Adam & Ellen,

Here are my comments on the Seattle Survey. I use the concepts of "community add-ons" and "anchor items", the meanings of which derive from our discussions on how to use the Module with other communities (and collect the data for a national databank). While (as you said) what we discussed may not come to pass, I needed some framework in which to assess the Seattle Survey.

PLEASE do NOT pass this on (as is) to Julie and Roberta. It's not written in a style that would be received well.

Q#1 - Reasons for Entering

- We scratched this question, so I would consider it a community add-on.

Q#2 - Career

- Agree with Adam's comments - should be as it was.

Q#3 - Satisfaction

- Should be a four point Likert scale, to be comparable to our Question #20.
- "Unimportant" is not a middle value of a Satisfaction scale, it asks a separate question.
- We had added two items to the satisfaction Question (#20) that do not appear on Seattle "Job security/tenure" and "Opportunities for career advancement".
- Q#4 Teacher Involvement
  - We scratched this question, so I would consider it a community add-on.
- Q#5 Experience
  - -Several items are left out of each category (i.e., Supervisor and Specialist in Supplementary and Day Schools, Specialist and Division Head in Camps).
  - Two categories are added: Private Tutoring & Bureau of Jewish Education. We cover private tutoring in Q#25, though we don't ask about years. THE BJE MAY BE A GOOD ADDITION TO OUR SURVEY.
  - The reason for the reduction in items may be limited space on the page.
- Q#6 General Education
  - Fine as is, except that coding will probably be a headache considering that they may have taught in several grades and many subjects over the years.
  - DO WE CARE TO DISTINGUISH BETWEEN PRIVATE AND PUBLIC SCHOOLS FOR GENERAL EDUCATION EXPERIENCE?
- Q#7 Years in Current Setting
  - Should be changed as we did in Q#4, to "working in your CURRENT

school(s)", moved to the Settings section, and asked for each
position/school.

- Q#8 Years in Community
  - Fine
- Q#9 Years in Jewish Education
  - Fine
  - WE SHOULD ADD "including this year" TO THE END OF OUR Q#6.
- Q#10 State Teaching Certificate
  - Fine community add-on. Though our Q#52 should cover this (but not necessarily as thoroughly).
- Q#11 Workshops
  - This should provide us with the same info as Q#30 and Q#31. (Note: Our Q#29 on required workshops and Q#32 on helpfulness of workshops is missing.)
  - BUT, there should be at least 10 spaces, since 10% of the educators in the 3 lead communities indicated that the had taken 10 workshops
  - Concern about completion: Will they remember the topics that they took over the last two years, especially if they took them at conferences like CAJE? If they don't remember what it was about will they just choose NOT to indicate it?
  - Concern about analysis: What constitutes Jewish or pedagogical content? If they spend 5 minutes out of an hour on pedagogy does that count?

TYPO: According to the instructions, the fourth box on the top should read "Pedagogical [teaching] content?".

- Q#12 College or University Courses
  - We scratched this one community add-on.
  - Same concerns as with Seattle Q#11.
- Q#13 Working on Degree/Certificate
  - We ask about degree in Q#51. BUT Seattle's version may be too specific. What about degrees in education OR Jewish studies?
  - On certification, we don't ask community add-on.
  - TYPO: Item "d" should read "A certificate in general education".
- Q#14 Maintain State Certification
  - Community add-on.
  - Suggestion: Should read "courses or workshops", assuming the state certification allows for approved workshops.
- Q#15 Good Workshops
  - -SUGGEST ADDING THIS TO OUR SURVEY. WHILE OUR Q#33 ADDRESSES THIS ISSUE, IT IS FROM A DIFFERENT PERSPECTIVE.
  - Concern with completeness of the question: the items are not exclusive of each other (e.g., d, f and j, etc.), and many possible items are missing (e.g., the timing and the place of the workshop, the excitement or skills of the instructor, creating materials I can leave with, etc.).
- Q#16- Informal Study
- Similar to our Q#34. Coupled with Seattle Q#12, it should yield the similar information. (Only missing a private Hebrew study group.)

- Q#17 Hebrew Proficiency
  - Obviously, I like the four items.
  - The four point Likert Scale and the descriptions we used are probably better. (What does "proficient" mean to an educator?)
- 0#18 Skills Desired
  - A few items are missing from the Seattle that we had in the Educators Survey or added to it for principals (i.e., Child Development, Educational Leadership, School Administration, Staff Development, and the 2nd half of Curriculum and Program Development). Seattle added a couple of items (i.e., Working with Supervisor, Helping special needs kids).
  - IF any questions should NOT be considered as "anchor items", I think this one (and the next) should not be an anchor item. Thus, the differences between Seattle and ours should be fine.
- Q#19 Knowledge Desired
  - Slight changes item "e" now includes Midrash; we added in "Jewish Thought", and a couple of items are worded differently.
  - DITTO my suggestion for Q#18: IF any questions should NOT be considered as "anchor items", I think this one should not be an anchor item. Thus, the differences between Seattle and ours should be fine.
- Q#20 Teaching Skills Desired
  - -Interesting distinction, but will teachers make a distinction between this and Q#19?
  - -Regardless of what we asked in our Q#33 (encouragements to take more workshops), have we not been under the assumption that the Jewish content areas in which teachers want to increase their knowledge are those areas that will help them in their teaching? Should we re-examine this assumption or does it not really matter (if we assume this NOT to be an anchor item)?
  - Not an anchor item? Community add-on?
- Q#21 # of positions
  - Needs to be changed to "In how many Jewish SCHOOLS...". (This change would be in line with our survey and the following questions on the Seattle survey.)
- Q#22 Suitable Wage
  - Fine.
- Q#23 Nature of Position
  - Change from "school(s)" to "position(s)"!
  - Combines our Qs #3, #10, and #12. Also adds a part on "Weeks/Year".
  - The "Title" part may be problematic, if it doesn't provide the "role" info we request on Q#10.
  - VERY IMPORTANT: There are NO instructions about having the first position be the one with the greatest amount of hours! As you will note below, they only ask the setting questions for the "FIRST POSITION"!
- Q#24 Tutor privately
  - -Fine, we ask it as part of Q#25.
- Q#25 Position Affiliation
  - Do "positions" have affiliations? Otherwise, same as our Q#7.

Q#26 - Type of Setting
- Different wording, but same as our Q#9.

Q#27 - Subjects

- Judaica is not separated into "in English" and "in Hebrew".

- Doesn't include "Integrated kindergarten/pre-school curriculum".

Q#28 - Curriculum

- Community add-on (good question).

Q#29 - Like to Work Full-time

-The instructions are contradicted by the inclusion of item "c". We avoided this by asking two separate questions.

- We changed this question to deal with "working more hours".

Q#30- How found position

- Left out "national professional association" and changed "graduate school placement" to "through college placement or professor". However, less than half a percent had selected these items in the three lead communities.

- HOWEVER, they ONLY ask about the FIRST position, and this may NOT be the one in which they work the MOST HOURS!

Q#31 - Help and Support

- Missing several items, most notably "Teacher resource center" and "Central agency staff".

- DITTO: only ask about 1st position (not necessarily the one with more hours).

Q#32 - Decision to work at particular school

- Missing several items, all of which we had added.

- To be in line with previous questions, it should read "in your first position", not "in your first school or program".

- DITTO: only ask about 1st position (not necessarily the one with more hours).

Q#33 - Encourage to Full-time

- Out of order, should be near their Q#29.

- Seattle survey drops "More Resources at Work" , and keeps all the other items which we deleted.

- We changed this question to deal with "working more hours".

Q#34 - Benefits

- Seattle survey drops "Disability benefits", and adds "Employer contribution to a dental plan" and "Maternity or paternity leave". - We probably need to decide which ITEMS in this Question are

ANCHOR ITEMS.

- Concern with completion and analysis: Seattle survey doesn't refer to any particular position. What if a teacher receives it in one position and not another? If they want teachers to answer for the sum total (that is, if they receive it at any school), this needs to be indicated.

- We added the category of "Not Available", so as to avoid confusing missing responses with not being available.

Q#35- Jewish?

- We had decided to take out the "Convert" item, as it is not in line with Jewish values to ask that.

Q#36 - Personal Affiliation

- We had replaced "Secular" with "Unaffiliated".
- Q#37 Synagogue Member Fine.
- Q#38 Teach in Synagogue Should not have a Question number (as done in the next two).
- Q#39 Been to Israel Added "How many times?
- Q#40 Been to Israel for over 3 months Should be part of Q#39.
  - Wording has been changed from "live" to "resided". What if you wandered from place to place for three months or more?
- Q#41- Camp - Fine.
- Q#42 Before 13
   - Fine. To note: changed wording on item "b" and added "preschool".
- Q#43 After 13 Fine. To note: separate items for "Day school" and "yeshiva".
- Q#44 Age - Fine
- Q#45- Country of Birth Fine
- Q#46 Marital Status - Fine
- Q#47 Spouse - Fine
- Q#49 Family Income - Seattle's goes lower to "Below \$15,000". WE MAY WANT TO CONSIDER DOING THE SAME.
- Q#50 Importance of Income from Jewish Education
   Needs to be changed to "from your work in Jewish schools", as we did.
- Q#51 Highest Level of Education Fine.
- Q#52 Rabbinical Smichah? Fine
- Q#53 What degrees - Fine, except it will have the same coding difficulties as on our original survey.

- Q#54 Courses
  - Fine, except will probably have the same high level of missing responses (69% or more). The problem is distinguishing between those who don't answer the question because they didn't take any courses in that area and those who simply don't answer.
- Q#55 Professional License
  -Fine, but wording changes to eliminate "certification". Also, doesn't include our additions about from where?
- Q#56 Interested in Certification - Fine, but the word "certification" is back and "license" is not used.
- Q#57 Future Plans
   As with our original survey, many of these items overlap. Though
  the additional items make it even more problematic. For example,
  the relationship of a, b, and c are unclear; d and e overlap; l
  overlaps with d, f, g, and h; and k overlaps with almost all of
  them.

The following questions are missing from the Seattle survey (Q#s are from our survey) -

- Number of students in each school (Q#8)
- All setting questions that ask for information on the second school (except for role/title, hours, grade level, subjects, affiliation, and type of setting) (Q#s 13 through 17)
- Are you a full-time Jewish educator (Q#21)
- Prefer to work more hours in one or several schools (Q#23)
- Work in informal settings (Q#25) this is a totally new question on our survey
- Required workshops (Q#29)
- Helpfulness of workshops (Q#32)
- Encouragements to professional training (Q#33) this is a totally new question on our survey
- Adequacy of professional training opportunities (Q#38)
- Religious Observance (Q#42)
- Synagogue Attendance (Q#43)
- Youth Group (Q#48) this is a totally new question on our survey
- Yeshiva after 18 (Q#49) this is a totally new question on our survey
- Currently Enrolled in Degree Program (Q#51) this is a totally new question on our survey
- Sex (Q#54)
- Positions outside of Jewish education (Q#60) this is a totally new question on our survey

In summary, the MOST significant (though not the only important) differences between our survey and the Seattle survey in the forming of questions are (Q#'s are Seattle's)

- Q#2 changes to options on Career?
- on Q#30, 31, 32, and 34 these setting questions do not ask about a second setting, and Q#23 does NOT ask them to have the first setting be where they teach the most hours.
- Q#34 on benefits, "disability benefits" is replaced with "maternity or paternity leave".
- Q#57 on Future Plans contains too much overlap among the items

In summary, the most significant omissions of whole questions are (Q#'s are ours)

- Required workshops (Q#29)

- Religious Observance (Q#42)

- Synagogue Attendance (Q#43)

- Sex (Q#54)

Of course, these judgements depend on what we consider the "anchor items" to be.

In summary, based on the Seattle survey, I suggest we consider the following:

1. Add the BJE item to our Q#26 on experience (if the space is available

- if not, we may want to consider combining other items).

2. Do we want to distinguish between private and public schools in regards to experience in general education (Q#27)?

3. Add "including this year" to the end of Q#6 on years in Jewish education.

4. Add Seattle question on qualities of good workshops (their Q#15) to our survey. Perhaps, replace our question #32 (on workshop helpfulness) with this question.

5. On Total Family Income (Q#58), extend the range downward so that the

lowest is "Below \$15,000".

I didn't get to Seattle's Educational Leaders survey, yet. Bill

Here are my comments on Seattle's EDUCATIONAL DIRECTORS survey. I only went through this BRIEFLY, focusing on those questions which are in addition to the ones included in the educators survey. Thus, most of my comments on Seattle's' educators survey applies to this one as well.

- 1. Our questions #3 & #4 have been collapsed into Seattle's Q#4. Many of the items have been eliminated (especially in regard to lay leaders). In their place are two items on educational directors interactions with colleagues outside their school. Also, the term "teachers" is used instead of "staff members / teachers".
- 2. Seattle Q#33 (enhancing overall effectiveness) adds the item "additional professional development opportunities".
- 3. Seattle Q#36 (time spent on...) adds the item "working with school committees and boards".
- It ALSO changes the question to a three point Likert scale and (slightly) the nature of the question by asking about "too much time, etc", as opposed to "Satisfied, etc.". The judgement as to what the "right amount" of time is may be different from being "satisfied/unsatisfied" with either having to spend that much time or only having that little amount of time to spend on the activity in question.
- 4. Our Questions #5 (on regard for Jewish education), #13 (reasons for professional development), #18 (assessment of opportunites for teacher professional growth), and #26 (on Rabbi's or supervisor's involvment) are omitted.

Again, most comments made on Seattle's educator survey apply here. For instance, questions on required # of workshops, religious observance, synagogue attendance and sex are omitted.

Subj: my comments on Seattle Questionnaires:additions and emphases to Bill's

Comments on Seattle Questionnaire:

After looking at the Seattle Questionnaire, I basically felt it is just a different questionnaire with different emphases than ours.

My general comments is that their questionnaire is very difficult to answer, and will be even more difficult to code and use. If these questionnaires are going to be used again then we really need to worry about compatibility.

First, I'm going to focus on a few things they did that we should incorporate:

n their directions, when appropriate, asking for number of years they say, "including this year". I think that is a good idea and helps clarify and put everyone in the same mindset. We should incorporate this in all questions where appropriate.

On our question 26, for Preschool, we should add Jewish Preschool, also do we want to add the category Bureau of Jewish Education, as they did?

We don't ask if the educators are currently working on a certificate (their question 13, see our q. 51). We don't ask their question 14, which I also think is good, I would incorporate both of these.

We don't ask what they like about workshops or courses (their quest. in 15), although I do not think it is crucial and worth the added length, I'm not sure how useful this would be for change. We could ask Gail and Barry if they like this question, or our question about helpfulness of workshops.

Something to think about, they added q. 20, which is teaching skills in the content areas? I'm not sure this level of detail is crucial and will really be different from their Q. 19.

Added to list of benefits: dental and maternity/paternity leave? I'm not sure how important they are.

Do we want to ask how many times the educator has been to Israel? (their q. 39)

Other feedback on their questions: (I will try not to repeat what Bill said so just highlight the issues that I would emphasize:)

I worry about the length, for example, Q. 3 is a very long list, we cut many of the se.

- Q. 4 I would advise against a 5 point scale, too many people tend to be "neutral".
- Q. 8 We changed the wording a bit for clarity, working in Jewish Education in this community...
- Q 10 A typo, word "check" is missing. Again, I'm not sure this level of detail is important (unless there is some specific reason the community wants it).
- 11-12 I feel pretty strongly that these questions are extremely difficult to answer, extremely difficult to code and analyze. The stem is too ambiguous  $\frac{1}{2}$

to know what "relevant to your work" would mean, so someone may have a shorter or longer list depending on interpretation, in addition, what is a course, compared to a workshop, how many credits is a course? etc.

- 16 I do not like this question, or should I say, it isn't worth the added space (it is like motherhood and apple pie).
- 26. I'm not sure of the terms 2-4 day RELIGIOUS school, some denominations never use that terms, I would delete.
- 27. They do not have our addition of integrated pre-or k
- 31. They may want to expand this list
- 34. I strongly suggest they include a specific response, "Not Available" so they know how to code missing versus not available
- 53. I like our framework for asking respondents for degrees/majors.
- 54. Again, I question the usefulness of this type of information, what is a course? 1 credit, no credit, it seems they also have covered this previously.
- 57. This is also very difficult to respond to, there are overlapping responses and dist inctions are very vague.

I worry more about questions we include that they do not: Especially: required workshops, emphases on our survey of second schools (benefits, etc), our q. 25- work in informal education,

our q. 38-adequacy of in-service,

our q. 49-attending Yeshiva,

our q. 60-other employment activities

Seattle Ed. Leaders Survey Additional Comments to Bill's:

If they are keeping q. 13, they should include, "A degree in school administration/leadership/supervision," and "A certificate in administration/supervision".

Similarly, missing reference to administration/leadership in their Q. 57.
