I wanted to let you know that I was extremely pleased to hear from Barry that you had agreed to be the speaker at the CIJE Board Seminar on Wednesday evening, November 1st. We think that the Board Seminar is an important forum for lay and professional leaders interested in Jewish education to be exposed to new ideas and explore different approaches to the questions on the community's agenda. I know that you have a great deal to contribute to this kind of audience and personally I look forward to hearing you that evening.

The topic that the CIJE staff has been interested in hearing you talk about is: the search for meaning in contemporary North America and the ways that the Jews are both part of that zeitgeist (such as in the way you describe "spiritual, but not religious" in your Cincinnati talk. I think that these particular issues have not often been raised in the Jewish "continuity" circles and I believe that your thoughts on these matters are important for people to think about.

I promised Steve Hoffman I required only five minutes of his time; and, predictably, CIJE got maximum value per minute.

I asked him about the theme: Promoting Jewish educational change in an era of flat campaigns. Likely leading to personnel and leadership.

Here are his reactions, in sequence:

"I would use language like 'fiscal stringency' rather than flat campaign. Then the question is: Is it real? That is: Are money constraints an impediment to change--or not? I don't know the answer."

Then: "I don't know if I want to go to one more meeting where we worry about money. CIJE can't do much about it anyway." He didn't think the money issue was necessarily the right starting place for the conversation.

Then: "I would turn the thing on its head. If I were being cute, I would ask: If we've got all these great ideas, how come we're moving so slowly? Or, less cutely: What are the obstacles to change, of which money is just one?"

So that's his reaction. What's yours?

Mine, on one foot: This seems to me to be a bit about: What have we learned from the Lead Com. experience and in our other projects/efforts about the impediments to change—and the enhancers? I don't know if we're ready to have that conversation, and I don't know how to be cautious about the possible negativity quotient. On the other hand, this perspective DOES take into account the reality of where people/communities are and has the possibility of bringing new people into our work more subtly, by describing what we've learned rather than what we've done. And we have some positive things to say about what enhances the possibility of change—leaders, involvement of the rabbi, the holy trinity, enlightened private funding, etc.

I think this is an all time first: I talked Art Green into something! He turned down my request to speak at the board and I gave him a "let me tell you why I think this would be good for you" speech and he agreed that it was good for Brandeis, so he shouldn't turn it down. I connected my pitch to the fact that Mort seemed quite keen on Reinharz and Brandeis and that if Art wanted to build a new institution there, our board was a good place to set the context (though not to promote his project directly.)

I'm not sure if he'll actually write it up for us, given his very busy schedule, but he said that the Cincinnati booklet was a lecture that he gave there, so I think it's possible—after the talk.

Now, we need to sew this up quickly. So who sends the official invite: Nessa? Mort? Alan? Last time I think we had a letter to Sarna from either Alan or me, followed by an official letter from Mort written by Nessa.

Who remembers?

I feel much relieved that we're in business. (I just want to point out that I have landed 2 of the 3 speakers so far!)

To summarize: We arrived at the title: "In Quest of a Future: The Jewish Seeker on the North American Landscape."

We spoke about where the Jewish quest for meaning aligns with religious currents in America and where the Jews depart (as the most "secular" Americans, among other attributes.) What kind of vision do we Jews have for ourselves as a minority that will remain a minority on this continent? What counter-models can we offer to prevailing American culture and norms; and what, in candor, are the limitations of that "or la-goyim" ethos? (What does our integration into North American life offer that is truly desirable to most American Jews--and how can we construct an idea of our community that is honest about that?) Last, in light of the vision--or visions--set forth in this talk, what kind of educational leadership and training will be required to embody that vision? How will that vision get "translated" (to use an ed. term) into structures, experiences and a knowledge base that are ongoing and meaningful to non-separatist, and probably non-Orthodox, American Jews? (And even: How can we recruit the most talented and innovative young people into the enterprise, the ones who have some background and yet cannot imagine become professionally affiliated with the organized Jewish world?)

Does that approximate our conversation? If not, please amend. And if it makes you want to alter the title, let me know. I'll need to adapt and cut the above for the public letter that goes out. If you want to mark it up, or give me a quick call, that would be great.






TRAINED IN GENERAL EDUCATION, JEWISH STUDIES, AND ADMINISTRATION?



TRAINED IN GENERAL EDUCATION AND JEWISH STUDIES?









As you know, one result of CIJE's commitment to building the profession of Jewish education was the publication of the Policy Brief on our findings about the background and professional training of teachers in Jewish schools. The findings indicated a compelling need for comprehensive in-service training of a kind that had not yet been undertaken.

CIJE has decided to address one of the major shortages in this area--in-service training for supplementary school educators--by creating a national cadre of qualified teacher trainers for the supplementary school system in North American Jewish education. The teacher trainers in CIJE's **Teacher Educator Institute** (TEI) will have the expertise to design and help implement teacher-training programs in their local communities and throughout North America.

This three-year project, funded with the generous support of The Nathan Cummings Foundation, will result in:

- 1. A cadre of 30 teacher educators, who will be available to enhance significantly the quality of supplementary school teacher education in their own communities and in others.
- 2. A CIJE policy brief, outlining the "best practices" of in-service education and making recommendations for upgrading the professional development of supplementary school teachers.
- 3. A library of videotapes of teachers with an accompanying manual, to be used as effective catalysts for transforming practice in the classroom.

At the **Board Meeting on November 2**, CIJE consultant Dr. Ellen Goldring, of Vanderbilt University, will present new data on educational leaders from the **CIJE Study of Educators**. CIJE can now offer a striking portrait of the background, training, salary and benefits, and career satisfaction of Jewish educational leaders--school directors and principals in day schools, supplementary schools, and early childhood programs.

Research in both Jewish and general education indicates that the educational leader is critical in effecting genuine change in teaching and learning. Educational leaders are at the very core of CIJE's work: A serious impact on the leaders can transform the entire system.

In November, we will preview the data and reflect together on the nature of Jewish educational leadership. What are the current standards for educational leaders in the general American system? How do the qualifications of educational leaders in Jewish settings compare to those standards of training, and in what respects might our leaders be distinctive? How do they differ from the teachers? And what policy recommendations might be implied by these data and discussion?

Last year, CIJE had already begun to address the professional development of Jewish educational leaders through the CIJE-Harvard Leadership Institute. A new institute will be convened at Harvard this year. "Jewish Education with Vision: Building Learning Communities" will include the previous attendees and expand our orbit to other school directors and principals.

One powerful component of the first institute was the learning and exchange fostered at Harvard among educational leaders across denominational affiliations. These exchanges have continued within the communities that participated. Among our goals is the creation of **leadership networks**, peer learning groups of educational leaders from many school settings within local communities.

By the end of 1995, CIJE will have completed the next stage of the Best Practices project--Best Practices in Jewish Community Centers. As JCCs consciously set about becoming settings for Jewish education, leadership again plays a pivotal role. This study examines 6 sites where informal Jewish education is vital, engaging, and has transformed the JCC. The partnership of the JCC executive director and Jewish educator is a linchpin in supporting this new environment.

A pressing issue that has resulted from our work is the ongoing need for evaluation. When new initiatives are undertaken, how can their impact be measured? As in many realms within Jewish education, there is not currently a sufficient group of trained local evaluators to help institutions and communities assess their programs.

CIJE envisages the creation of an **evaluation institute for Jewisb education**. In November, a first consultation will be held toward the goal of establishing a national program for training locally based evaluators of Jewish educational initiatives.

CIJE was founded to serve as a catalyst for change in partnership with others. One of the most exciting aspects of our work has been the partnerships that have resulted as critical needs have been identified, both locally and nationally. At the last Board Meeting, we reported on new personnel initiatives for Jewish education funded by the Children of Harvey and Lyn Meyerhoff Philanthropic Fund in Baltimore, The Bader Foundation in Milwaukee, and The Nathan Cummings Foundation.

At the upcoming meeting, we will report on additional emerging partnerships. I hope to see you then.

- 3. A library of videotapes of teachers with an accompanying manual, to be used as effective catalysts for transforming practice in the classroom.

At the **Board Meeting on November 2**, CIJE consultant Dr. Ellen Goldring, of Vanderbilt University, will present new data on educational leaders from the **CIJE Study of Educators**. CIJE can now offer a striking portrait of the background, training, salary and benefits, and career satisfaction of Jewish educational leaders--school directors and principals in day schools, supplementary schools, and early childhood programs.

Research in both Jewish and general education indicates that the educational leader is critical in effecting genuine change in teaching and learning. Educational leaders are at the very core of CIJE's work: A serious impact on the leaders can transform the entire system.

In November, we will preview the data and reflect together on the nature of Jewish educational leadership. What are the current standards for educational leaders in the general American system? How do the qualifications of educational leaders in Jewish settings compare to those standards of training, and in what respects might our leaders be distinctive? How do they differ from the teachers? And what policy recommendations might be implied by these data and discussion?

Last year, CIJE had already begun to address the professional development of Jewish educational leaders through the CIJE-Harvard Leadership Institute. A new institute will be convened at Harvard this year. "Jewish Education with Vision: Building Learning Communities" will include the previous attendees and expand our orbit to other school directors and principals.

One powerful component of the first institute was the learning and exchange fostered at Harvard among educational leaders across denominational affiliations. These exchanges have continued within the communities that participated. Among our goals is the creation of **leadership networks**, peer learning groups of educational leaders from many school settings within local communities.

By the end of 1995, CIJE will have completed the next stage of the Best Practices project--Best Practices in Jewish Community Centers. As JCCs consciously set about becoming settings for Jewish education, leadership again plays a pivotal role. This study examines 6 sites where informal Jewish education is vital, engaging, and has transformed the JCC. The partnership of the JCC executive director and Jewish educator is a linchpin in supporting this new environment.

A pressing issue that has resulted from our work is the ongoing need for evaluation. When new initiatives are undertaken, how can their impact be measured? As in many realms within Jewish education, there is not currently a sufficient group of trained local evaluators to help institutions and communities assess their programs.

CIJE envisages the creation of an **evaluation institute for Jewish education**. In November, a first consultation will be held toward the goal of establishing a national program for training locally based evaluators of Jewish educational initiatives.

CIJE was founded to serve as a catalyst for change in partnership with others. One of the most exciting aspects of our work has been the partnerships that have resulted as critical needs have been identified, both locally and nationally. At the last Board Meeting, we reported on new personnel initiatives for Jewish education funded by the Children of Harvey and Lyn Meyerhoff Philanthropic Fund in Baltimore, The Bader Foundation in Milwaukee, and The Nathan Cummings Foundation.

At the upcoming meeting, we will report on additional emerging partnerships. I hope to see you then.












