HOW TO PROCEED ON "RE-ENGINEERING"

1. Write a plan outline
2. Get Brian to agree
3. Get Les to agree
4. Get CRB to agree
5. Force a date of the nine persons
6. Bring matter to UJA executive committee
7. Inform Jewish Agency

Operating Plan

1. Form a corporation ("wholly-owned" by UJA) - Corporation for the Future (see attached memo for names of board)
2. Find chief executive in U.S. - Erich Zahler (two-year leave of absence)
3. Find chief executive in Israel (one of forum people)
4. First-year budget - 30 million
5. Overhead administration - 3 million (10%) - salaries, travel, phone, rent
6. House the corporation either in Wexner's office or UJA office

Steps to Get Started

A. Make inventory of facilities available in Israel, in all categories:

1. Summer

- a. Six to eight-week summer programs - independent
- b. Four to eight-week summer camps
- c. Places available in already ongoing programs - UAHC, Masorti, Young Judea, AZF, BBYO, etc.

2. Semester - 10th grade

- a. Kfar Blum
- b. Alexander Muss High School in Israel
- c. Any other Kibbutzim or organizations

3. Full-year universities
