

("UJA") for the erection of three pre-kindergartens in Israel. This letter summarizes our agreement as to your pledge and the purposes for which it is made:

- l. At our invitation you have pledged a contribution of \$100,000 to UJA for the Israel Education Fund Project. UJA and the United Israel Appeal, Inc. ("UIA"), which administers the Israel Education Fund Project, agree to apply such contribution toward the cost of construction of the three pre-kindergartens, as hereinafter provided.
- 2. You hereby confirm your agreement that your said pledge of \$100,000 will be paid by you to us in five equal annual installments at the rate of \$20,000 per year, commencing with an initial installment of \$20,000 to be paid on or before December 31, 1971. Subsequent installments of \$20,000 each shall be paid by you before the close of each of the succeeding four calendar years.

- 3. Each of the pre-kindergartens will be constructed generally in accordance with the sketch plan hereto annexed as Exhibit "1". The location of each such pre-kindergarten is to be decided exclusively by UIA on the basis of priority need.
- 4. Construction of the three pre-kindergartens by UIA will commence as soon as may be practicable and will be prosecuted to completion as promptly as can be accomplished.
- 5. Each such pre-kindergarten will be named the "Celia and Abraham Kamber Pre-Kindergarten". Said names will be placed at the main entrance to each pre-kindergarten and permanently maintained. Suitable dedicatory exercises will be arranged by UIA. A plaque will be affixed in a prominent place on each structure and will state that the pre-kindergarten was constructed with funds contributed to the Israel Education Fund by you and your wife.
- 6. Legal title to and the ownership of each of the pre-kindergartens will be handled in accordance with the provisions of the Internal Revenue Service letter dated September 24, 1964, dealing with the Israel Education Fund, copy of which is annexed hereto as Exhibit "2".

Dear Mr. DoWind:

This is in reply to your letter of May 4, 1964, in which you request a ruling that the activities to be undertaken by the United Jewish Appeal, Inc. and The Jewish Agency for Israel, Inc., in connection with the Israel Education Fund Project, will not adversely affect their status under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, and that the contributions made to each, including contributions to the U.J.A. Israel Education Fund Campaign, will be adductible under section 170 of the 1954 Code.

Our records discicly that the United Jewish Appeal, Inc. (U.J.A.) and The Jewish Agency for Israel, Inc. (Domestic Organization) were most recently held to be exempt from Federal income tax under section 501(c) (3) of the 1954 Code and contributions to them deductible under section 170 of the 1954 Code, in rulings dated, respectively, February 4, 1960 and December 21, 1960.

You state that the United Jewish Appeal is a fund-raising organization which distributes its receipts among a number of charitable organizations. The principal beneficiary of the U.J.A. is the United Israel Appeal, Inc. (U.I.A.) a New York membership corporation. The U.I.A. contributes to the Jewish Agency for Israel, Inc., which expends funds so received for charitable activities which it wishes to support in Israel, using as its agent in Israel The Jewish Agency for Israel in Jerusalem (the Agency).

The Jewish Agency for Israel, Inc. has traditionally supported immigration to Israel by needy Jewish emigrants, and has concerned itself with their settlement and rehabilitation in the new nation. Its activities include financial aid for agricultural settlement, housing, health, education and welfare services.

Due to a critical shortage of educational facilities above the elementary level which are available to the children of immigrants in Israel, the U.J.A. and the Domestic Organization established the Israel Education Fund Project (the Project) having as its goals the providing of secondary school facilities, secondary school scholarships and teachers' scholarships. In addition to these goals, it is also proposed that the Project provide certain other educational, recreational and scientific facilities in Israel.

To finance the Project, U.J.A. intends to conduct the Israel Education Fund Campaign (the Campaign) to solicit funds from United States donors. The Campaign will be apart from the regular U.J.A. fund-raising campaign, with its own shairman and staff. It is intended that major contributors to the Campaign, if they desire, will be informed as to how their gifts are to be used. For example, the donor may be shown the plans for a building and its location. He may, in some cases, have the building named in his honor or as he directs. A donor contributing to the endowment of a scholarship fund may be allowed to choose among several categories of scholarships. However, such contributors are to have no control over the actual expenditure of the funds. Donations might also be solicited for the purpose of endowing secondary schools or similar facilities, or providing maintenance funds for such facilities, but donors will not thereby be entitled to any control of the operation of a school or facility.

Funds collected through the Campaign will be transferred by the U.J.A. to the U.I.A. which will, in turn, donate the funds to the Domestic Organization. The Domestic Organization will exercise exclusive supervision and control over the expenditure of the funds through its agent in Israel, the Jewish Agency for Israel in Jerusalem. The Agency will act only as agent for the Domestic Organization and will be required to submit regular reports to it. In addition, the Domestic Organization will at all times maintain personnel in Israel to insure adequate supervision of the Agency.

Actual construction of buildings will be supervised by the Agency. The Domestic Organization is to obtain land for the various facilities from the Israeli authorities, either through contribution or long-term lease at a nominal rental. The land and buildings are to be exempt from Israeli governmental and local taxes. The Domestic Organization is to retain exclusive ownership of all buildings constructed under the Project, and is satisfied that the Israeli government will not take over any such properties in the foreseeable future. However, in the event of such an occurrence, Israeli law requires the payment of fair compensation for such properties as are appropriated. The Domestic Organization likewise is to retain title to all endowment funds until such funds are distributed.

The Domestic Organization intends to operate the various facilities in Israel through its agent, the Agency, deriving operating income from tuition and from subsidies and grants from public and private sources. However, the Israeli Government will prescribe the curriculum standards as required for all accredited secondary schools in Israel. The building and operation of the schools and administration of the scholarship programs by the Agency will also include responsibility, as an agent, for the hiring of necessary personnel to carry out the various programs. From time to time, where necessary for administrative convenience, one or more corporate entities may be formed in Israel as charitable trusts. Revenue Ruling 63-252, C.B. 1963-2, 101 provides generally that contributions by individuals to United States charities which transmit funds to foreign charitable organizations may be allowed as deductions if the domestic charity does not merely act as a conduit of funds to the foreign organization. Example (4) of such ruling describes a situation where the domestic charity may make grants out of its general funds to foreign charitable groups for purposes which it has reviewed and approved. It contemplates no special fund for this purpose. This method of operation is approved because the contributions are not earmarked in any manner, and their use is subject to control by the domestic charity. Example (5) describes a situation where the demestic charity, for administrative convenience, conducts its charitable operations abroad through a subsidiary formed in the foreign country. The domestic charity solicits funds for its foreign activities and may transmit the funds directly to the controlled foreign charity. The domestic charity is considered to be the real recipiont of contributions it receives for transmission to the foreign organization, since the foreign organization is merely an administrative arm of the demostic charitable organization.

Based strictly upon the facts submitted in your letter dated May 4, 1964,. the activities proposed to be undertaken by the United Jewish Appeal, Inc. and The Jewish Agency for Israel, Inc., and the method of operation described, appear to be contemplated by Revenue Ruling 63-252, and thus will not affect the exempt status of the United Jewish Appeal, Inc. to which it is otherwise entitled as an organization described in section 501(c)(3) of the 1954 Code, nor will such activities or method of operation affect the deductibility under section 170 of the 1954 Code of contributions made to the United Jewish Appeal, Inc., provided its activities continue to be limited to, and its funds distributed exclusively in furtherance of, its charitable purposes.

ORIGIN AND AIMS

The major aim of the Israel Education Fund is to meet a critical shortage of high schools in Israel, particularly in development towns and other areas of concentrated immigrant population.

The basic facilities to be created by IEF donors are comprehensive, vocational and specialized schools designed to provide immigrant youth, especially of North African and Asian family origin, with modern career skills and to put them on an equal footing with youngsters of western and Israeli origin. Bridging the opportunity gap between these two population elements in this way was declared Israel's primary national task, next to survival through defense, by all three of Israel's Prime Ministers to that date, and by every other leading government official.

Supplementing the high schools, such vital community facilities as pre-kindergartens, life centers and public libraries are to be offered for sponsorship by the American Jewish community.

Scholarships for needy high school students and for teachers in training also constitute a vital part of the program.

Because it is essential that maximum support of the UJA general campaign and Israel Emergency Fund be maintained, gifts to the Education Fund must not be made at the expense of support for the United Jewish Appeal's campaigns. Israel Education Fund gifts must be \$100,000 or more and may be paid over a period of five years.

2. Other Benefits

A. Increased Enrollment

In Israel's school-less development towns before the establishment of IEF in 1964, an average of less than 15 per cent of eligible primary school graduates went on to any high school at all. Today, in towns where IEF schools have been established, the average is over 90 per cent.

B. Skilled Manpower

Before the advent of IEF, there were a scattered few comprehensive high schools in Israel, only one in a development town. Four-year vocational schools were non-existent. Today, these two types of schools, crucial to equal opportunity and the creation of skilled, national manpower, are becoming the rule rather than the exception...and, especially in the development towns.

PROJECTION OF FUTURE EDUCATIONAL NEEDS IN ISRAEL

1. Comprehensive High Schools -- 25

Four or six-year secondary schools offering wide-ranging combinations of academic and vocational training suited to individual student needs, preparing students for skilled trade employment, as well as for matriculation into college. These schools are needed primarily in agricultural development areas such as Yifat, Gesher Haziv, Sde Eliyahu, etc., and in development towns such as Dimona, Kiryat Malachi, Acre, etc. Cost to donor is from \$200,000 to \$400,000. (See photo in attached High School booklet)

2. Community Colleges -- 10

These two-year colleges are needed mainly for the further training of youngsters as paraprofessionals, a vitally needed manpower group with skills beyond the vocational school level. They will be built in development areas such as Tel Hai in the Galilee, Bet Zera in the Jordan Valley, etc. Cost to donor is from \$500,000 to \$800,000. (See photo in attached High School booklet)

3. Field Schools -- 5

To provide a minimal agricultural education for children of high school age, the field schools are planned for various development areas. Students will spend 6 to 8 weeks working in the field and learning the realities of agriculture. These schools will include dormitories and will be used in the summer for American students as well. Cost to donor is from \$300,000 to \$600,000. (See photo in attached High School booklet)

4. Athletic Facilities for Comprehensive & Vocational High Schools -- 20

Because of the need to provide Israel's youth with an outlet for physical activities, these gymnasiums and sports fields, to be constructed next to existing schools, are of utmost importance. The cost of each unit is from \$50,000 to \$70,000. (See photo in attached High School booklet)

5. Merkazim (Life Centers) -- 20

New immigrant communities in Israel urgently need civic, recreational and

cultural centers to provide a core to communal life. Each IEF Merkaz will combine an adult center with a youth center, athletic facilities, and a library, to serve the total community. Cost to the donor is from \$150,000 to \$300,000. (See photo in attached High School booklet)

SECOND BREAKTHROUGH

IEF/1971: SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM
(Unsolicited Gifts)

In 1964, there was hardly a single four-year vocational or comprehensive high school in any of Israel's immigrant development towns. Tens of thousands of teenage boys and girls, most of them of North African and Asian family origin, were literally being denied their birthright of modern education and vocational training. Unable to pay the tuition or transportation costs involved in attending available out of town schools, completely unable to meet the cost of books, meals, uniforms, tools and equipment, they listlessly walked the streets of their struggling development towns with little hope of breaking through to the productive futures they longed for and so richly deserved.

But, the breakthrough came, created by the Jews of America through the UJA

Israel Education Fund. With gifts ranging from the \$100,000 IEF minimum for
solicited contributions to the multitude millions, they have established 85 high
schools in just over six years. When the next academic year begins this September,

41 IEF vecational and comprehensive high schools will be in operation, covering
almost all of Israel's most critical development towns and urban immigrant sectors.

The children who hold Israel's future in their hands will no longer be marking time
on the streets; close to 60,000 will be entering the ninth grades of IEF and other
high schools in September, and their tuition will be provided free by the government
of Israel.

Does this mean that, in the space of a few short years, the ideal has been achieved: a guaranteed high school education for all, equal opportunity for children of all backgrounds, all individual birthrights fulfilled and the future of Israel's people secured, based on fully trained and skilled manpower for all generations to come? Unfortunately,no.

Without outside help, more than 10,000 ninth-graders this September will be unable to meet the cost involved in attending a modern comprehensive or vocational high school.

Several thousand, still without completed IEF high schools in their towns, will still have to bear the cost of travel to out of town schools.

Other thousands will not be able to pay for their books, their uniforms, their hot meals, their tools and equipment.

None of the more than 10,000 will be able to meet all these extra costs.

Some will not be able to meet any.

Some, sadly, would simply not be able to go to the schools which are free and available to them, without help from outside their families.

Others might find some way of enrolling and struggling on, but an enormous emotional and economic cost which would almost surely result in their dropping out... if not this year, then surely before they have finished half of the four golden years of learning opened up to them by IEF's first breakthrough.

A second breakthrough is needed.

Again, it must be accomplished by the Jews of America, through the fulfillment of the IEF/1971 Scholarship Program to provide the vital grants listed on the next page for the 1971/2 school year. Number of students listed in each category are rounded advance estimates. Actual lists of candidates in all categories are being drawn up right now through an exhaustive national survey. An immediate outpouring of pledges and flow of cash are crucial, if the grants are to take effect by September 1.

THE IEF PRE-KINDERGARTEN PROGRAM

HEAD START - ISRAEL

When the Israel Education Fund was established in 1964, its main thrust was toward the construction of comprehensive and vocational high schools, mostly in development towns, in order to make vocational training available to the relatively disadvantaged children of new immigrants and thus prevent the creation of "two Israels". Great progress has been made in achieving these aims, with about 130 major donors of \$100,000 and more coming forward to establish 85 vital high schools.

Having the high schools, however, is not enough. We must make certain, now and in the years to come, that all youngsters of high school age in

Israel -- especially those with the enormous disadvantages of coming from large families living in crowded flats, supported meagerly by unskilled fathers and given minimal pre-school attention by harassed mothers -- are ready for their high school education.

That means their education must begin before the start of formal schooling at the age of 5 in kindergarten. They must, at the age of 3 and 4, be exposed to all the things children from more favored homes take for granted but which they do not get in their homes; books, toys, art materials, story-telling, group play, healthful physical activity, guided creative expression and encouragement in the use of language as a tool of living, learning and communication.

They need a <u>head start</u>, as underprivileged youngsters in this country do, in PRE-KINDERGARTEN SCHOOLS.

The Israel Ministry of Education and Culture has unequivocably made this its Number One Priority and has asked the IEF to find donors for about 250 pre-kindergartens this year.

Every one will contain two classrooms for 30 pupils each, adaptable to maximum group and indivdual instruction; adequate playground space, and a deep, reinforced bomb shelter. Using pre-fabricated poured concrete sections, each will cost \$33,000.

The IEF submits that, in their spirit, scope and level of cost, and in their aim of nurturing tender young lives toward a healthy, maximum fulfillment, Israel's badly-needed pre-kindergarten schools are ideally suited to both the compassion and the capacities of the Jewish teachers and educators of America.

The IEF, therefore, proposes that the organized Jewish teachers in every community in this country adopt the IEF Head Start-Israel Project by providing for the construction of as many pre-kindergartens as they can, thus helping to meet the need established by the people of Israel as their Number One Priority in education in the early years of the decade of the Seventies.

When you agreed to finance a bust of Ben Gurion for Eugene Ferkauf, the following were the conditions:

- 1. IL 4,000 for the first cast (IL 2200 for the plaster cast, IL 300 for expenses, and IL 1500 for the first bronze cast).
- 2. Additionally, you would have the option of purchasing the next five casts at the following prices:

Cast No. 2 - up to IL 1000 Cast No. 3 - up to IL 1000 Cast No. 4 - up to IL 1500 Cast No. 5 - up to IL 1500 Cast No. 6 - up to IL 1500

 Artistic approval of the bust by the Sculpture Dept. of Bezalel.

After completing his plaster work, Mr. Kafri checked with the foundry and discovered the foundry is now requesting IL 2400 for casting. The additional cost per cast is attributed to the rising cost in the past few months and the 20% devaluation of the past few weeks. I have refused to agree to the increased prices on the ground that I had a firm all-inclusive price covering all costs.

Since Mr. Kafri was recommended by the Bezalel School, I reviewed this matter with Yochanan Samuel, administrator of the Bezalel Art School (owner of the Old Jaffa Gallery in Jaffa), who confirmed to me that casting prices have gone up a great deal.

Also, originally, Danny Kafri was planning to do a lifesize bust. However, after meeting Ben Gurion and sketching him, he decided to increase the size of the bust three times the natural size. This, of course, affects the casting price.

If you want to see the first cast, it is in Kafri's oneman show at the Gordon Gallery, 29 Gordon St., Tel Aviv, which opened on September 18th. Please advise me (a) whether you agree to the increased price of the first cast for Mr. Ferkauf; and (b) whether you wish to exercise your option for additional casts. If you do not exercise the option to buy the other casts, the additional cost to the UJA will be IL 900 over the original price.

Subject: MR MORTON MANDEL

As you know, Mr Morton Mandel and his family are now visiting Israel. They day before I left you were not in your office, but I was told by Mr Erving Bernstein that we could not accept Mr Mandel's gift of \$200,000, for the Kiryat Yam Community Center, because Mr Mandel wanted to deduct part from his UJA gift.

I was hesitant about meeting Mr Mandel here, but Mr Vinitsky called me and told me that they had met and he had had a long conversation with Mr Mandel and had suggested that the Mandel family should give a much larger project: and Mr Mandel told Mr Vinitsky that he was ready to think about a school.

This morning I met Mr Mandel. We had a very long conversation. I suggested several projects to him, and after lengthy discussion we were left with two projects which appealed to him. One is the School for Physical Education at the Wingate Institute, and the other the Youth Training Center at Givat Michael. I asked for \$600,000 to \$650,000 for each of these projects. I also told Mr Mandel that in addition, although we would not enter any obligation to match this sum, in fact the sum will be matched by the government or from other sources. We also discussed terms of payment and I told him that we were prepared to go for 5 years, but of course it was understood that payments would be completed within 3 years if possible.

I arranged for Mr Mandel to visit the Wingate Institute, and while I am dictating this letter he is still there. I hope he will be well impressed. He will also hear more about the Givat Michael project today, and I hope to contact him tomorrow so that if there will be anythin to add from my side I will write to you immediately about it.

To summarise, Mr Mandel told me he was favourable inclined towards a big Mandel School and that he would discuss it with his brothers.by the end of January. I told him that you would be in contact with him in the States.

He raised the problem of the Kiryat Yam Center as he felt he had entered into an obligation with this project. I told him that if they give some bigger project, I would find a solution for Kiryat Yam.

I talked with him very openly about the problem of the UJA. I told him clearly that we would not be ably to accept a pledge if he intends deducting it from his UJA gift. I gave him examples of people who would be ready to give us pledges for the IEF if they were permitted to deduct them from their UJA gifts and whose offers we have refused. Mr Mandel told me very clearly to forget about this intention, and I hope that the subject is now closed.

- 3. Work begun by Ehud Mouchly on meticulously verifying all questionable pledges (See Section C)
- 4. Michael Yudin will handle all affairs concerning the Women's Division of New York projects and maintain "liason" with Henry C. Bernstein and others at New York City concerning New York prospects.
- 5. Visit of Elad Peled--Director General, Ministry of Education and Culture -- original invitation for him intended for early February--E. Mouchly cannot handle it at that time and ins-ructed Israel to postpone it for end of February, beginning of March.
- 6. E. Mouchly will be in Israel for Israel Education Fund business December 31 through January 16.
- 7. Furst Estate, Boston, Massachusetts: As per our agreement with the Estate, three of the Trustees are entitled to an annual "inspection tour" in Israel. This is a heavy item on our budget since we are covering all expenses incurred. E. Mouchly seeking to find whether this 'arrangement' can be eliminated.
- 8. Israel Education Fund Public Relations: All concerned are extremely unhappy with the current material we are using for presentation purposes--both the background information and the individual presentations. Irving Friedman, from the UJA PR department has been assigned to handle IEF Public Relations. E. Mouchly and M. Yudin proceeding with him preparing new background material and new format for project presentations.
- Budget for fiscal year April 71 March 72: Budget, as proposed by Herbert Rosenstein, was approved by Gottlieb Hammer in meeting held December 2, 1971.

B. Meetings:

- 1. During the annual UJA Conference, the Israel Education Fund had two special meetings.
 - a) Breakfast Meeting, Saturday, December 11, 1971--to which all Donors and other friends of the Fund were invited. Charles J. Bensley bade farewell as did Dr. Nesher and David Hersch. Phil Zinman and E. Mouchly were introduced as was Michael Yudin. New pledges were announced and a brief report of the Fund's progress was given.

- 5. Sam Sosland, Kansas City, Missouri: Together with Bill Rosenwald, we talked in our offices in general terms to him about the IEF program during the week of the Conference. It was agreed that E. Mouchly would follow up in Kansas City with the family in early February. Meanwhile, another Sosland, Morton, wrote a nasty letter advising that the family cannot and will not support the Israel Education Fund at this time. EM to fu.
- 6. <u>Boston</u>, <u>Massachusetts</u> Federation: E. Mouchly asked by the Federation in Boston for for presentations to solicit a mutual Fund there. No progress at this time. E. Mouchly to fu end of January.
- 7. Alan Ginsburg, East Lansing, Michigan: Alan Ginsburg is currently overdue \$80,000 and we have just finished the first stage of his project in Caesarea at a cost of \$200,000. Ginsburg, although in very bad finalcial situation, intends to honor his pledge of \$500,000 and agreed to find a way to pay the \$80,000 now overdue by March of 1972. He is also willing to help us find a way to pay interest on the \$120,000 outstanding on the first stage.
- 8. <u>Dr. Sidney Edelstein</u>, Englewood, New Jersey: Met with him on December 23, 1971 to solicit him for a new project. Discussed, in general terms the IEF. Edelstein wishes to, first, finish paying for his Library. Expressed interested in our pre-kindergarten program. EM to fu end of January.
- 9. Harry Levin, Chattanooga, Tennessee: Levin, two years ago, gave us U. S. Treasury bonds with face value of \$100,000 against his \$150,000 pledge for the Community Center in Ashdod. Maturity date was 1983. The Bonds were, very unfortunately, sold prematurely at a loss of \$30,000. Levin claims that he is not responsible for this difficulty not having given an authorization for the sale, as he has pointed out. Spoke to him December 28 and put him on the spot by requesting his help. He was agreeable to the point of not definitely closing the door on his suplementing his pledge, but will not discuss it until after the Center has been completed. Because of the money troubles and misunderstandings concerning this case, E. Mouchly's decision is not to push further at this time and to re-negotiate when we can proove substantial progress (physical) Scheduled for beginning construction by April of 1972.
- 10. Louis J. Horowitz Fund (Samuel Nass, New York, New York- Trustee): We have a pledge for \$250,000 towards the Carmiel Comprehensive High School. Jack Kalman of City following up with Nass to sign the pledge.
- 11. Leroy Hoffberger, Baltimore, Maryland: Shmueli and E. Mouchly solicited him back in November for an additional project by December. Hoffberger advised E. Mouchly that due to overcommittments to the general campaign, the Foundation cannot, now, consider a project.

- 12. Abraham Shiffman, Detroit, Michigan: Being solicited for a new project, preferably in Tirat Carmel, by Philip Zinman.
- 13. <u>Jerome Klorfein</u>, New York, New York: Has signed pledge to increase his gift from \$100,000 to \$125,000.
- 14. Morton Wolf, New York, New York: Currently overdue \$50,000 on a pledge of \$100,000.

- 15. A. L. Freedlander, Dayton, Ohio: We have a pledge in our files from Freedlander for \$125,000 of which nothing has been paid so far. Freedlander died recently and E. Mouchly following up through Federation with the Estate.
- 16. Philip Stollman, Troy, Michigan: Oral pledge for \$250,000 made in August of 1968.

 Confirmed orally to me. E. Mouchly is questioning and seeking clearance to approach Stollman for verification. There is a hastle with Federation who will not give clearance even for verification problem. Refer to Mouchly's memo to Irving Bernstein dated December 21, 1971.
- 17. Monies Owed: Study by E. Mouchly of all donors who, to date, have not paid up at all.

 Details to be found in memo dated December 21, 1971, addressed to Phil

 Zinman, cc's to IB and E. Shavit.
- 18. Harry Farb, San Diego, California: Although he agreed, initially, to pledge \$200,000 towards the Shomron (Pardess Hanna Binyamina) Vocational School, he later passed on a letter from Nesher informing that we accept bequests for same amount. Having cleared with Israel, E. Mouchly reluctantly let him have above arrangements as an exception to our policy not to accept bequests any longer. E. Mouchly following up with Farb getting him to sign the Tightest agreement possible.
- 19. Soshana Sapir Project: A decision has been reached to build an IEF project in memory of the late Shoshana Sapir for \$1,000,000. We are seeking, as prospects, people who are not among regular IEF prospects in the amount of \$100,000. Joseph Meyerhoff, who agreed to pledge himself \$100,000, is Chairman of this special drive. Decision will be forthcoming from Israel as to type and location of project.
- 20. Morton Mandel, Cleveland, Ohio: Mandel, unfortunately, was solicited in Israel by various unauthorized people for \$100,000 for the Kiryat Yam Community Center--to which he agreed. The correct price, however, is \$200,000. Phil Zinman and E. Mouchly solicited him, and he finally agreed to increase his pledge to the IEF. Closing has been delayed because Mandel, apparently, intends to decrease his gift in Cleveland by the same ration. We have, at IB's instruction, suspended negotiations with Mandel--while Phil Zinman and Henry Zucker, Federation in Cleveland, discuss.

- 21. Phil Zinman, Camden, New Jersey: To our everlasting and happy surprise and gratitude, Phil and Zola have accepted sponsorship of the Dimona "B" Comprehensive High School for \$400,000.
- 22. Walter Artz, New York, New York: We have been carrying hom on our ledger as having pledged \$500,000 in the form of a bequest. E. Mouchly verified and found it to be an empty pledge and, therefore, decided to write him off the ledger.
- 23. Los Angeles Federation: Irving Bernstein has not yet solved E. Mouchly's problem with the LA Federation which, for the moment, remains a closed city to the Israel Education Fund.
- 24. Arthur Bierman Estate, Dayton, Ohio: We have been advised by Lou Goldman that the Estate may sponsor a project of the IEF. E. Mouchly sent him three possible presentations and Phil Zinman is following up.
- 25. <u>Irving Schneider</u>, New York, New York: E. Mouchly still in negotiations with him concerning his \$500,000 pledge for the Katamon Religious Comprehensive High School.
- 26. Appleman Family, Brooklyn, New York: Pending satisfactory visit of Mrs. Bina Appleman and Miss Aronoff, to Israel, we ought to be closing for \$200,000 for the Dimona Religious Comprehensive High School.
- 27. Women's Division of New York City: The Women's Division has accepted as the campaign goal of 1972, the building of seven Community Centers. In monitary terms, the layleadership announced a \$2,000,000 goal, while the Professional Leadership does not want to commit itself to more than \$1,400,000.

 We hope to realize funds somewhere in between these two figures.
- 28. Robert Efroymson, Indianapolis, Indiana: Although we have not yet received written pledge form from him, we have already received first payment of \$50,000 towards the construction of the Youth Aliyah Vocational High School in Tiberias. He, at the same, time, has paid up -- in full -- his pledge for the Center in Ashkelon.
- 29. Shanbaum, Carp, and Greenberg, Dallas, Texas: This pledge for \$300,000 towards the

 Denmark School was one of our questionable ones. Rabbi

 H. A. Friedman verified with Shanbaum and informs us that

 we can expect payment the end of 1972.
- 30. Joseph Shane, Los Angeles, California: He is still a collection problem. Phil Zinman following up.
- 31. Horace Goldsmith, New York, New York: Solicited in our offices 11-26-71. Refer to December 1, Summary Report of November activities, "C: #20. It has been cleared now for solicitation from City. Yudin following up.
