Adam, you are right on both accounts. Let me explain why. I had a conference call with several directors and early childhood professionals, we spent a lot of time discussing the responses, and if we would be able to get responses from the teachers. They though the directors would not be able to sit on the teachers and so we would not get much back. Unlike the CIJE where the surveys were given out and you waited until they finished and then collected them. They also felt that the directors had most of this info or could get or should have it.

The group also tried to focus the survey by asking what info did we need to make the case for the national community. They felt that asking info regarding the background was not really necessary, especially becuase we had the CIJE study for that info. SO they wanted to focus on salary, retention, retirement etc. They felt it was really important for the powers to be to understand that there are no potential teachers out there. If that is the case, then non Jewish teachers will be teaching in the preschools.

The first survey I thought we could send out a background piece just to teaches to reconfirm the CIJE info. I thought that would be helpful in making the case. We can still do that if you think we can just send it out and whoever responds responds.

With regard to the length, the 2nd is much shorter. today I got an email from one of the directors saying this was still too long and she would not respond to it. 

Demographics of Jewish Early Childhood Education Centers

This study surveyed 152 centers in 28 States that provide early childhood education services.
 Centers spanned the range of affiliations, including Orthodox, Conservative, Reform,
 Reconstructionist, Community/Independent, and JCC/Y's. Figure 1 shows the percentage of Jewish early childhood education programs by their affiliation.



- Figure 1 shows that Conservative, Reform and JCC/Y affiliated centers constituted approximately 75% of the sample of centers.
- The average length of time that the centers have been in operation has been approximately 27 years with a range from only a few months to a maximum of 99 years. The length of time that centers have been in operation varies by the affiliation of the center. Centers that have been in operation for the shortest amount of time are affiliated with the Reconstructionist movement (max = 26 years). Those that have been in operation for the longest periods of time are JCC/Y (max = 90 years) or those affiliated with the Conservative movement (max = 99 years).

Number of Employees

Figures x compares the total number of teachers to the total number of assistants across
affiliation. Figures x and x compare Jewish teachers and assistants to non-Jewish teachers
and assistants across center affiliations



These figures show that generally centers employ more teachers than assistants, and that in
general there are more Jewish teachers and assistants than there are non-Jewish teachers and
assistants. An exception appears to be JCC/Y centers where the number of Jewish and nonJewish assistants are almost equal.







- These figures show that the majority of children range from 2 to 4 years of age. Total Jewish enrollment also shows similar trends.


Figure x. Total 99-00 and 00-01 enrollment by affiliation

- These figures show increases in total enrollment from 99-00 to 00-01 across affiliations with the exception of a slight drop in total enrollment in the Community/Independent centers.
- In contrast, it appears that there were drops in Jewish enrollment in Conservative, Community/Independent, and JCC/Y centers, with the drop being more noticeable for the Community/Independent centers.
- Data from the 152 centers also show that the 99-00 school year average percentage of Jewish children to the total number of children in the sample was 84% and in the 00-01 school year it was 85%.
- Figures x and x show the 00-01 versus expected 01-02 total enrollment and Jewish enrollment by affiliation.












Although for the total sample, the majority of teachers range in age between 30 and 59, this trend does vary by the affiliation of the center. In particular, the survey suggests that teachers in Orthodox affiliated centers are more evenly distributed across age ranges with most teachers in their 20s.










- These figures show that the most teachers have a BA or BS along with credentials in early childhood education. Most teaching assistants, on the other hand, have a high school diploma, or a BA/BS but without credentials in early childhood education.
- Regarding before-school caregivers, most have a BA without credentials in early childhood
 education. The educational attainment levels of after-school caregivers, on the other hand,
 are more evenly distributed, yet most do not have a early childhood education credentials.






Salaries for Teachers

Salaries for teachers on 10 month contracts are given in Figure 10 below



- This figure shows that most 10 month contract teachers earn between \$10,000 and \$19,999.
 Overall, the range for most teachers is from under \$10,000 to \$29,999. Considerably fewer teachers earn more than \$30,000.
- Variation in salary ranges were found across center affiliation. In particular, Orthodox affiliated centers report relatively larger salaries while community/independent centers report a more uniform range of salaries.




Benefits for Teachers

• Figures x - x show the percentage of centers offering various benefits to their teachers.






• It is clear that most benefits are not offered to teachers regardless of the affiliation of the center. Some exceptions emerge. Most centers offer their teachers funding to attend conferences. Many centers offer health care plans to their teachers. However, with the exception of Community/Independent and JCC/Y affiliated centers, most centers do not offer benefit plans (particularly pensions and life insurance) to their teachers.




