Power and Powerlessness in Jewish History (#3)Stan Goldfarb (UW Professor of Pathology)

At a time of almost total breakdown in Israeli-Palestinian negotiations it seems especially timely to review the history of Jewish political and military power from antiquity to modern times and their roles in the survival of the Jewish people. This course will have a group discussion format based on the text, *Power and Powerlessness in Jewish History*, by David Biale. Participants should read chapters of the book in preparation for the weekly meeting. The first meeting will cover the material in the Introduction and Chapter I of the book. 
Jewish Holiday Foods and Their Preparation (#5) Sara Ben-Ami, Owner of B'Tayavon
