1. American Jewish community must remain alert to any possibility. ~~to~~ → 5

2. Must expect continuous trouble and difficulty - Arabs ~~don't~~ obviously don't want peace -

Hussein won't or can't stop the raiding - Give box score. Israeli public can't be expected to stand for it without demanding government to react

UN will condemn

American Jews must not falter or lose patience

2. Campaign is vehicle not only to raise money - but to spread information - and create this attitude.

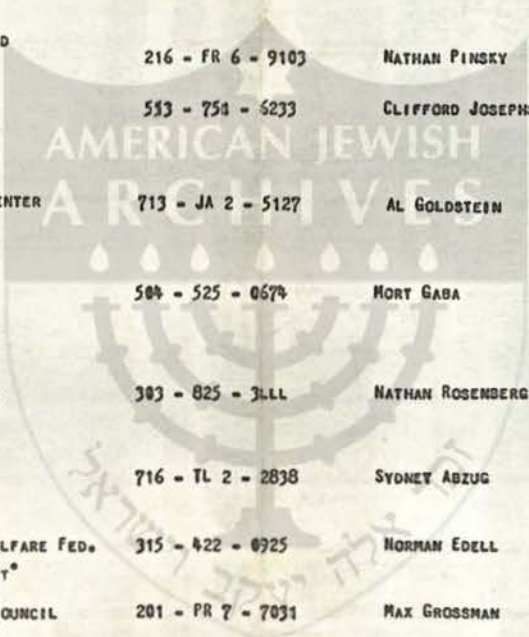
3. Urge vigor in conduct of campaign - give local figures to date - or refer to nearest camp, dinner - localize the approach
