

SUBJECT: OPTIONS FOR JUNE 14 COMMISSION MEETING

We have multiple options for the June 14th meeting. They include the AJC facility, HUC, and the Board of Jewish Education offered most recently by Alvin Schiff. I would like to put forward the advantages and disadvantages of each and a recommendation.

## <u>AJC</u>

## Advantages:

- 1. Centrally located
- 2. Nice clean space, quite functional
- 3. Good breakout rooms

## Disadvantage:

 Would have to have lunch in the room in which we meet. This is a considerable disadvantage. It could be worked out but it would be awkward.

#### HUC

#### Advantage:

1. Very functional space. Could meet all the requirements that need to be met and have been met through the use of the Federation/UJA facility.

## Disadvantages:

- 1. Poor location
- 2. Possible negative message in that it would suggest a leaning toward one denomination as opposed to others. When we had considered HUC a month or so ago, we were told by Al Schiff and Joe Reimer that Isadore Twersky and perhaps others might have a problem participating in a formal meeting at HUC. They went on to say that it could move the Commission away from the wonderful sense of balance that you have created between the three denominations. Alvin Schiff was most forceful in putting forward that opinion.

## Recommendation:

I believe we should consider using HUC, but that it has to be made clear by you that we are using HUC, not to send a signal that we are moving toward favoring one denomination or that, in fact, we are going to be starting a process of

rotating between NUC, Yeshiva University, the Seminary in the Reconstructionist College. Instead, it needs to be put forward that we are only using the facility because of an emergency that occurred and were unable to use the space at Federation/UJA, that all future meetings will be, in fact, at Federation/UJA and this is a once only occasion.

I also believe you should personally call Twersky and ask if he would have a problem participating in a meeting at HUC. I might call, if you think it's appropriate, Professors Lamm, Schorsch and Creen and explain to them why we are using HUC.

If you feel that's too much to go through in order to use that facility, we should probably consider looking at hotel space. I think you are right that the lunch at AJC in the same meeting room could be a problem.

For your information, Alvin Schiff, having heard that we are in the need of space, he may have picked it up at the educators meeting which was held at the Board of Education, called me to offer his facility for the meeting. His board room can sit fifty in tables arranged in a horseshoe. However, I do believe there are significant disadvantages in using his facility.

- 1. The building is over 100 years old and looks it.
- 2. It is on the west side between 9th and 10th Avenues.
- 3. The rooms he is talking about are quite small and it would be very cramped.
- 4. The building has one small elevator and his board room or conference facility is on the 4th floor.

Dear Sima:

I have not yet heard from Phyllis Booth, but thought I would write and try to give you a comprehensive picture of our needs for Tuesday, June 12, 1990.

1. The Commission meeting is scheduled to begin at 10:00 a.m. and to conclude at 4:00 p.m. We will ask participants to plan to arrive at 9:30 so that we can begin promptly at 10:00. Several staff people, including myself, will wish to arrive between 8:00 and 8:30 a.m. to get set up and organized.

We will need a registration table in the foyer as well as a place to hang coats. If possible, please let me know a telephone number at which commissioners can be reached 217 during the day.

For the period from 9:30 to 10:00 a.m. we would like to provide people with coffee, tea, and miniature pastries in the foyer. I am envisioning an area large enough for people to mill around in as they wait for the meeting to begin. Please let me know if this is incorrect.

I spoke with Mario Nunez! who said that he could set up the meeting room so that the meetings can be taped. Given the size of the table, I assume that this will mean several microphones strategically placed and a tape machine in the room which a Commission staff member will monitor. Mario also said that if his dubbing machine is back from the shop, he would be willing to make a copy of the tapes before we leave at the end of the day. I would appreciate your confirming this with him.

- 5. The room should be set up with a table in an open square to seat 60. It is our hope that, based on these drafts, commissioners will authorize the final report for release at a final, celebratory meeting in October.

You may wish to provide commissioners with a general update on the structure of the implementation mechanism and on fundraising, based on the teleconference of May 11. We plan to discuss this in more detail at the June 12 meeting.

Finally, please strongly encourage attendance and let me know as soon as possible the outcome of your discussions.

#### A. Opening Statement (10:00 - 10:20 a.m.)

#### 1. Why the Commission?

Throughout the past two years we have been working as a group to examine the problems and opportunities facing Jewish education and to develop a comprehensive plan to dramatically improve Jewish education. As you know, what has driven us is our common concern for the Jewish continuity of our people.

#### 2. The Process

We have tried throughout our process to ensure that our results are reflective of the group's deliberations. Therefore, in addition to our meetings, we have had extensive consultations with commissioners in private, as well as active review of all materials by our senior policy advisors group.

What really marks this process as unique is the partnership between public institutions of organized Jewish life and private foundations, and educators. I hope that this reflects a new model of public/private cooperation within the Jewish community that can emerge from our work.

#### 3. Findings and Recommendations

At this point we are ready to review our findings and recommendations. The working paper prepared for today outlines the findings, including an analysis of the challenges and opportunities facing us in Jewish education. It also lists the recommendations we will consider. Annette Hochstein will review all of this with us shortly. We hope to have your reactions to all of this today so that we will be able to work towards our final report.

#### 4. Research

In the process of this study we commissioned a number of research papers to help fill the void of knowledge available about Jewish education. A number of papers have been completed and released. These include Isa Aron's paper on professionalism in Jewish teaching; Walter Ackerman's paper on the structures of Jewish education; and most recently, Aryeh Davidson's paper on training. Several others are due shortly and will be released when completed. With each of these, I hope you will share with me or our staff any comments or reactions you may have. Our intent is to include these papers in what we release as the work of the Commission.

#### 5. Update on Funding

I know that many commissioners are anxious to know what reactions we are getting in our discussions with funders. Solicitation of funders and matching funders with service providers will be a prime function of our implementation entity. We have made a good beginning in this process.

A major aspect of the implementation mechanism's work is to see to it that long-term support for Jewish education continues to be provided generously by current sources: tuition income, congregational and organizational budgets and fundraising, and gradually increasing federation allocations. However, the implementation mechanism has the special responsibility now to encourage support from some relatively new and critically important sources: family foundations, individual funders, and federation endowment funds. These sources can provide a "quick start" for the initiatives which we are proposing while traditional sources gear up.

Thus far, we have discussed funding with representatives of thirteen private foundations. This includes several foundations not represented on the Commission. We have asked them to set aside substantial funds to address Jewish education initiatives

during the next five years. Several have agreed to share in funding the proposed implementation mechanism. Several have agreed also to set aside substantial sums to fund Jewish education initiatives during the next five years. A number of others have taken our request under advisement and a few are already funding new programs to address major Jewish education needs.

We are very encouraged by the serious consideration which these sources are giving to stepping up their commitments to support Jewish education. While it is premature to put an exact figure on our projections, we have reason to believe that foundations will increase their Jewish education grants over the next five-year period by twenty-five to fifty million dollars. This is a rough estimate, but we believe it is a conservative one.
