HAROLD B. ALBERT, Albuquerque, N.M., is a member of the Lay Staff of UJA Operation Upgrade and has been active with the Joint Distribution Committee. 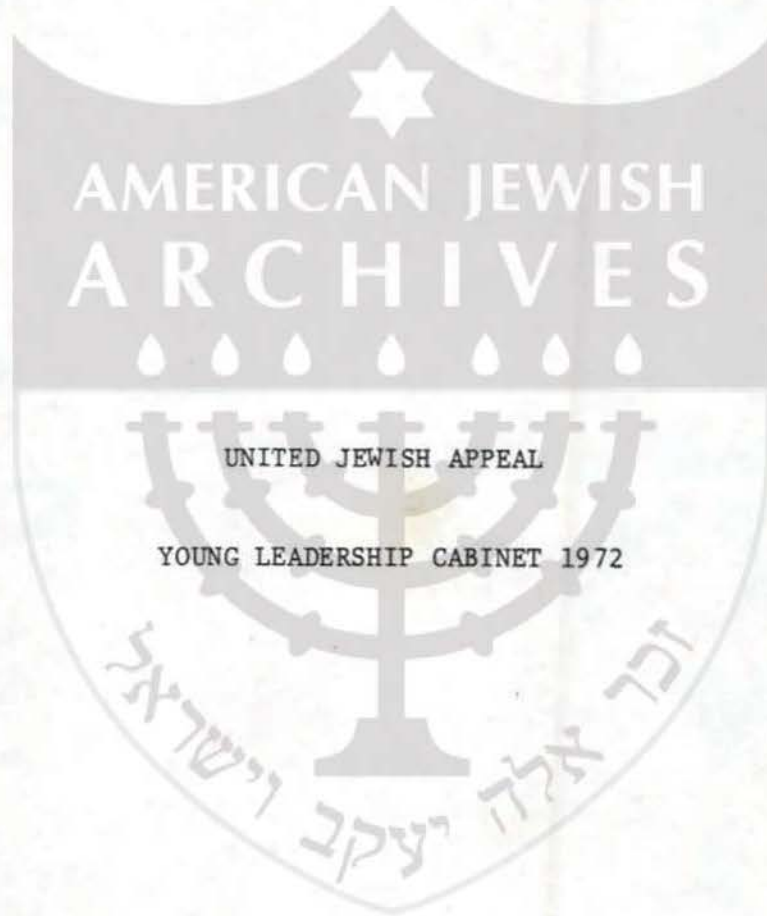
