Lester Pollack is a General Partner of Lazard Freres & Co.; Senior Managing Director of Corporate Partners, L.P., and Chief Executive Officer of Centre Partners, L.P., investment partnerships affiliated with Lazard Freres & Co.

Before joining Lazard, Mr. Pollack was a General Partner of Odyssey Partners. Prior to that he was Vice-Chairman and Co-Chief Operating Officer of United Brands Company from 1979 to 1981 and previously he was Executive Vice President of Loews Corporation, which he first joined in 1965. He also was a partner in a law firm in Manhattan from 1957 to 1965.

Mr. Pollack serves on the Board of Directors of Broad Inc., CNA Financial Corporation, Kaufman & Broad Home Corporation, The Leslie Fay Company, Loews Corporation, Paramount Communications, Inc., Parlex Corporation, Polaroid Corporation and Transco Energy Company.

He is a member of the Board of Trustees of New York University, the Chairman of the Budget Committee of the New York University Law Center Foundation and a member of The Board of Directors of The United Way of Tri-State, Inc.

Mr. Pollack is presently the President of the Jewish Community Centers Association of North America and Chairman of the International Affairs Committee of the Anti-Defamation League. He most recently was President of the Jewish Community Relations Council of New York and is Chairman of the Board of Associated YM-YWHAS of Greater New York, and Vice President and a member of the Executive Committee of the UJA/Federation of Jewish Philanthropies of New York.

Mr. Pollack was born in New York on August 14, 1933. He received a B.S. Degree from Brooklyn College in 1955 and an LLB Degree from New York University School of Law in 1957.

Mr. Pollack has lectured at the New York University Law School, the Centre for Study of Financial Institutions, the University of Pennsylvania and before the American Bar Association. He has received the Vanderbilt Medal and the Alumni Achievement Award from the New York University and the Scopus Award from The American Friends of Hebrew University. Mr. Pollack also co-authored "Collecting Claims and Enforcing Judgements" for the Practising Law Institute.

This is being written following the recent Board meeting. We all had an opportunity to see Lester and many of us had the chance to chat with him about CIJE affairs.

I met with Lester at his office in New York when I was in the city carlier this month for the meeting of the Senior Policy Advisors. This was just before the materials were mailed to the Board members so much of my time with him was spent discussing the status of the Lead Communities Project.

Since I have been in touch with staff members of the JCCA, I wanted Lester to know about this aspect of my own work. As it happened this was the week of the JCCA Board meeting and Lester was looking forward to reporting to the Board on the ongoing relationship between the JCCA and the CIJE. The timing could not have been better!

I told him of my visit with Jane Perman and about how we plan to meet again specifically to talk about early childhood and family education programs within the Centers. Lester was enthusiastic about this as well as about the prospects of more activity in the area of Jewish education.

The new chairman of the board of the Jewish Theological Seminary, Gershon Kiest, is a personal friend of Lester's and they have been discussing how the two organizations might work together to strengthen the Jewish component of the JCC's.

I found Lester to be supportive of the CIJE, interested in continuing to foster the goals of the maximizing commission of the JCCA and genuinely pleased with our progress to date.

Footnote: I will follow-up with Lester now that the Board and annual meetings are over. I have no reason to believe that he was anything but pleased with the outcome of both.
