

#### MEMORANDUM

SUBJECT: Meeting space in New York

The issue of location for the April 21 board meeting remains unresolved. As you know, UJA/Federation is not available on that day. Barry Holtz has been in touch with the Jewish Museum about use of their space and thought we had an arrangement for a waiver or reduction in rent, but the director recently told him that we would have to pay the full fee, which they charge even to their own board members. Barry then tried to find us space at Columbia University, but learned yesterday that it is not available then, either.

I called the Jewish Museum today and learned the following. They have an auditorium which seats up to 220 and can be arranged lecture style, classroom style, or conference style (around a table). There is a smaller space, called a gallery, which can hold 75 people and be set up in any of these ways, as well. In addition, there is a section of the cafe which can be closed off and used for meeting.

With board members, guests, and staff, we can anticipate about 60 participants. Our day is tentatively planned as follows:

- 9-9:45 Study session (Could be held in the gallery or auditorium.)
- 10-12 Committee meetings (They could set up one at each end of the auditorium, one in the gallery, and one in the cafe.)
- 12-2 Lunch (They would need time to set up the auditorium for lunch. If we used 12 12:45 for people to tour the museum, which they would arrange, lunch could be set up during that time.)
- 2-4 Board Meeting (Could be held in the gallery)

The rental charge for the auditorium during the day is \$1800 and for the gallery is \$1000. The woman I spoke with said they might be able to work out a combined fee that would be less than \$2800, but couldn't guarantee it and didn't know what that fee might be. The cost of food would be additional, and we would have to use their in-house, kosher caterer. The space is currently being held for us.

An alternative to the Jewish Museum might be to use one of the university clubs that Premier uses for investor meetings. I learned from Bill Evanson that Premier uses either the Princeton Club or the Cornell Club, one through John Colman and the other through our PR consultant in New York. Before pursuing this option further, I thought I should check with you.

My recommendation is that we go ahead with the Jewish Museum. It is a more appropriate space and can be set up to accommodate our needs. I would appreciate your guidance.







#### April 1994

In August 1993, the CIJE appointed a full-time Executive Director, Alan Hoffmann, and two new full-time senior educational professionals, Barry Holtz and Gail Dorph. The new full-time professional team, supported by Virginia Levi, Administrative Director, is supplemented by consultants on Research, Monitoring and Evaluation (Adam Gamoran and Ellen Goldring), Community Organization (Stephen Hoffman), the Goals Project (Seymour Fox and Daniel Pekarsky), and Planning (Annette Hochstein). In addition, three full-time field researchers make up the staff of the Monitoring, Evaluation and Feedback project. As of January 1994, CIJE has an office in New York. We now have in place the professional capability we need to achieve our agenda.

Over the past eight months, CIJE has concentrated its energies in several directions:

- It has invested in building its own policymaking and planning capacity, leading to the emergence of a Program Steering Committee and four standing Board Committees, which will meet for the first time at the April 1994 Board meeting.
- 2. In the "laboratories" of the Lead Communities (Milwaukee, Atlanta, Baltimore), CIJE and local community leadership have pioneered a model which moves from multi-dimensional research about the Jewish educational personnel of that community, through policy analysis to the building of a comprehensive personnel action plan for the community.
- 3. A fall Institute for Educational Leadership will be one of the first results of joint personnel action plans invelowing by Asy a number of communities.
- 4. The Goals Project will engage educational institutions and Man local communities in a process of learning, self-reflection and analysis to define their mission.

In addition, work proceeds on the Monitoring, Evaluation and Feedback project in the three Lead Communities, and on the documenting of outstanding Jewish educational practice through the "Best Practices" project.

of major importance, CIJE is now poised to share these developments and because with a widening circle that will involve other North American communities who wish to be engaged with us in seeking systemic reform of Jewish education in their communities.

#### **CIJE Structure Today**

In summary, CIJE was created by the North American Commission on Jewish Education with a highly focused mission which incorporated three major tasks: Building the Profession of Jewish education; Mobilizing Community Leadership for Jewish education and Jewish continuity; developing a Research Agenda while at the same time securing funding for Jewish educational research. These "building blocks" all involve major long-term improvements in infrastructure for the North American Jewish community and, as a result, the Commission mandated the creation of Lead Communities. These are development and demonstration sites where, by mobilizing the leadership of the local community and by improving the quality of personnel for Jewish education, significant change and impact could be shown to be possible over a period of time, while the national infrastructure itself was undergoing major reform.

Four Board committees have been formed which represent the major areas of CIJE's work: Building the Profession; Community Mobilization; Content and Program; and Research and Evaluation. Board members will all serve on a committee along with other participants not members of the CIJE Board. These committees will review in depth the work of their committee, and offer input and direction to our Board and staff. The chairs of these committees and staff currently make up the Steering Committee.

#### Personnel Action Plan

By December 1993, all three Lead Communities had completed data collection both for a qualitative study of the Professional Lives of Educators and a quantitative Educators Survey. Taken together, the two reports which have either been completed or are about to be completed form the major part of a diagnostic profile of all formal Jewish educators in that particular community.

In Milwaukee, the personnel survey is already being shared and analyzed by the Lead Community strategic planning group with consultation from CIJE staff. CIJE lay leaders have met with top Milwaukee Federation leadership to think through the long-range implications of a comprehensive plan for in-service training, recruitment and retention of educators in that community. Educators themselves are being involved in the setting of priorities within a personnel action plan. CIJE is providing Milwaukee with expert outside consultants to consider the implications of developing the personnel plan.

Within the coming six months, this process will have been replicated in Baltimore and Atlanta, with the appropriate adaptations for each community's nuances and differences. A major integrative report which pools the joint findings from all three communities will be published and released to the North American Jewish community leadership in the fall or winter. Joint personnel activities across communities which emanate from this process will be under way by the fall of 1994. An example is a forthcoming Institute for Educational Leadership which CIJE is planning with Milwaukee, Baltimore and Atlanta in October 1994.

CIJE is now able to share this sequence, running from research on personnel to a personnel action plan, with a wider range of communities who are committed to the centrality of building the profession in Jewish educational reform.

### **Goals Project**

The Goals Project is a multi-pronged effort to catalyze a "vision" for Jewish education institutions. During the work of the North American Commission on Jewish Education it was deliberately decided to defer discussion on the goals of Jewish education to a later stage. As CIJE began to work with local communities, both institutional and community leadership raised the issue of the outcomes of our work. What do we hope will happen? It appears timely to give serious attention to the mission (or missions) of Jewish education in those communities with which we are working.

The Goals Project will engage educational institutions and the local communities in a process the Morning, self-reflection and That will Evante to Manual define their institutional vision, understand its educational implications, and use that knowledge in setting priorities and in planning.

A seminar for key community lay and professional leadership including institutional leadership - from communities who are
prepared to engage in this task will take place this summer.
Participants will meet with some outstanding individuals who have
pondered the question of what is an educated Jew, and towards
what should Jewish education be educating. Participants will
have opportunities to develop an understanding of the ways in
which a guiding vision can contribute to the design and
effectiveness of an educating institution. They will wrestle
with the problem of developing both their own institutional goals
and with creating a community climate which encourages and
promotes this approach. It is CIJE's intention that the training
institutions and education departments of won the denominations

I look forward to seeing you at our Board meeting on Thursday. Mort and I think it is particularly appropriate that you will be introducing Prof. Daniel Pekarsky's presentation on the Goals Project since you have had such a central hand in shaping the merchants of our thinking about Goals over the past few years.

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During the work of the Commission, you raised the issue of the outcome of Jewish education even though you understood that the Commission could at that stage not deal with the Scentral topic. You understood the need for the Commission, constituted as it was, to be a body which had to work through the building of consensus and that a discussion about the goals of Jewish education would necessarily involve different approaches to Jewish educational outcomes.
