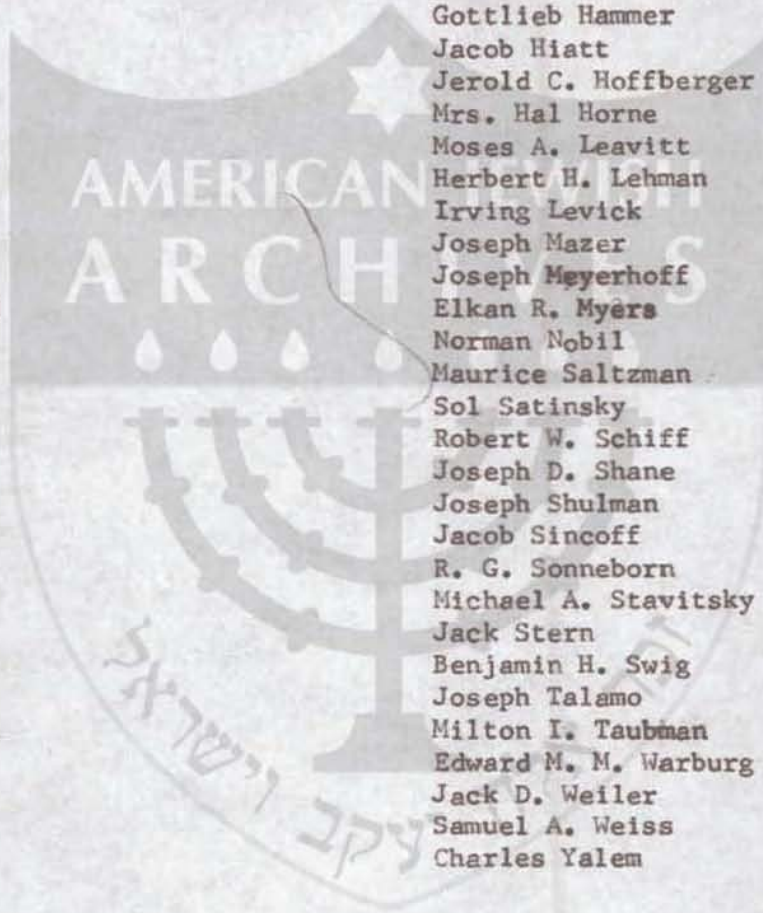

There will be an important meeting of the National Campaign Cabinet of the United Jewish Appeal on Monday, January 19th, at 6:30 p.m. in the Carpenter Suite of the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel in New York City. This will be a dinner meeting and I should like to urge you to attend.





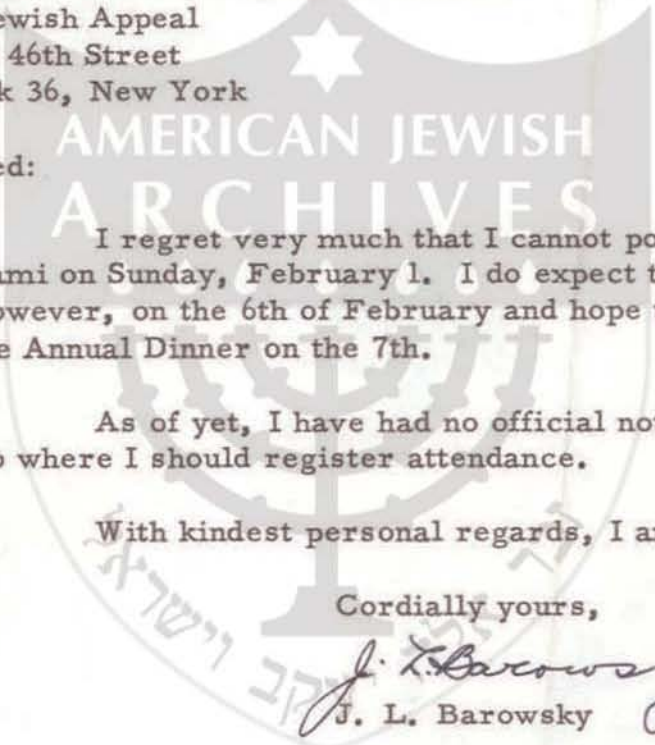

It will, therefore, be impossible for him to attend the meeting of the National Campaign Cabinet, to be held February 1, in Miami Beach, Florida.

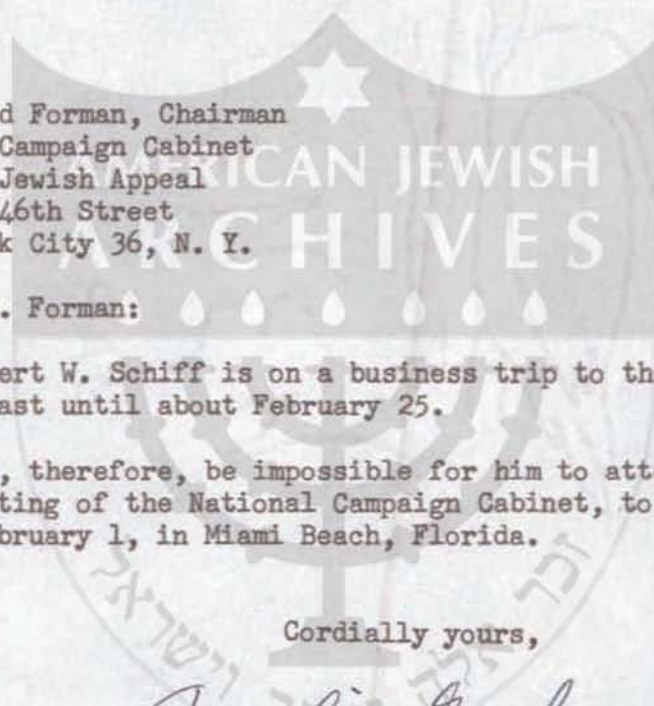

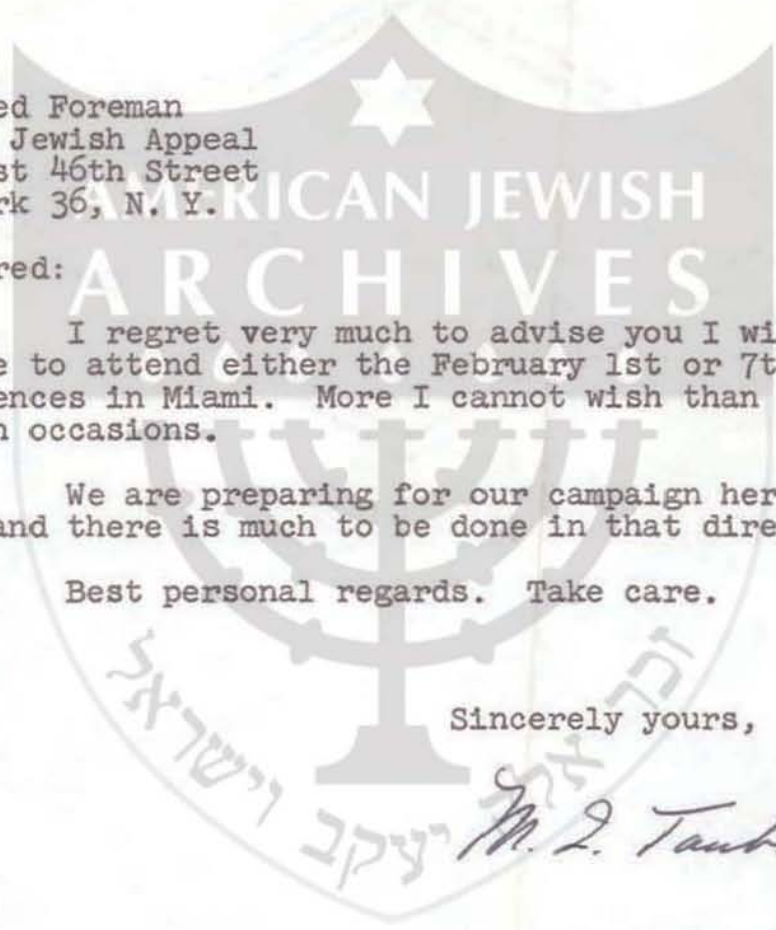
