\$18 Million Goal Met In Campaign

A subdued gathering of Jewish Welfare Fund leaders and workers heard a report at the closing JWF Campaign meeting Thursday night that the campaign had met its goal of \$18 million. The meeting was held at Park Synagogue.

In a dramatic, 11th hour turn of events Wednesday, just as some doubt was cast on achieving the goal, top campaign leaders met together and decided to guarantee the drive's success, in tribute to the memory of Julie Kravitz, long-time JWF leader and worker, who died Wednesday morning following his abduction and shooting Tuesday.

Last year's campaign raised \$16.7 million. This year's total includes funds for Project Renewal, the rehabilitation program for Israel's poorer communities initiated by Prime Minister Menachem Begin. General Campaign Chairman Victor Gelb announced that Cleveland's Project Renewal commitment, to the Tel Aviv neighborhood of Neve Sharett, would now be dedicated to the memory of Julie Kravitz.

Throughout the meeting the dominant theme was one of tribute to Mr. Kravitz's lifetime of good works.

Jewish Community Federation President Albert B. Ratner convened the meeting with poignant remarks about Kravitz's invaluable personal friendship and invaluable service to the community.

In his address, Gelb thanked the community in


general and those attending in particular for providing a unique and unforgettable experience.

Citing many with whom he had worked hand in hand over the last two years, Gelb recalled some of the campaign highlights which were especially meaningful to

Among them were the opportunity to sharpen his insight into our local agencies' ongoing struggle against inflation; his moving meeting with Soviet refugees in Vienna, less than 24 hours out of the Soviet Union; and the excitement of "media events," such as "Proclaim Liberty" in 1978 and the campaign meeting with Abba Eban less than a month ago.

Ratner, on behalf of the Jewish community, expressed his gratitude for the job Gelb had done as chairman for the past two years. He then awarded Gelb Federation's silver medallion in recognition of his service.

Following the early meeting, many of the campaign workers and their spouses went out to dinner and to celebrate with co-workers with whom they had shared responsibilities over the past several months.

Jewish Welfare Fund Boon To Immigrants, Rabbi Says

By ROBERT WHITE Staff Reporter

This year approximately 50,000 Jews will leave the USSR. The majority, some 30,000, will settle in Israel. Most of the remainder will emigrate to the United States.

All of these immigrants, along with thousands of other Jews, will receive substantial support from their people in both countries.

And that, according to Rabbi Herbert Friedman, is but one of the reasons why the Jewish community is asked to contribute to the Jewish Welfare Fund.

Rabbi Friedman will discuss the fund and related topics during an address this morning at Synagogue Emanu-El in Charleston. His appearance is part of a month-long fund-raising campaign in the United States.

Much of the money collected by the Charleston Jewish Welfare Fund and similiar organizations is used to offset the cost of providing aid to the 40,000 immigrants who enter Israel each year, Friedman said.

The aid given to Jewish immigrants is substantial, Friedman said. A man arriving at the Tel Aviv airport with his family, for example, generally has two immediate decisions to make. He can ask to be admitted to one of the 60 Immigrant Absorption Centers in Israel, where he and his family can live for free for six months while they study the language and make the adjustment to a new country.

Some immigrants, he said, prefer to go to work immediately in Israel, but take advantage of housing and other assistance which is provided at no charge.

"It's a culture shock for them," Friedman commented. He termed the Immigration Absorption Centers and other assistance "an incredibly humane way" to handle the influx of people into the small (3.8 million population) country. The goal, he said, "is to get them through the first few rough months."

In most cases, he said, "you're helping them get out of a communist country. You're bringing them into the free world."

Friedman said contributions from American Jews are also spurred by a desire to help Israel cope with internal development. He said Israel, burdened with an annual inflation rate of more than 100 percent




and the expense of supporting a strong military organization, looks to the U.S. and other countries for some support.

Nat Shulman, executive director of the Charleston Jewish Welfare Fund, noted that approximately 65 percent of the money raised locally is sent overseas. The remainder is used to finance projects in the Charleston area.

Shulman said that last year five Russian refugee families settled in Charleston with the help of the fund. More Russian families are expected next year, he said.

Melvin Solomon, president of the local chapter of the Jewish Welfare Fund, announced that the 35th annual meeting of the Charleston Jewish Welfare Fund will be held at 8 p.m. today at the Jewish Community Center.






