As this is my first bulletin article as president of the congregation, I have decided to use the opportunity to write about other "firsts" specifically, BJBE "firsts."

The first rabbi of BJBE was Rabbi Mark Shapiro. That simple fact is the reason for both the growth of this congregation as well as my own personal growth as a Jew. I hope that whatever I may do for this congregation as its president will bring Rabbi Shapiro the satisfaction that comes to a master teacher from the performance of one of his students.

The first woman president of BJBE was Zelda Wise. The manner by which Zelda led the congregation in her tenure serves as a model for her successors, male and female alike. Her skills and devotion to the Reform movement brought further honor to her congregation and to herself when she was elected to the office of president of the Great Lakes Region of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations. Personally, I am honored to follow this most able and committed friend and hope to maintain the high standards she has set.

The first Trustee for Life of BJBE was Valerie Rabin. When my family joined the congregation 25 years ago, she and Leon were the "mother and father" of BJBE. As president, Leon led us through our years of major development and Val was right there with him. To this day, Val remains an active member of the Board of Trustees, one whose wisdom and judgement have increased with the years. I hope Val will provide me with the reality check that she has given to my able predecessors and that my service will bring her pleasure as one of her and Leon's "kids."

The first female rabbi at BJBE will be Rabbi Amy Memis. Rabbi Memis brings to our congregation a sense of purpose and dedication, gentle strength and clear thinking. Having met Rabbi Memis when she was beginning her rabbinic studies in Jerusalem, I now look forward to having her as my rabbi. We share a deep loyalty to Israel, as well as to congregational Judaism. I am pleased to be sharing my first year as president of BJBE with Rabbi Memis in her first year as rabbi of BJBE. May she go from strength to strength.

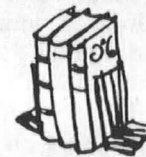
An Open Invitation

Be a Platelet Apheresis Blood Donor

Help extend the life of cancer patients

Each year, cancer patients' lives are lengthened from platelet apheresis donations made by generous residents in the community. Last year, 926 transfusions -- made possible by 326 donors -- helped cancer patients in desperate need of healthy blood. This year, however, even more donors are needed.

Frequently, cancer patients require platelet transfusion -- a special type of blood donation -- as a result of blood loss during surgery or the after effects of chemotherapy which blocks platelet formation. "Apheresis" is a method that allows doctors to collect platelets from a single donor, thus decreasing the risk of complications for cancer patients who otherwise would receive transfusions from multiple donors.

Since the procedure is more time consuming than traditional blood donation, apheresis volunteers receive free parking and a free lunch pass to the hospital's cafeteria. In addition, volunteers can choose from an assortment of videos to watch during the procedure. Much like regular blood donation, Platelet Apheresis is a safe procedure, which greatly benefits cancer patients. The entire procedure, including screening and a snack at the end, takes approximately 1½ hours.
