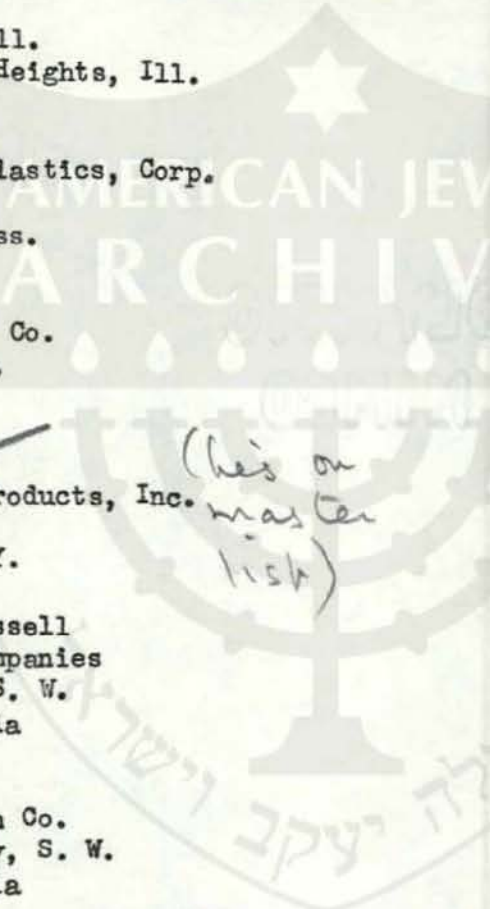

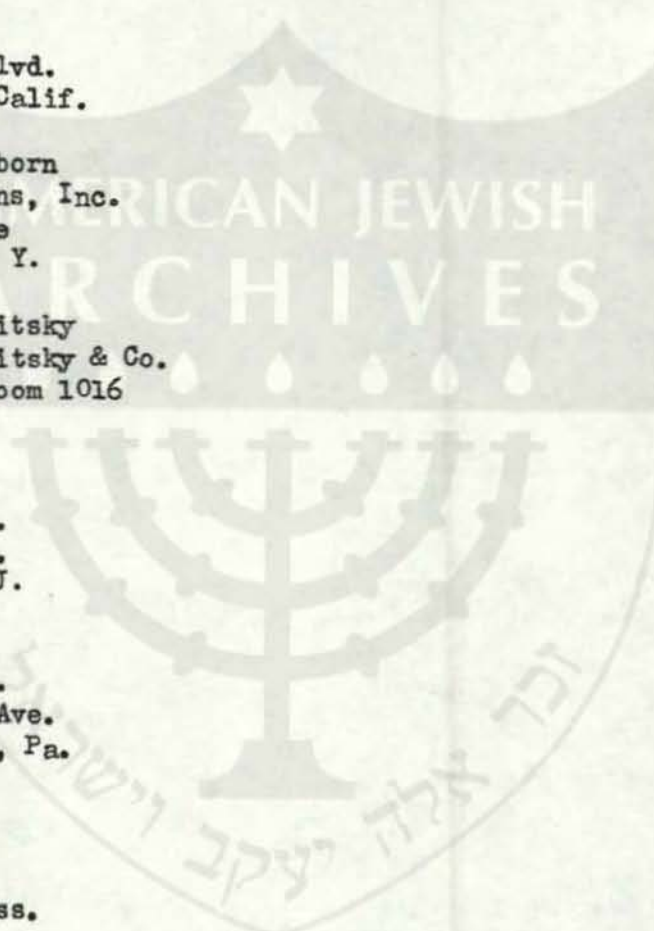

There will be an important meeting of the National Campaign Cabinet of the United Jewish Appeal on Monday, January 19th, at 6:30 p.m. in the Carpenter Suite of the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel in New York City. This will be a dinner meeting and I should like to urge you to attend.

The meeting is being called in response to certain urgent campaign problems that have come up and really demand our attention. We want to be able to discuss these problems in detail with the Cabinet and obtain the full benefit of your advice. As you probably know, among other things, we are in the midst of planning with communities the basis on which the UJA will participate in the various campaigns next year and there are some delicate points we want to call to your attention.

On Sunday, February 1st, there will be another meeting of the Cabinet in Miami Beach. This will be a breakfast meeting that will begin at 9 a.m. I will let you know in a short time the exact place where this meeting will be held. The main purpose of this meeting will be to plan for the fullest effectiveness of the National Inaugural Conference to be held at the Fontainebleau in Miami Beach on Saturday evening, February 7th. As you already know, this traditional affair that annually launches the UJA national campaign will be a banquet session at which Ambassador Abba Eban and Jack Benny will be honored.

Please let me know whether you will attend the Cabinet meetings by sending me the enclosed card.

I was tremendously gratified to learn you will be making your impact felt as Chairman of the 1959 campaign in Syracuse. I can't begin to tell you how much encouragement it gives me to know that someone like you will be in a key position of this sort. Thank you very much indeed for accepting this post. You certainly have my warmest wishes for a thoroughly successful campaign.

What you are doing is especially heartening because a new situation has developed which makes the responsibilities faced by the UJA this year far greater even than was contemplated at our National Conference in December. Israel Finance Minister Levi Eshkol arrived in the United States this week and gave me a shocking report on problems now confronting Israel as a result of the flood of Romanian immigrants now arriving. The monthly rate of those coming out of Romania is already shooting toward 10,000 and the mass exodus of the total Romanian Jewish population of a quarter-million appears possible. This has made it absolutely imperative that we consult with the topmost American Jewish leaders to expand considerably plans for the 1959 campaign. Therefore we have called a meeting which will begin at 5 p.m. on Monday, January 19th, at the Crystal Room of the Savoy Hilton Hotel in New York. Eshkol himself will be at the meeting to tell what is happening.

We strongly feel that the Israel Finance Minister is entitled to know the reaction of the American Jewish leadership to the critical situation that now exists. I urgently hope you will attend this meeting even at such short notice, and I would deeply appreciate hearing from you that you will be there.

Fred Forman has told me about what you wrote to him, and I was very sorry to learn that there was illness in your family. I do hope that this letter finds the illness already very much improved.

I must tell you that we have gotten a shocking report from Israel Finance Minister Levi Eshkol, who has just arrived in the United States this week, about the problems facing Israel as a result of the flood of Romanian emigrants now arriving. The monthly rate of those coming from Romania already is shooting toward 10,000, and the mass exodus of the total Romanian Jewish population of a quarter-million appears possible. This has made it absolutely imperative that we consult with the topmost American Jewish community leaders to expand considerably plans for the 1959 campaign. I must honestly tell you my opinion that Israel is in real trouble. The officers of the UJA have discussed this at great length and have decided to expand the Cabinet meeting called for January 19th to include other outstanding Jewish community leaders. Eshkol himself will describe what is happening. The meeting will now begin at 5 p.m. on Monday, January 19th, in the Crystal Room of the Savoy Hilton Hotel in New York. No fund-raising is intended at this meeting but it certainly seems Eshkol is entitled to know the reaction of the American Jewish leadership to the critical situation that now exists.

It will be wonderful if you could let me know that you will attend this meeting -- not only because your participation would be so tremendously helpful, but also because it would mean the sickness in your family is getting better.

Fred told me some time ago about your situation in regard to serving on the Cabinet, and much as we would like to have you continue with us in this capacity we are arranging, in accordance with your wishes, to remove your name from the membership.

Emigration from Rumania has increased considerably. 5,600 Jews left Rumania for Israel in December. 7,000 exit permits were issued during that month; 10,000 for January is not out of the question. This has placed the Jewish Agency in a very critical situation.

Levi Eshkol, Israel's Finance Minister, arrived here Wednesday. He is terribly concerned. The officers of the UJA met with him for many hours and decided to call a special meeting of top community leaders to meet with Mr. Eshkol on January 19th at 5.00 p.m. in the Crystal Room of the Savoy-Hilton Hotel in New York. Attached is a copy of the telegram that was sent to the leaders.



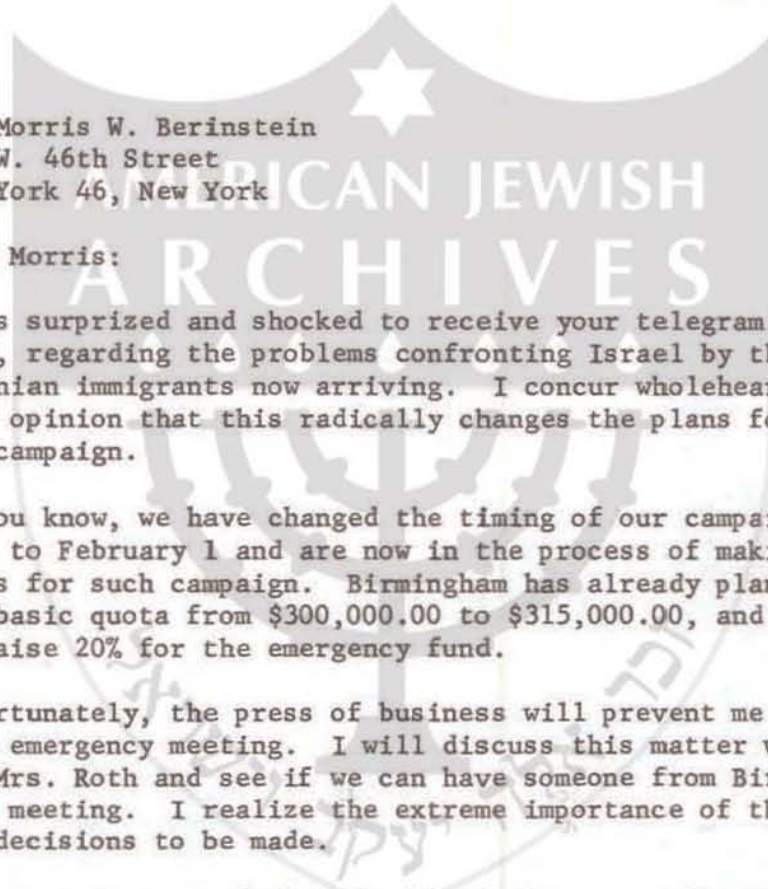
You can rest assured that the Birmingham community will do all in its power to meet this challenge and new problem brought on by the flood of Rumanian immigrants to Israel.

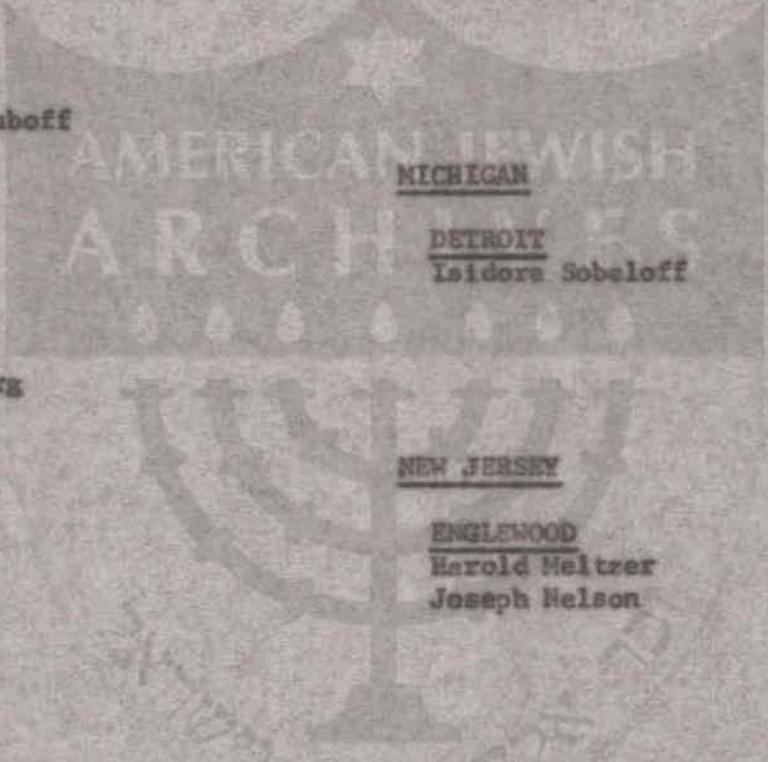

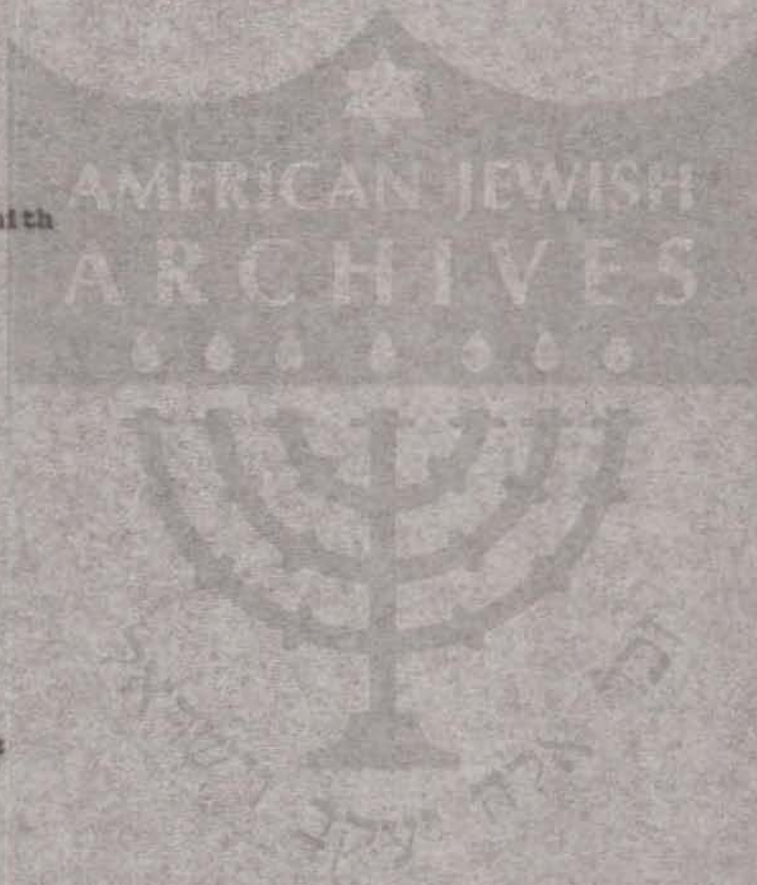

In addition, I am grateful for your efforts to have some representation from Birmingham there.

Having said all this, I must add that I am still hoping circumstances will yet permit you to come to New York for the meeting. Of course, if you find it simply impossible, we will understand, but your participation really would be tremendously helpful. The situation resulting from the Romanian emigration is so serious, and the re-consideration we now have to give to overall campaign goals, community quotas and the like could not be more vital.

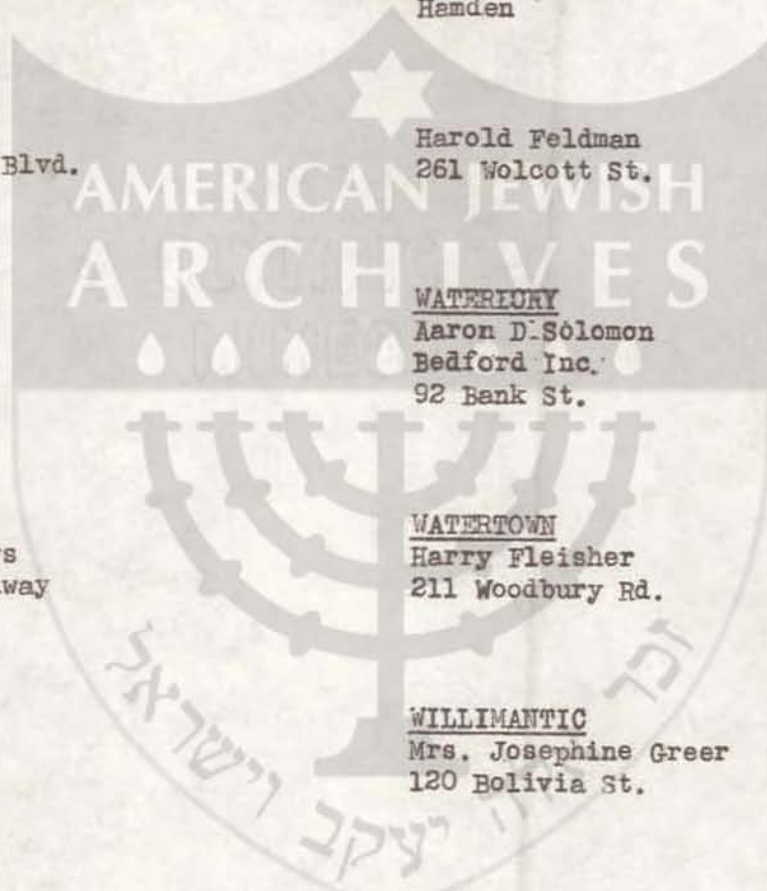

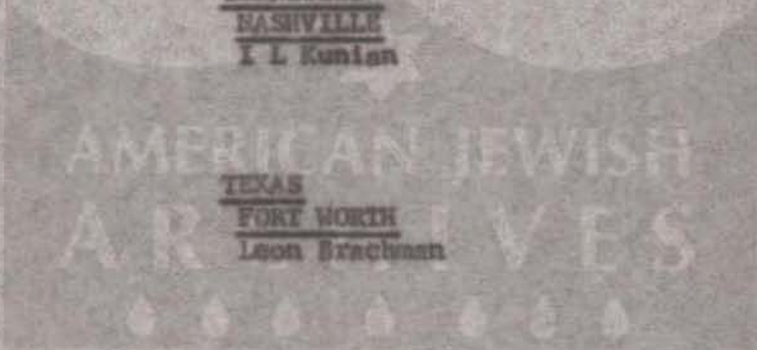

'FULL PHILANTHROPIC PRIORITY' ASKED BY ESHKOL
FOR UJA'S \$100 MILLION SPECIAL FUND

Emergency Session in New York Hears Israeli Official's Report on
Israel's 'Greatest Immigration Crisis in a Decade' --
100,000 Expected From Eastern Europe in 1959

New York, Monday, January 19

A plea that American Jews give "full philanthropic priority" to a United Jewish Appeal \$100,000,000 Special Fund for resettling 100,000 immigrants expected by Israel this year from Eastern Europe was voiced tonight by Levi Eshkol, Finance Minister of Israel.

Mr. Eshkol's plea was made to 200 key American Jewish leaders at the Savoy-Hilton, called together in an emergency session to hear the high-ranking official report on Israel's greatest immigration crisis in a decade.

"I know," he declared, "it sounds trite to say we are faced by our greatest immigration emergency in ten years, but the plain, cruel, truth is that we are."

The crisis arises "not just from the numbers who are coming," he told the group. "It derives from the fact that Israel has no housing available for immigrants beyond the next month or so and no funds with which to build more." He said Israel expected some 8,000 immigrants monthly following the recent liberalization of emigration procedures by various East European governments.

The largest Jewish community in Eastern Europe outside the Soviet Union is that of Rumania, numbering 250,000 Jews. Poland has about 40,000 remaining Jews.

The conference, made up of leaders from communities across the nation about to conduct drives in behalf of the 1959 United Jewish Appeal, also heard from Morris W. Berinstein, UJA General Chairman, Avraham Harman, member of the Executive of the Jewish Agency, and Charles Jordan, Director General of the Joint Distribution Committee.

The Jewish Agency carries out the humanitarian work of receiving and re-establishing Israel's newcomers, with voluntary funds raised primarily by the United Jewish Appeal, while the JDC meets the needs of distressed Jews in 24 overseas countries.

The UJA General Chairman pointed out that the emergency meeting was "unprecedented," in that the leaders had been called back from their communities only a month after the UJA Annual Conference, December 12-14 in New York. There they voted to seek a \$100 million Special Fund "over and above" the 1959 UJA regular goal of \$105 million to meet the ongoing programs of its beneficiaries.

Mr. Berinstein told the Jewish leaders, "We have called you back to give you the full story on Israel's new immigration emergency."

He recalled that in December, Dr. Dov Joseph, Treasurer of the Jewish Agency, had urged delegates to the UJA Annual Conference to help Israel's people take in a large immigration in 1959.

"Israel's leaders then estimated 50,000 would be coming," Mr. Berinstein said. "In a single month," the UJA General Chairman added, "all immigration estimates have had to be doubled. Today most evidence points to the fact that an immigration flood has started that will continue for many months."

The UJA General Chairman told his audience, "None of us dares to take Mr. Eshkol's plea lightly. In answer to this greatest immigration crisis in a decade, American Jews must be urged to respond in the same full and understanding measure as they did a decade ago.

"If we fail to reach our goal," Mr. Berinstein told the audience, "we will cause untold hardship to the newcomers and Israel's people." He added, "We who count ourselves the friends of Israel's people will have handed them a severe setback to all they have accomplished in building a working democracy in ten years."

He urged the audience to advance the progress of their pre-campaign efforts, with a view to producing the greatest sums possible for the UJA National Inaugural Conference in Miami, February 7. The Conference, to be attended by 1,000 delegates,

will formally launch the 1959 campaign.

Avraham Harman, member of the Jewish Agency Executive, who arrived last week from Jerusalem for the meeting, declared that despite the present emergency, one 1959 welfare objective that must be retained to the fullest extent possible was a program for clearing Israel's "ma'abarot" -- shanty towns housing 110,000 earlier immigrants.

"The huts and shacks of the present 'ma'abarot' are in such condition that they cannot serve as shelter for those who have lived in them already six to seven years. Nor can the Jewish Agency, or you, in the name of humanity, ask the new immigrants to go into such shelters."

Mr. Harman revealed that the Agency hopes to direct the greatest number of newcomers to various "development" areas in Israel's less populated regions. These include the Galilee region in Israel's north, and the Negev region in Israel's south.

The Jewish Agency official said that the Agency must have \$1,600 to meet the costs of an immigrant's first year in Israel. This includes transportation from Eastern Europe, the immigrant's share of housing costs, and welfare services.

"There are few places in the world," he said, "where a newcomer can be started on a new way of life for so little per person. But that minimum is necessary and American Jews can ensure it only if they raise \$100 million this year above their regular goal as their share of the problem."

Through both the Special Fund and its regular campaign the UJA will aid more than 630,000 people through its member agencies -- the United Israel Appeal, which supports the work of the Jewish Agency in transporting and absorbing newcomers to Israel; the Joint Distribution Committee which provides aid for aged and handicapped in Israel and for Jews in need in 24 other countries; and the New York Association for New Americans, which provides adjustment services to refugees reaching the United States. The United HIAS Service, concerned with migration to countries other than Israel, will participate in the Special Fund.

200 Key Leaders Called to "One of Most Important UJA Gatherings Since
World War II," After UJA Officers Hear Urgent Report by Israel Finance Minister

NEW YORK — Some 200 key American Jewish leaders have been called to an extraordinary session of the National Campaign Cabinet of the United Jewish Appeal at the Savoy-Hilton Hotel here next Monday (Jan. 19) to consider a mounting resettlement emergency in Israel growing out of the sudden upsurge of immigration, particularly from Eastern Europe, it was announced this week by UJA General Chairman Morris W. Berinstein.

Outside of the Soviet Union, the largest Eastern European Jewish community is in Rumania, with more than 250,000 Jews. It is estimated that about 40,000 Jews still remain in Poland.

Mr. Berinstein termed the enlarged emergency session of the Appeal's top planning body "one of the most important UJA meetings since World War II." It was called after UJA officers convened here earlier this week and heard Levi Eshkol, Israel's Minister of Finance, present the full implications of the impact on Israel of this expanded immigration expected to reach 8,000 in January and a possible total of 100,000 during 1959.

Mr. Eshkol, who just arrived in the United States, told the UJA leaders that the migration of Jews permitted to leave for Israel has now reached such proportions that it will threaten Israel's entire immigrant absorption program unless large new resources are immediately forthcoming.

Mr. Eshkol declared that the new immigration represented a historic economic and national opportunity for Israel if the necessary facilities for its absorption were made available.

"Israel's people are steadfast in keeping their doors open to all Jews who can reach their soil," Mr. Berinstein emphasized, "but the vast task of providing shelter and a start toward a new life for these new multitudes is far beyond their own capacities. They must turn to the American Jewish community for financial help in the fullest possible measure to meet this new challenge of history."

In the light of the new immigration developments, Mr. Berinstein said "it is obvious that the forthcoming special UJA meeting on January 19 will be one of the most important gatherings of American Jewish leadership since World War II."

The UJA head declared "a great new turn in American Jewish humanitarian thinking and objectives must result from the emergency meeting." Mr. Berinstein envisioned that "the key American Jewish leadership will come together with representatives of Israel's people to reorient both Jewish communities to a completely new concept for the 1959 campaign year, a campaign that must swiftly enlarge its scope and its intensity."

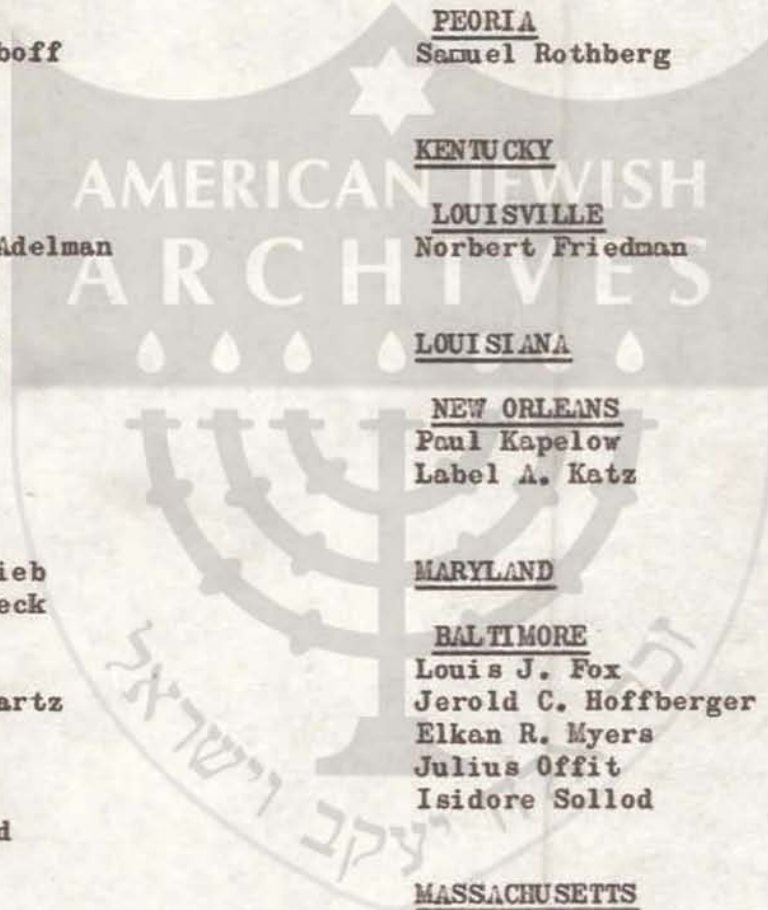

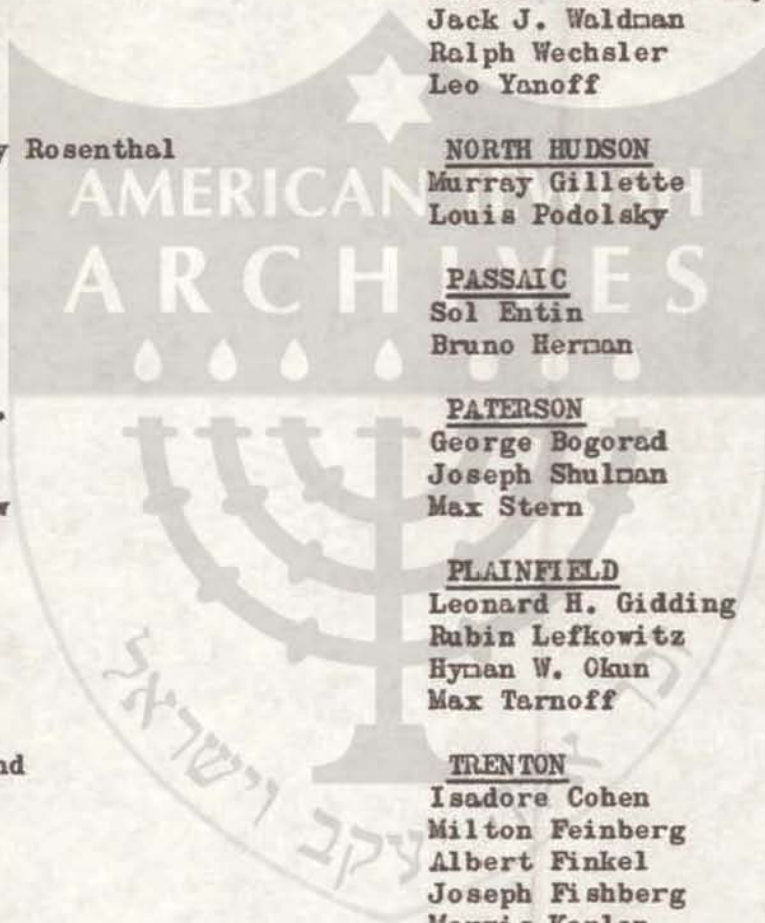

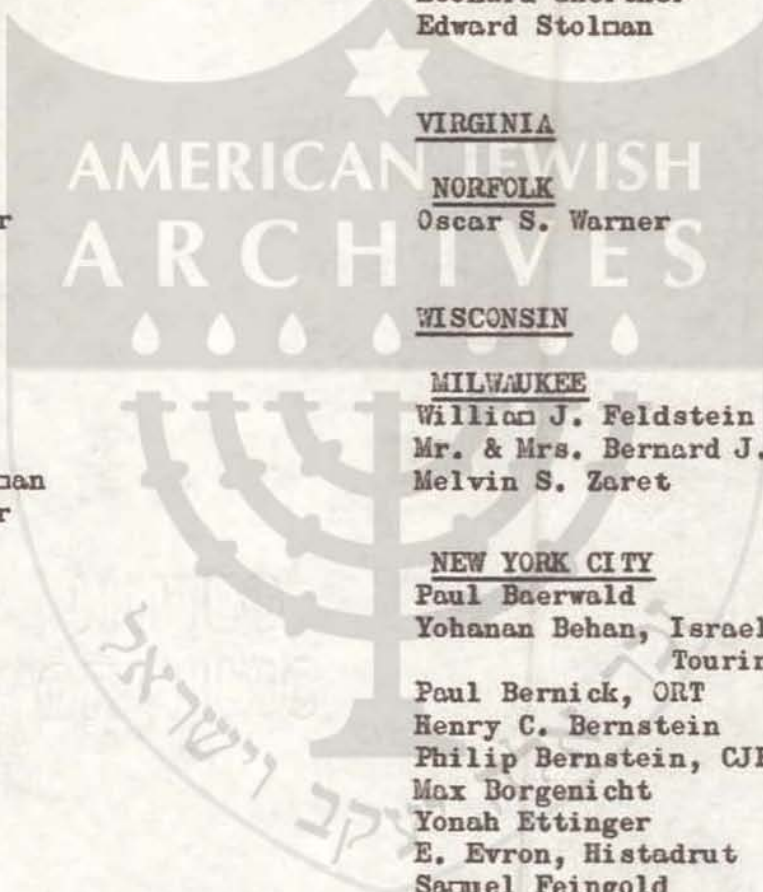

January 23, 1959

SENT TO CABINET MEMBERS

The meeting on January 19th -- which was remarkably well attended on short notice -- certainly was one of the most important meetings ever called by the UJA. It was attended by more than 200 leaders.

Morris Berinstein opened the meeting by pointing out that only a few weeks ago at the UJA Annual National Conference it was happily believed a solid program had been mapped out that could well meet the needs in 1959. Then, due to the sudden breaking of critical new developments in Romanian emigration, it was found only a few weeks later that the needs had been grossly under-estimated and that the kind of performance which had seemed adequate at the time of the Conference would now be dangerously insufficient.

Charles Jordan, Director-General of the Joint Distribution Committee, who came to the meeting almost directly from Europe, called the present exodus of Jews from Romania the greatest challenge that has arisen in Jewish life in the last ten years. The entire Romanian Jewish population of 250,000 faces the prospect of being uprooted, in a manner which Mr. Jordan confidentially called "brutal." Truly tens of thousands of Jews in the period from 1951 through 1958 indicated their desire to leave Romania by applying for exit visas, and their fellow-Jews everywhere truly should welcome the fact that they are now being permitted to leave after eight long years and that there is a country like Israel to take them in. But, Mr. Jordan said, it is sadly true as well that they are being put thoroughly through a wringer before they do get out.

The Romanian Government has built up a seemingly endless assembly line of costly documents which appears intended to wrest the last penny they have or can raise from the Jews who are leaving. Although it is obvious they will never be able to come back, they must even pay for the right to waive their Romanian citizenship. They must obtain a statement from their places of employment asserting they can be released from their jobs -- after which all gainful employment is closed to them, even though they may still have to wait in Romania for quite a while before a final exit permit is issued. There are families in this situation with no income and no savings left who face starvation. When they finally do get out, they arrive in Vienna and Athens in a state of shock, stripped of their belongings and temporarily at least hardly able to do anything for themselves.

With so many thousands of Romanian Jews involved in all this, one of the problems facing UJA-maintained agencies is to be able to count on having sufficient funds to continue to help them get out. Mr. Jordan said he was terribly fearful for Jews who might be compelled to remain in Romania due to insufficient funds, because all the present circumstances added to the long history of anti-semitism in that country will create a climate most hostile to them.

Mr. Levi Eshkol, the Finance Minister of Israel, expressed grave concern about raising sufficient means to absorb even in a most makeshift fashion the many thousands coming to Israel from Romania. He pointed out that 120,000 Jews had registered in Romania for permission to leave in the period 1951 to 1958. Then, in August of 1958, 304 Jews left Romania for Israel; 1,480 left in September; 1,143 in October; 1,233 in November; and, overwhelmingly in December, 5,349. At the same time, it is known that about 7,000 exit permits were issued to Jews in Romania during December, and the Romanian Government has enlarged its staff which issues exit permits. The exit permits are currently being issued at an even higher rate than last month. Mr. Eshkol reported that a cable he had just received from Israel advised that 3,700 Romanian Jews arrived in Israel just during the first two-and-a-half weeks in January. All of this gives every evidence that there will be some 80,000 to 100,000 Jews entering Israel during the coming year, mostly from Romania -- while all of Israel's plans, based on the fullest mobilization of the resources at its command, had been drawn up with the expectation of no more than 40,000 new immigrants.

In view of the fact that he was addressing a closed meeting, Mr. Eshkol said he would explain some of the reasons for the present Romanian emigration which had come to his attention. It was learned that a high-placed Romanian leader at a recent meeting of the Central Committee of the Romanian Communist Party had asserted that the Jews, with their resistance to Communist concepts, were disturbing the Communist revolution. Anti-semitism continued among the people under Communism, and it was in some ways sharpened by the fact that a new class of people had emerged in the country who desired the jobs held by many of the Jews. In addition, there was the apparent fact that 98% of the Jews wanted to leave Romania. It was consequently decided to let them go.

The reasons why the Jews want to leave Romania, according to Mr. Eshkol, are that they are thoroughly fed-up with the unchanged and age-old animosity against them -- and that they know there is now an Israel where they can have a better life than they or their families in previous generations ever had experienced. But there is a limit even to the wonders that Israel can perform by itself. At the moment Israel cannot contemplate being able to provide anything more than ma'abarot sheds as homes, and it is even a question whether such as these can be made available to all who come. It costs at least \$1,000 merely to provide a roof for each immigrant -- and not only roofs are needed, but transportation, health arrangements and an opportunity for employment as well. All in all, the Romanians are fine Jewish people, ready to go wherever they are needed in Israel, but they require substantial initial aid before they can help themselves.

Mr. Eshkol stated that an important debate in the Knesset on how and with what to cope with this immigration problem was being held in abeyance for the period of his visit to the United States, so that he might present some idea of the extent to which American Jews can be expected to help upon his return to Israel. Mr. Eshkol concluded that if American Jews respond adequately, and this will mean among other things that all who can will give twice as much as they did last year -- then they will help to create in Israel new hope and new lives for tens of thousands presently caught in a tragic predicament.

The serious concern of all present at the meeting was evident from the eager questioning from the floor which next ensued. Some of the responses made by Abe Harman, member of the Jewish Agency Executive, follow.

1. It is encouraging to note that about two-thirds of the Romanian emigrants are in the potentially very productive category of under age 45, and examinations so far indicate a generally good condition of physical health.
2. The emigration might be called a "voluntary one springing from a compelling set of conditions." The fact that when the gates were opened between 1948 and 1951, 160,000 Jews left Romania indicates that it is not a new thing for Jews to want to leave. But behind the present movement there is high level decision to "give them a 'helping hand' to 'want' to leave." Many are applying for exit permits despite the serious economic impediment of being immediately put out of jobs. Others who never applied are being told their "applications" have been approved, and are taking the hint to get out.
3. The problems created for the Jewish Agency by the unmet UJA campaign goals of 1956, 1957 and 1958 have been "solved" through "speculation in human suffering" -- with results that include 20,000 families still housed in ma'abarot, where children are being born and brought up amidst squalor, and a condition of "insufficient" employment for numerous earlier immigrants. It is feared for the incoming Romanians that they, too, will be "under-housed, under-employed, insufficiently absorbed." The irony of this is that they are a particularly vigorous group who, if given the chance, could render great service toward the further development of Israel.
4. Another possible irony in the situation is that it is of a kind which would have been hailed in the not-so-distant past, for it is the first time that virtually a whole Jewish population may be able to depart a country it wants to leave -- and have another country, Israel, ready to welcome them. The question is whether more fortunate Jews will hail the situation now with a sufficiently concrete response.
5. At the same time the situation permits no delay, for a totally unpredictable government is involved which at any time may be swayed by some consideration to turn down the tap or turn off emigration altogether.


6. There is a ticklish problem involved in giving proper publicity to the situation, which nevertheless must be thoroughly conveyed to American Jewry for a proper response. Jews must tell other Jews about it in every responsible gathering -- but revealing the situation in all its starkness any more widely than that might irritate the Romanian Government into impeding emigration.

Herbert Friedman related plans already formulated in necessarily rapid fashion by the UJA officers to mobilize increased support in this emergency. In carrying them out and getting the story across, he indicated, it will be vital to maintain the delicate distinction between internal publicity within our own groups and the external publicity given to the situation. The latter must stress the welcomeness of the opportunity to rescue Romanian Jews, while through the former all of us acquainted with the facts must convey them to the right people in all their harsh detail.

Present plans call for taking up Mr. Eshkol's offer to have leading Israeli officials, including possibly every Cabinet member who speaks English, come to the United States and spend considerable time in communities throughout the country where they would actually work at "digging" for gifts along with American lay leaders. In addition, quickly following up the UJA National Inaugural Conference in Miami on February 7th, it also is planned in association with other large national Jewish organizations to hold a meeting in New York on February 15th through which every American Jew of whatever affiliation would be called upon to support the UJA campaign through local federations and welfare funds. Special emphasis will be given to rallying support of the Special Fund which, internally at least, might now be regarded as the "Romanian Rescue Fund."

Morris Berinstein observed that every consideration would have to be given to all means that are proposed if the money that is needed is to be raised. He pointed to the fact that the total number of Romanian Jews now is about equal to the number of Jews in the D.P. camps in 1946. American Jews responded magnificently then to the challenge of rescuing the displaced Jews. The 5,000,000 Jews of America today surely have even more money now than they did in the mid-forties, and they face the test of whether they still have the humanity and the sense of honor required to rescue the Romanian Jews behind the Iron Curtain. The present challenge requires every American Jew's fullest understanding and cooperation, and the most generous giving by everyone as well as the willingness to persuade others to give.

While we were meeting last Monday, discussing the emigration of Jews from Rumania, the rate at which visas were being issued in Bucharest increased considerably.

In the single week beginning January 15th and ending January 21st, Israel visas were issued to 3,108 Jews in Rumania. There is every indication that the Rumanians are speeding up even further the issuance of permits to Jews to leave the country.

During the first twenty days of January, 4,200 immigrants arrived in Israel.

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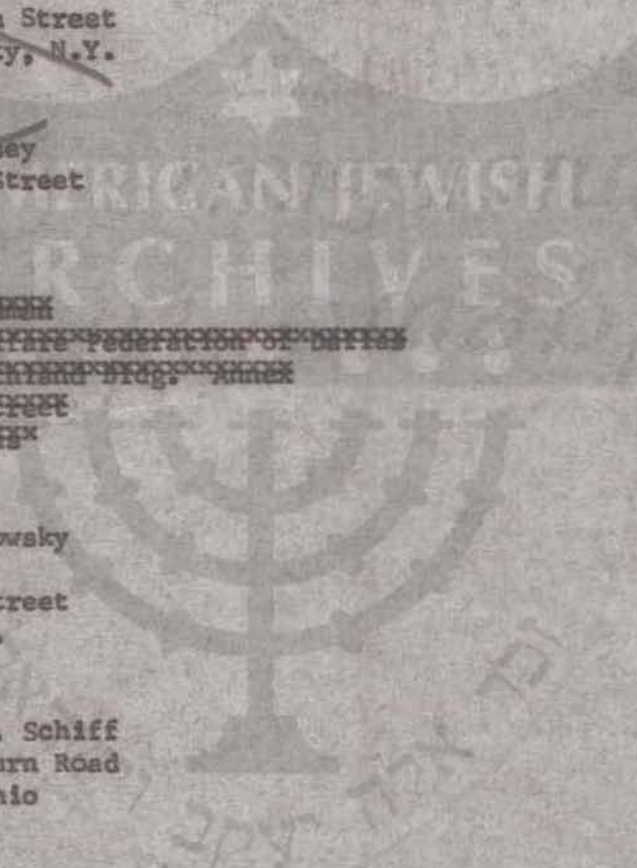
