### NOTES FOR PALM SPRINGS CONFERENCE FILE -- 1961

1. Make sure that the questions that are planted on the floor are written by our own people and not by the Los Angeles community.

2. Don't let the UJFWF of Los Angeles play such an important role in the conference. They bring too many people in and give the entire conference the aura of being under their auspices rather than under UJA auspices. We should do everything possible to make this a "UJA" conference. We understand that we have to bring Los Angeles into it but we shouldn't let them take over as much as they do although, as a practical matter, Irving Bernstein actually runs everything and does everything.

3. Some of our leaders must be brought out to Palm Springs at the very least a week in advance of the conference and work on setting up small meetings from communities at which fundraising can take place, formally or informally. There's no doubt that those communities out west are right for this and look forward to it. They think that being invited to a cocktail party is an honor and they know that they are going to be asked for money. It's easy.

#### 4. Publicity:

We are not getting the kind of publicity we want. It's our own fault because we don't do anything about it. Be sure to send a good publicity man out a week or two weeks in advance of the conference so that he can handle publicity not only locally (who cares about the publicity in the Palm Sorings desert sun?) but in Los Angeles and, more important, in every one of the communities represented by leaders who were at the conference. There should be individual stories going back to every one of these communities on their people who were at the conference.

5. Be more careful with regard to the introductions of our speakers. Herbert Friedman, for example, is not a guest speaker at a UJA conference and cut out this nonsense about being a chaplain with the 9th Army Corp or whatever it is. He's getting too old for that.

6. Work up a conference department to take over the running of the conference and jazz up the decorations.

Next year the Palm Springs Conference will be run the fourth weekend in February.

I have just been able to confirm the Riviers Hotel for our 1961 Western Leadership Institute. As requested by MAF, the dates will be February 26, 27 and 28.

Since the conference will be running at the height of the sesson, the Riviers Notel was unvilling to give us more than 75 rooms. However, with the help of Id, the hotel agreed to a guarantee of 150 rooms.

We still have not come to an agreement on the price for the weekend. The hotel is seeking a considerable increase over the package price we had for this year's conference. This matter will probably not be resolved for several months, and it may be necessary to bring in Los Angeles leadership in order to arrive at a mutually satisfactory price.

You apparently asked Julius for his recommendations for the utilization of Eban. Julius obviously pointed out the most important meeting in the West, mainly the Conference.

Isn't it healthy and positive to have Bisno and others like him feel responsible for the success of the Conference? I have tried to make everybody out here feel they have a stake in the meeting, since this meeting is the springboard to their campaigns.

If this is wrong, I wish we can get together in the near future, so that we might discuss this at some length. It really isn't possible to resolve anything via the mail or correspondence.
