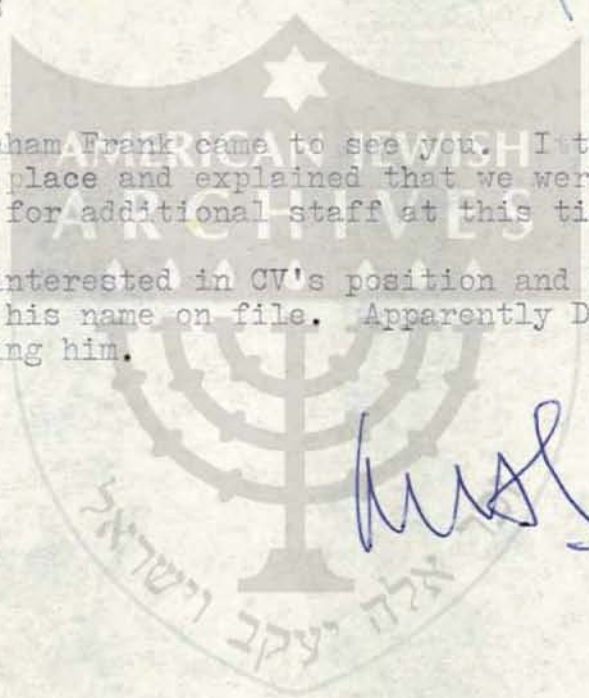

Dear Rabbi,

Allow me to introduce myself to you. Though we met several times in the States at U.J.A. Dinners and at Jewish Agency functions, you may not remember me.

I served as Director of Aliyah in the U.S. and Canada during the two crucial years of the upsurge in <sup>ד"ר</sup> following the Six Day War - 1967-69. That was not my first contact with North American Jewry. We lived there from 1950-1954, during which time I was based in New York, Boston and Montreal, - travelling widely, lecturing and organising pro-Israel activities on behalf of IZFA, Youth and Hechalutz and Aliyah. From 1957-59 I served as Director of PATWA in Great Britain. For seven years, as Director of Public Relations for Rassco, I again came in frequent contact with American Jews, both in Israel, and on two extended business trips to the U.S. I dare say that I gained a thorough knowledge of American Jewry, its organizations and institutions, and am personally well acquainted with many lay and religious leaders in many communities and in all segments of American Jewish Life.

Although employed at present in an Executive position, I should like once more to give of myself and my capabilities in a framework which provides a challenge and would give me an opportunity to help in the strengthening of the ties between Israel and American Jewry.

If this brief outline of my life and future aspirations is of interest to you, I would appreciate if you would give me some time to discuss this matter further.

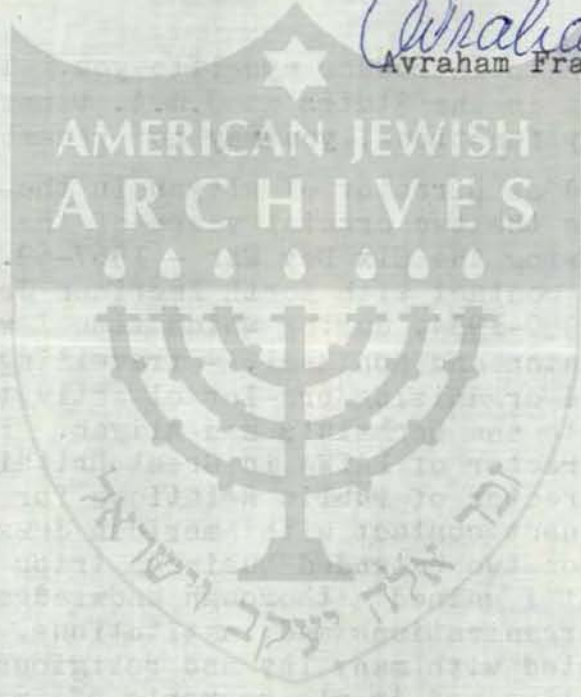
