

For the sake of order, I wish to report to you on the results of my trip to Los Angeles and Phoenix:

- 1. ABE KOOLISH that Mr. Joe Shane arranged for a meeting with Mr. Koolish. Some misunderstanding occurred and I could only speak on the phone with him. He told me that he is interested in the Fund and will try to get together with him as soon as he comes back from Mexico.
- 2. ARE SPIECEL Following your recommendation, I contacted Mr. Spiegel, and after a good Yiddish exchange of views, we decided to meet. To my great sorrow, Mr. Spiegel's brother fell sick and we had to cancel our meeting. Before my departure, Mr. Spiegel called me and insisted that we meet in New York as soon as he visits here. We shall follow him up.
- 3. MAX ZITMER Upon the recommendation of Rabbi Max Nussbaum, I had a lengthy conversation with Mr. Zimmer and the following tentative proposal developed:

Mr. Zimmer would be interested to pledge up to \$260,000 for the vocational school in Jeruselem and the Israel Goldstein Youth Aliyah Village. His conditions are as follows:

Every year the school will have to scept a certain number of American students. Therefore, he insists on building a special dormitory in conjuction with this school. If this can be done, he considers himself committed. We have undertaken the necessary steps to get an okay from Israel.

- 4. ANATCLE JOSEFHO Upon the recommendation of Mr. Ted Recoosin, I had lunch with Mr. Josepho. He gave me the impression of a very honest and generous person, but since he has just committed himself for \$500,000 for the Technion,, he felt he could not commit himself to the I.E.F. right now. Should be followed up not later than January 1971.
- 5. WOMEN'S DIVISION LEADERSHIP Had a meeting with Mrs. Fay Bay and Mrs. Myrtle Karp who promised to promote the kindergarten project among their friends.
- 6. AL BRONSTEIN Had a long session with Mr. Bronstein and Mr. Al Gilens and for the first time encountered resistance from a Federation Director to assist in the promotion of the I.E.F. This matter is very serious since I.E.F. did not function till now in Los Angeles, and it is my opinion that the Federation Director does not play a positive role in its promotion. I shall discuss matters orally with you.

- 7. ZIGMUND DIAMOND Had a long session with Mr. Diamond who committed himself to a bequest of \$200,000 on the condition that some educational building gets his name in his lifetime.
- 8. BERNARD M. SILBERT I met with Mr. Bernerd Silbert who is a tex lawyer serving as counsel to the Halpern Foundation in Los Angeles. We developed a proposal for the erection of three (3) pre-kindergertens in Israel in Safad, Rishon-Le-Zion, and Yahud. Mr. Silbert thinks there are good prospects of getting these kindergertens. Later in the day I was called again by Mr. Silbert who said that he himself is interested in building a kindergerten in the name of his mother who will be eighty years of age next month. He will let me know in the very near future.
- 9. GARY AMINORY Is one of the young leaders. Organized a meeting in his home with the participation of nine other young leaders. I tadusessed them on U.J.A. problems in general and I.E.F. in pentral Since a few of the participants were tax lawyers and accountants, they decided to form a group that will get other lawyers and accountants to advise their clients on I.E.F. projects.
- 10. MRS. ROSE LEVENTINE I met with Mrs. Rose Leventine who is the daughter of Mr. Arthur Zimtbaum, a donor of the Arad School. She arranged a meeting for me with several Beverly Hills film people and we may have the beginning of prospects in the film world. They will try to arrange a meeting for us in one of the homes of a Jewish artist to try and promote I.E.F. (I also had a meeting with Theodore Mikel in New York who promised to assist us with the promotion in Hollywood).

It is now selling at 70-3/4. Our 1,500 shares would net about \$106,000. When the Florida Power & Light stock was received in September 1969, it was worth \$98,000. Mr. Gantshar gives the following reasons for immediate sale of Florida Power & Light:

- 1. Two months strike has hurt earnings.
- 2. Litigation in progress.
- 3. Slowdown in economic growth rate of Southern Florida.
- 4. Problems with conservation groups on use of nuclear energy.

I would go along with Mr. Gantshar and sell the shares of Florida Power & Light.

When Gottlieb Hammer was apprised of our last Furst Estate stock liquidation, he was a little perturbed that he was not consulted before I went ahead and sold the various securities. As it turned out, the timing was good because the market went down subsequent to these sales.

Shall I consult Gottlieb Hammer in connection with this latest recommendation?

MEETING OF THE AD HOC EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF THE ISRAEL EDUCATION FUND HELD AT THE LOTOS CLUB, THURSDAY, APRIL 30, 1970, 1:00 P.M.

PRESENT:

Mel Alperin Charles J. Bensley Henry C. Bernstein Aaron Chilewich Dr. Sidney Edelstein David Hersch Arych Nesher Morris Rodman Elaine Siris Nettie Stein Claire Vogelman

- A. Mr. Bensley opened the meeting by presenting a financial report of the pledges received during the last four months. He also informed members present that Dr. Nesher will be leaving for Israel on May 4 and will bring back more detailed information concerning the next five-year plan for educational facilities which will include a number of community colleges.
- B. The forthcoming Education Mission, which will take place between June 20 and July 1, was discussed and the tentative itinerary, which had been distributed, was reviewed; except for some minor suggestions, it was agreed that the itinerary was a very good program which adequately covered the special areas intended by this Mission. In line with this, it was recommended that each member of the Executive Committee receive, with a copy of these Minutes, the names of all donors and prospects to whom invitations were sent so that known names could be followed up, regardless of the geographical location; there would also be added to these lists names which do not appear but are known to the respective members. Mr. Chilewich suggested the possibility of approaching the Crown family, and the office will follow this up with him.

C. The following recommendations were made regarding donor relations:

1) A full-sized, framed picture of the educational facility, dedicated and signed by the Minister of Education, be presented to each donor; 2) An album showing different areas of the school, as well as the children in their work and play, be prepared for presentation to each donor; 3) Samples of the arts and crafts created by the children be sent to donors for their use and/or display.

All these suggestions will be discussed by Dr. Nesher when he is in Israel for future implementation.

Dr. Edelstein reported on his experiment of linking the Englewood community to the Community Center built by him in Kiryat Shemona. This created a living bridge between young people in Englewood and their counterparts in Israel. It was recommended that this experiment be implemented, if possible, in other donor communities. It was further suggested that exhibits of pictures, artifacts, etc., be arranged in the various donor communities. Mr. David Hersch to follow up.

- D. The Ambassadorial parties were then discussed and the following recommendations were made:
 - 1) Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, June 2, 1970, at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Saul Friedman, to be addressed by Ambassador Barmore, Mr. David Hersch will visit Philadelphia on May 1 and make the necessary arrangements for personal follow-up with all invitees.

Mr. Jac Lehrman of Washington, D.C. is keenly interested in the Leo Baeck Comprehensive High School in Haifa, of which the Community Center is to be named for him, and has made a pledge of \$200,000 towards the construction of this complex.

Due to the pressures of war, almost the entire construction industry has been mobilized to provide shelters along the exposed borders of Israel. It is extremely urgent that all civilian projects which are under way, and close to completion, should be completed as quickly as possible, so that contractors can be released for the pressing defense needs. The Leo Baeck School and Lehrman Community Center are rapidly approaching completion and it is entirely possible to have them finished in time for operation this coming school year in October. In order to achieve this, it is necessary to maintain a constant flow of cash so the workers can be kept on the job and no delays occur.

Mr. Lehrman understands this quite clearly and is eager to help achieve this purpose. We are aware that there may be some problems connected with deductibility of contributions in any one given year. From our point of view, it would be entirely possible for him to make a loan of the \$200,000 to the Israel Education Fund, which could then be converted into payment of his pledge during the first available year which would permit that. Other donors have done this, and there has been no problem whatsoever.

I am writing this letter to you, seeking your help and cooperation, to assist Mr. Lehrman in achieving this objective, which he really would like to do.

RECITALS:

- A. The Donor resides at 2931 Albemarle Street, N.W. Washington, D.C.
- B. The Donor has come to recognize the importance of secondary education in Israel and now desires to aid in the advancement of such education by contributing to the construction of a nautical high school located in Haifa, Israel.
- C. 1) UJA is a New York membership corporation, organized and operated exclusively for charitable purposes and engaged, among other things, in the conduct of a project known as the Israel Education Fund, having as its primary goals the raising of funds for secondary school facilities in Israel and secondary school scholarships and teachers' scholarships in Israel.
 - 2) UJA has been accorded tax exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended, and contributions to it, including contributions to it for its Israel Education Fund, are deductible under Section 170 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended.
- D. 1) UJA and the United Israel Appeal, Inc. (formerly The Jewish Agency for Israel, Inc. and hereafter referred to as "UIA") have made a study of the problem of secondary school facilities in Israel and have determined that there

is a need to provide facilities for students in Israel interested in and desirous of obtaining the specialized education to be furnished in a nautical high school.

- 2) Accordingly UJA and UIA have decided that such a school (hereafter referred to as the "School") should be constructed at Haifa, Israel and that the School should be built in two stages, for convenience hereafter called the "Shlav Alef" and the "Shlav Bet".
- 3) The School in its entirety is to be constructed on land located in the immediate vicinity of the Kishon River outlet to the Mediterranean Sea on a site totalling 36,346 square meters further identified as follows on the land map of the City of Haifa:

- 4) Annexed hereto as Exhibit "A" is a description of the Shlav Alef of the School contained in a brochure dated April, 1970, prepared by the architectural firm of Ziona Leshena, Georg Perel and Emmanuel Kanner. The School's Shlav Alef is to be constructed in accordance with such description, subject to such changes in lay-out, appearance, number, nature and extent of facilities as UJA and UIA shall finally determine; provided, however, that the certified cost of construction of Shlav Alef, exclusive of land acquisition costs, is not in any event to be less than the sum of \$600,000.000.
- 5) The construction of the Shlav Bet of the School is to be undertaken by UJA and UIA at such future time as they determine that the additions to the School are necessary and desirable.

PROVISIONS:

- The Donor hereby pledges a gift of \$450,000.00 to the Israel Education project of UJA. UJA and UIA agree to apply this fund toward the cost of construction of the Shlav Alef of the School as hereinabove and hereafter provided.
- 2. The Donor hereby agrees that his said pledge of \$450,000.00 shall be paid to UJA as follows:
 - a) The sum of \$45,000.00 upon receipt of notice from UJA that a contract for the construction of the Shlav Alef has been entered into:
 - b) The sum of \$45,000.00 upon completion of the foundation for the Shlav Alef;
 - c) The sum of \$90,000.00 upon completion of rough enclosure (roof on) thereof;
 - d) The sum of \$90,000.00 upon completion of rough plumbing and electrical work thereof;
 - e) The sum of \$90,000.00 upon completion of rough interior walls thereof;
 - f) The sum of \$90,000.00 upon completion of all Shlav Alef construction, including cleaning up of the premises, paving, shrubbery and finishing of landscaping and lawn.
- 3. Notification that the construction has reached each of the stages indicated above shall be given by furnishing to the Donor architect's certification thereof by registered mail addressed to the Donor at the address noted above and each of the installments aforesaid shall be paid within thirty days after the date of mailing of each such notice.
- 4. In accordance with existing procedures, summarized in the enclosed Treasury Department ruling addressed to Adrian W. DeWind and dated September 24, 1964 (copy of identical ruling having also been directed to Maurice M. Boukstein

on behalf of UIA), the funds collected by UJA pursuant to this agreement will be transmitted by UJA to UIA, together with a copy of this letter and UIA will apply the funds so received as hereinafter provided and, in connection therewith will exercise exclusive supervision and control over the expenditure of such funds through its agent in Israel (The Jewish Agency for Israel in Jerusalem) including supervision of the construction of the School and related facilities as herein provided.

- 5. a) The plans and specifications for the school have been prepared by architects selected by the UIA who are licensed and engaged in practice in Israel.
 - b) Construction of the School by UIA will commence no later than the spring of 1971. In reliance upon the pledge of the Donor construction will be diligently prosecuted thereafter by UIA.
- 6. It is expressly agreed and understood that the cost of construction of the Shlav Alef in excess of the Donor's \$450,000.00 contribution (estimated to amount to a minimum of \$150,000.00) shall not be an obligation of Donor; that the Donor shall not under any circumstances be obligated to contribute more than the sum of \$450,000.00.
- The legal title to and ownership of the School will be vested in UIA.
- 8. a) It is agreed that the School in its entirety will be known as the "Nehemiah and Nechame Cohen Nautical School" and that such name will be permanently placed on the structure at the main entrance of the School. No additional names shall be assigned to the Shlav Bet.
 - b) An appropriate plaque shall be affixed in a prominent place in the interior of the School and shall bear the legend that the School was constructed with the proceeds of a gift contributed to the Israel Education Fund of UJA by the Donor and Nechame Cohen.

- c) All brochures, catelogs, letterheads, documents, forms, publicity releases and announcements shall identify the School as the "Nehemiah and Nechame Cohen Nautical School."
- 9. a) UJA represents that the Government of Israel has represented and undertaken that if funds made available from other sources shall be insufficient said Government will aid the School by providing, or causing to be provided by way of subsidy or other form of aid, funds required for the maintenance budget of the School for so long as the School shall exist, which maintenance budget embraces, among other things, salaries and social security payments for teachers and other personnel, the cost of maintenance of the School in good repair and the cost of replacement of equipment in the School.
 - b) UJA further represents that the Government of Israel has represented and undertaken that the School shall be exempt from payment of any governmental levy or tax of whatever description with respect to the lands and structure thereon.
- 10. The curriculum of the School shall be such as shall meet the prescribed requirements of the Government of Israel for accredited post-elementary schools.
- 11. UJA is satisfied that the Government of Israel will not appropriate the School, land or building in the forseeable future. However, in the event of such land or building appropriation, Israel law would require the payment of fair compensation of the appropriated property. If at any time the School, land and/or building is appropriated, the compensation received for such property shall be used by the agency for the purpose of advancing education in Israel in such manner as will bear the Nehemiah and Nechame Cohen name and will be as similar as possible to the proposed School discussed in this agreement.

Regional colleges in the north

I was intrigued to read the article in The Jerusalem Post of Feb. 20, on the start of a Junior College by Hadassah. You may be interested to know that six years ago, a Junior College type structure was set up at Tel Hai in Upper Galilee, and five years ago a similar framework began to function in the Jordan Valley. The aim of these embryonic colleges was, and is, to provide "technicians" of all kinds to serve the region, and also to provide an opportunity for people to study without leaving their settlements or towns, increasing university recognition of these courses, enables some of these students to continue at one of the regular universities.

At Tel Hai there are about 80 students engaged in full-time courses (five days a week), and several hundred part-time students taking afternoon courses. At the Jordan Valley school,

courses are only given in the afternoon-and evenings, and are attended by seve-ral hundred students.

ral hundred students.

While in no manner detracting from the importance of setting up the type of Junior College described in The Jerusalem Post article, I must stress the importance of our enterprise in improving economic and cultural standards in an area which is distant from the academic centres, and yet is none the less vital for the prosperity and security of Israel.

I am sure that we have much to learn from your experience in college administration and will be happy to meet with you to discuss matters of mutual interest if you should so desire.

Community colleges exciting trend in higher education

THE community college, according to Mrs. Esther Gottesman, Chairman of the Hadassah Educational Services, of the Hadassah Educational Services, is the most exciting concept of the day in American education. Over 500 new colleges are to be opened in the coming five years. That is why Hadassah was convinced that Dr. Helen Kittner, the Head of Hadassah's Educational Services in Israel, was on the right track when she proposed that Hadassah should introduce such a college into Israel iffe. The Hadassah Community College will open in September in the Seligsberg School compound.

Mrs. Gottesman explains: "There are

Mrs. Gottesman explains: 'There are thousands of youngsters who want to get education beyond matriculation level, but who, for various reasons, do not want to go through a full University course, or are perhaps unable to do so. They may not have the money, the time or the ability to make good in a University. But this does not mean that they should be barred completely from further education after leaving school or the Army,

school or the Army.

"In a way the community college is a development of the land grant system that transformed American Agriculture into scientific farming. Back in the early nineteenth century, the land grant colleges were introduced to supply technical help to agriculture. As America developed, many of these colleges became state universities. When thousands of war veterans were able to go to universities under the when thousands of war veterans were able to go to universities under the G.I. Bill, the standards at the state universities soared. Many of them, like Fenn State or Michigan or New York, today have standards as high as those of Yale and Harvard."

While this rise in academic standards in more and more universities was obviously desirable, Mrs. Gottesman points out, the result was to deny ad-

vanced education to large sections of the population who could not make the grade.

"The same thing seems to be hap-pening in Israel," she says. "Last sum-mer I spoke to young post-Army stu-dents at the Seligsberg School night mer I spoke to young post-Army students at the Seilgsberg School night
classes, the kind of students who will
go to the new community college.
"They explained to me that they simply
could not manage to go to university
for four years or more to get a degree, especially as they could not be
sure of getting jobs afterwards when
they graduated. They wanted something specific, lasting only two years,
which would give them a certain career
when they finished. But they were disappointed that they could only go to
night school. So when Dr. Kiltner came
up with her proposal of a daytime
community college, giving two-year
career training, Hadassah jumped at
it as a way to help Israeli youngsters
get a further alternative type of education."

HIGHER STATUS

She believes that the community college will give the student knowledge, a career, and higher status in the economy. He will be second in command to the feel University graduate, but he

will have responsibility and skill, and his earnings will rise accordingly. On the other side, Israel's economy is suffering from an acute bottleneck — the shortage of technicians."

To provide the college with premises, a new building has been erected in the compound of the Seligsberg School. The Seligsberg School, which formerly catered largely for girls, is being amalgamated with a vocational high school for boys, the Brandeis Centre, run by Hadassah. This amalgamation is considered a natural development of Hadassah's education services. dassah's education services.

"The community colleges is the logical continuation of the comprehensive school," says Mrs. Gottesman. "Most colleges in the U.S.A. have this kind of continuous flow, instead of sharp breaks in education. But the college will be open, of course, to graduates of other schools, apart from Seligsberg and Brandeis."

"I really think the Hadassah Community College will add something valuable to Israeli education," Mrs. Gottesman concludes. "We see it as a pilot plunt. If it succeeds, the idea will no doubt be extended. We hope that we will help young Israelis to reach new goals by giving them the tools of

Education Ministry to control university development

The growth of universities in Israel will henceforth be guided by national needs, rather than local prestige or academic rivalry, Education Minister Yigal Allon said yesterday.

Addressing the Hebrew University Board of Governors on Mount Scopus, Mr. Allon said that he is writing to the heads of all insti-tutions of higher learning requesting them to notify his Ministry of any planned new development sche-The expansion or foundation of institutions of higher education could no longer be left to the initiative of mayors motivated by considerations of prestige, Mr. Allon said, or even to the universities themselves, who have been known to establish new faculties because of "jealousy" over a similar faculty elsewhere. The Minister indicated that centres for higher education would be created in development areas as a stabilizing influence. "They will attract intellectuals, improve the quality of the population and give a sense of pride to the rest of the population in the area." Hebrew University President Av-raham Harman expressed total sup-

port for Mr. Allon's move. "It is long overdue," he said. "This is a small country with limited resources! duplication should be avoided."

There was less agreement be-tween the Minister and University officials over the Government's share of the University's budget for the coming year. Mr. Harman said lack of funds was preventing the University from making full use of its rich potential. The Board Chairman, Mr. Samuel Rothberg, pointed out that more than half the research in the countries. search in the country was being carried out at the Hebrew University and more than half the doctoral candidates were studying there. "We have a strong case for greater support."

Mr. Rothberg also indicated that the Jerusalem Municipality could

do more to assist the University.

Mayor Teddy Kollek acknowledged that Tel Aviv and Haifa contributed to their institutions of higher learning while Jerusalem had made little more than a token donation. "This is the poorest city anyone can imagine," he pleaded. The Rector, Prof. Jacob Katz, ing pressure from both students which students would apply only coming from the West and the once, listing universities in additional community. Oriental community. The former pressure was being met by the creation of a special centre for overseas students designed to integrate them into the University's regular programme after two years of study in their native language. As for the gap between the Ash-kenazi and Oriental communities, Prof. Katz said, the only solution was education. "It takes time. Not years, but generations."

Mr. Allon reported that 25 per cent of those admitted to Israel universities last year failed to ap-pear when classes started. At the same time, 27 per cent of the applicants for admission were turn-

ed down for lack of room.

The reason for the non-appearances, he said, was apparently the practice of many persons to fill out applications for more than one institution in the hope of getting into one if turned down by another. Mr. Allon called for a cen-

preference.

The Board approved an ordinary budget of IL139.8m. for 1971/2 and a development budget of IL75.7m. The contribution from public funds to the former budget is IL83.5m., or about 60 per cent. In the past, this contribution has amounted to 70 per cent. The difference is to be met by the Friends of the Hebrew University abroad.
