Re: Best Practices in JCCs volume

Let me summarize the conversation we had last week about publication issues related to the Best Practice volume.

- 1) The volume will be ready the first week in May, published by CIJE with JCCA listed on inside front cover and in the book itself. The formulation uses the word "commissioned by" to describe the JCCA role.
- 2) CIJE will arrange for the printing of the volume and will sell (at cost) to JCCA those copies JCCA wishes to distribute. JCCA will list the publication in its own publicity and can either direct individuals to CIJE or can distribute volumes directly to those who wish to have them. The "at cost" price of the volume is around \$2.25 per book. We will know the precise figures when the job is finished (i.e. extras for shipping, etc.).
- 3) You have expressed interested in purchasing between 1000-1500 copies of the book. You expressed an interest in distributing the volume to people who attend the Biennial and sending copies to the following groups of people: Presidents, Executive Directors, Jewish educators, JCCA Board members, and Chairs of Jewish education at Centers, trying to avoid duplication with those who receive it at the Biennial.
- 4) You will let us know by (April 26th) exactly how many you need for the Biennial and we can either ship them to Baltimore or have them here for you to take.

I want to summarize my meeting with Don Scher this morning about dissemination of the BP volume.

Micro:

JCC system: I said that I understood that the volume would be disseminated through the JCC system. He said he thought yes. I asked him to check with Allan to be sure that all the constituents he thought were important were indeed receiving it. He said he would.

Israel: Don wants 200 copies to disseminate through the Jewish Agency and the Israeli academic community; he has lists in Israel. He wants to know from Alan H.: Do you want this volume at the Jewish Agency Assembly in June? Alan, I note that you have cc'd me on an extensive list of your own today. How much replication will there be? Don will be calling you this week. Could you please ascertain with him whether your list is close enough so that he does not need to distribute in addition? Be sure to let me know the answer because I'm supposed to mail him 200 copies for that purpose. (Maybe double distribution would be a plus?!)

Macro:

I asked him what his thinking was about getting this document/explaining its context to people outside the JCCA system, particularly the federation universe. He said: "It's CIJE's call about the federation system." I said that surely he had an ideal in mind, of what it would look like if the JCCA were successful in getting the message to CJF/federations.

He first mentioned: a session at the GA. (Apparently, Mort and he were whispering throughout --Josie tells me--Barry (Holtz's) session at the Biennial about this; I sensed that Mort was pushing this model.) I told him that I imagined that was quite feasible, given our involvement in the GA. But I suggested that that was of limited effectiveness, because it reached 100-125 people. That alone is not sufficient to put this on the agenda of the federation world. Don said: "If someone important even waves this document at a plenary, that would accomplish a lot in putting it on the map." I repeated that I didn't think so. (After all, Shrage mentioned Sarna many times at the closing session of the Jewish education institute, and to the best of my knowledge we got not a single phone call as a result.)

He then said: Federations, bureaus, synagogues should all get it, with a letter from Ann Kaufman and/or Mort. I said we'd had a very well-crafted design to do that for CIJE, and that although I felt it was worth doing, it hardly addressed the larger strategic questions about what the federated system needed to know re this document and how best to make an effective case.

He said: "The real problem is: 1. We're not at the federation table; we're never part of the Jewish education conversation. and 2. They give us hardly any money, even though our early

childhood programs..." I began to understand that my question about getting this document to the "outside" world was a loaded one for them.

I said that both the GA and the mailing were in effect default positions and continued to ask him what he thought the optimal STRATEGY would be. He said: "That CJF acknowledge the role of JCCs in Jewish education and becomes a partner with us. Then we could do the work and create the meetings to get it across. We need the imprimatur of CJF. We're on a good track with JESNA; Allan and Jon take the train every day."

He then said: "We have to acknowledge reality. We have not been successful either at the communal level or the CJF level; we didn't succeed with COMJEE either. We feel defeated on this issue. Allan has not been able to get it on Marty's agenda. The situation between them is not resolved. We have never even had a forum at the GA."

I asked of the role of their board, where there is so much overlap, it seemed to me. Apparently, even that is not enough. He said that Art Rotman finally arrived at the position of: "Who needs them?" Don said: CJF's prevailing attitude is that they are positioning themselves as "the controlling body of North American Jewish activity: the parliament. Therefore relationships with other national agencies are control issues."

Don believes that if you put: "Mort, Ann, Allan F., Alan and maybe Seymour in a room, they could solve this problem: How to influence the system at the highest level, how to make this a national priority." I said that my understanding from working with Mort/CIJE is that if JCCA came up with a design of what they wanted to do, CIJE could be helpful in trying to implement etc. But that you still needed a plan as a starting point. Which key people did they want to reach? Could they coordinate Allan's travel schedule in organizing meetings? If they did a "show on the road," who was available on their side and how could they maximize their resources?

The bottom line, as I'm sure is clear to you by now, is that there is no design. "Moving it forward" involves huge structural positioning issues for them, which are clearly on Mort's mind as well--and not just about this document.

I then reminded him that he had mentioned a sub-group of the COMJEE II task force, headed by Linda Weinstein, which he had told us was formed to consider the same questions I was raising about the BP document for the COMJEE II document and plan. Although he had spoken of this as the starting point at our meeting, he seemed hesitant. I asked him: Could the sub-committee meet with us this summer?

What we agreed: Don will call Alan this week before Alan's return here to talk about a meeting this summer of CIJE and whoever needs to be at their table--except that Linda herself won't be in Israel (I suggested a telecon). Perhaps a meeting can move this forward in a creative way that is feasible for them and for us.

In the meantime, Barry and I have agreed that we will mail the volume, with a letter Barry has drafted from you, Alan, which I will send you shortly, to all invitees of our Board Seminar--and that you, Alan, will distribute in Israel as part of the CIJE packet and coordinate with Don (I did not mention your Israel dissemination to Don, since I thought I'd leave the final decision re Israel dissemination up to you.)

In conclusion: I met with Don for some time and really pushed him. But I don't think I can do any more. Our default options remain:

- 1. A mailing to the entire federated system. Signed by Hart; timing
- 2. A GA forum to which we invite the key people we want--with the BP volume as part of the invitation. Even if they don't come, it's a more targeted way of getting their attention. (Don did not seem to understand that the key people he wants don't often come to a forum anyway.) We could be creative and invite a couple of the wonderful JCC educators to "demonstrate" the model...
- 3. Stuffing the GA kits in addition to the forum.
- 4. Josie adds this option: Sending the federated system a letter, explaining what the volume is about and saying: "If you want a copy, please fax/write at..." Steve H. had suggested this in my post-game analysis with him last summer as one way of finding out whether people really do read these letters and respond to them.

Don did not mention any other constituencies. But to me this seems a natural for rabbis. Josie and I will finally do the complete rabbis mailing of selected names from all denominations this August, as soon as I get back from Israel. I had always intended to highlight the BP volume in the cover letter, phrased judiciously, given the rabbis' anxieties. So that is at least one other audience.

Alan, let me know what you think about any/all of the above, in light of what we're trying to accomplish.

I expect that the key contacts meetings next Tues. will at the very least yield from the staff the key educators across the country and the beginnings of key influentials. I am still negotiating with Michael P. for a morning slot on Tues. with Barry, Josie and me; after which Alan and Gail could meet with me to amplify. Josie and I do not want to cancel this another time, or we will never get a list together.

In the meantime, I have not heard a word about GA 1996. At a recent lunch, Carl seemed to say all was still on hold pending the merger decisions.

This is the traditional way to study Talmud. There is a list of people looking for "cyberhevruta" and discussing, via e-mail, the passage of the week. The interchange is forwarded to Rabbi Judith Abrams, originator of the project. Those who participate without a partner e-mail her directly. Then, each week, Rabbi Abrams prepares a digest of all these comments. with reactions and answers and she emails it out to the entire group (260 and counting).

I have met with Ruth P. to get info directly and have much of Sarah's input at this point. Now you and I need to set up a meeting to weigh some of these options--without being on the run. There are questions about to whom it should go; there are now questions in my mind about whether the Early Chlidhood volume shouldn't go separately to audiences for whom the other volume may not matter; there are logistical questions about how feasible some of her suggestions are; and there are price questions--she asked me for a price on sending 180 X 3 to the JCCA key people. If we charge her full or even partial price and she says no, we will be in the position of not sending our stuff because people aren't willing to pay for it. And that seems very short-sighted to me. I know you're running into this with the AJC people too; that is, they'll cut their order when they see what it costs--and how, ultimately, does that help us if the goal is changing culture and infusing key people with new ideas? There is no comprehensive system which exists and includes all early childhood professionals but they break down into 4 groups: 1. Synagogue, 2. JCC, 3. A few independents, 4. Day school movement. Leora Isaacs may know the number of professionals/institutions in the country.

Early childhood directors not in a position to implement change, although they should see the materials. It is the lay leaders who are in the position to implement and should receive the materials first and foremost.

Disseminating this publication is different than JCC pub because early childhood professionals are more broad based.

Best to send 2-3 copies "one for you and one for lay committee chairperson to send on your letterhead." In the cover letter, indicate the importance of giving a copy to the lay chair of the committee. It is a critical piece if the directors can then distribute it.

Distribution:

It will make more sense to JCC people with a cover letter from Ruth, who said she would like to distribute it but will find out if she can send it out, meaning if she has the budget to buy them and if this is where she would put the money.

She needs a memo from us including specific numbers for the cost of the mailing as well as for publication itself. Everyone agreed that this was a good joint project.
