MELVIN S. GOLDSTEIN

Rabbi Friedman called me. Wished to speak to you -- in your absence, left the following requests for you for follow through:

1. Mr. and Mrs. Paul Kapelow will both travel to Israel on the El Al flight on the 19th on which seats are being held.
2. Edward Ginsberg, Paulette Fink and Herbert Friedman will leave New York on PAA 114 on October 18
and would like to join the El Al flight leaving N.Y. 19th, on October 20th at 12.30 in Paris and continue to Israel from there.
3. In Paris, three singles are required at the Prince de Galles.
4. Vinitzky to be requested to make following reservations at the Sheraton from the 20th, for five days:

A suite for Mr. and Mrs. Kapelow
A suite for Herbert A. Friedman
A single for Edward Ginsberg
A single for Mrs. Fink

Vinitzky should be informed that it might be a good idea to have one car available for the group, and if no drivers are available, either Friedman or Ginsberg will do the driving.

5. Departure from Israel: Edward Ginsberg will accompany Herbert Friedman to Geneva

A reservation, single room, is required for Ginsberg in Geneva for the two nights (JDC has already been requested to make such reservation for Friedman)

6. Paul Kapelow will travel with Mrs. Kapelow from Israel -- to Vienna, Marseille, etc. and whatever has been requested for Mrs. Kapelow, should also be requested for him. (Rabbi Friedman said he assumed letters had already gone off re Mrs. K.)

Dear Sam,

Attached hereto is a copy of a self explanatory letter I have sent to Egon Fink regarding Mrs. Hester Kapelow who I'm sure you know.

In addition to going to Vienna, Mrs. Kapelow will visit Marseille. We think it is very important for her to go there.

She leaves Vienna October 30th via Air France flight 735 and arrives in Paris at 3.05 p.m. She then leaves Paris on the same day via TIUT37 at 6 p.m. and arrives in Marseille at 7.40 p.m. She is scheduled to leave Marseille for Paris on November 1st via Air France 400.

It is very important that a complete program be set up for Mrs. Kapelow in Marseille. Somebody has to meet her at the airport upon her arrival and take her in hand. The hotel reservation must be made for her. We want her to visit the camp in Marseille and to see everything else that ought to be seen. She should be treated as a VIP.

Would you be good enough to let me know the hotel at which a reservation has been made for her in Marseille and who will be looking after her. Please write me as soon as possible.

Dear Egon,

On October 26th via El Al 413, Mrs. Hester Kapelow of New Orleans is scheduled to arrive in Vienna from Israel. Mrs. Kapelow is the wife of Mr. Paul Kapelow, a member of our National Campaign Cabinet, who I believe you know. He is a very important worker and a large contributor.

Particularly in the last year, Mrs. Kapelow has become more and more active and more and more interested in the work of the UJA. So much so, that she now does a good deal of speaking for us in this country. Travelling around to address groups is not easy, and since she does so much of this, you can accept that as a measure of her interest.

Mrs. Kapelow will be in Israel with her husband and will come to Vienna alone. It is important that she be met upon her arrival at the airport and that a reservation be made for her at the Imperial Hotel. She should have constant attention and a complete program should be worked out for her so that she really has a picture of the emigrants passing through Vienna and of everything else that is going on. She should meet Garcy and the other people at the Jewish Agency and you should introduce her to everyone you think she ought to meet. Treat her as a real VIP.

On October 30th she is scheduled to leave Vienna via Air France 735 for Paris and will then go on to Marseille.

Would you please cable as soon as the reservation has been made at the Imperial.

Herbert Friedman is planning to come to Paris, probably on Saturday night, April 1st, and on Monday go on to Morocco. This has been taken up with the JDC here. I would appreciate it if you would reserve accommodations for Mr. Friedman at the Prince de Galles.

The reason for Mr. Friedman stopping in Paris is to see several people before going to Morocco. The Israel Embassy here is arranging an appointment with Ambassador Eytan for some time on Sunday, April 2nd, and is also trying to arrange an appointment with some of the "boys" who are in charge of matters in Europe. I will let you know details on this as soon as I have them.

Mr. Friedman plans to be back in Paris from Casablanca on Thursday, April 6th, and will leave on Friday, April 7th, for Tel Aviv. While he is in Paris he will write a letter to go to about 3,000 people in the United States. We should like to impose on your good offices to arrange to get the letter out. 


