in the FYI mailer.

With regard to your question about capital expansion, there are two things which are relevant. First of all Pincus said, at his presentation at the CJFWF, that Israel was freezing the building of all hospitals, child welfare centers, pre-natal clinics and all other such buildings. Israel does not build homes for the aged, but if they did I am sure they would be frozen also. The other fact comes from San Francisco, which had plans for an \$8 million hospital building program, which had been scheduled for 1969 and for which the first \$1 million in gifts had been already obtained. In the face of this emergency situation, San Francisco decided to postpone the building of this hospital.

Dear Sir:

I should like to correct a possible misimpression in an article published 8 December in your newspaper.

I was having a very interesting and serious conversation with your reporter about the nature of the American Jewish community. I was describing the manner in which it was organized, and was explaining that the organized community apparatus which exists today in almost every city in America is really the definitive structure. This organized community reaches the maximum number of Jews possible, and cuts across all lines, religious and non-religious, Zionist and non-Zionist.

The misunderstanding which might have occurred and which might mislead readers as to my views was stated in the sentence "Mass organizations are dead or dying -- the Zionist organization is passe." I do not wish to give the impression of having criticized any organization, Zionist or otherwise, for that was not my intent and purpose. The large membership organizations, such as Hadassah, ZOA, B'nai B'rith and many others all perform useful and fruitful work. I was simply trying to say that all Jews in America now, whether Zionist or not in the technical sense, have identified themselves with Israel most affirmatively, and express that identification through their support of their organized community and its annual campaign.

I'm flying back to San Francisco from Salt Lake City after leading a Young Leadership group through an evening discussing Jewish identity.

They wanted a 'no mention of campaign', Reisman sensitivity experience. I wanted to introduce an immediate connection between Jewish identity and giving.

I found these people to be well in control, (aware), of their Jewish identities, yet fragmented personally and communally, and void of a Jewish overview.

Back to the above later!

In the "you should know category": Following the LDC retreat at Fallen Leaf Lake, there was formed a "New Leadership" Section" in the San Francisco Division Campaign, in part due to some previous set-up and greatly due, I believe, to your presence at the retreat.

Barry Judelman, yourself and the direction of these times, have served to suddenly navigate the core of LDC around the corner to action.

On less than a week's notice, we turned out just under forty people to form a campaign process to solicit their peers and commence an out-reach for additional strength.

The solicitation team is composed of some of the most impassioned resistors to money talk at the retreat. Eighteen people have signed up for a prospect analysis rating meeting next week. Their goal as LDC in Campaign people is to have everyone living in San Francisco (260) solicited in "their style" by the Super Sunday Campaign kick-off. It's going to happen!

The Salt Lakers were fatalistic about the future of Israel and ambivalent about linking their quest for Jewish identity and values to the good or bad fortune of the Israelis. They don't like Israel's government.

After two hours of lovely talk I opened the door and introduced them to Campaign '82. We had a terrific series of confrontations. They were outraged that I should have injected that subject into the evening especially with new people. Sounds like the LDC retreat all over again.

Yet in the end, they asked to come back and talk about the Campaign and "Why Give?"

I was reading about the Durants and recalled that you and your wife were speaking of them the morning you flew out of San Francisco.

Best wishes, love and health to your both. I'm glad to know you are out there doing your thing. Thank you and looking forward to meeting again.
