FROM THE PRESIDENT

In my article in last month's Bulletin, I noted that I saw as one of the priorities for the coming year the creating of a greater sense of community in the Congregation by offering more social, educational, and religious activities and by involving more members in the process of planning and carrying out these activities. Accordingly, the Board of Trustees is presently in the process of appointing a number of committees that will be charged with the responsibility of setting goals and objectives for their particular areas and then formulating plans for the implementation of those goals and objectives.

Among the committees we would like to see in operation are:

Cemetery -- responsible for the oversight of the cemetery, the enforcement of the Temple's by-laws, the management of cemetery funds, and liaison with Wyuka Cemetery.

Membership -- responsible for contacting and recruiting new members, introducing new members into the Temple family, and creating a brochure outlining the Temple's programs for prospective members.

House -- responsible for the upkeep of the building and grounds and recommending policies to the Board regarding the use of the building.

Religious School -- responsible for the setting of policy regarding the administration of the programs of youth education in the Congregation, formulating rules and regulations for the Religious and Hebrew schools, and setting standards for various levels of educational achievement.

Social Action -- responsible for leading the Congregation in areas of concern to Jews and non-Jewish alike, bringing the Temple into an activist role in local charitable activities, and for educating the membership in various local, national, and worldwide Jewish causes.

Social -- responsible for planning social activities for the Congregation such as pot luck suppers or cocktail parties.

Program -- responsible for planning special cultural and educational activities such as speakers and concerts.

Youth -- responsible for helping the Temple's youth groups with planning and coordinating their activities.

Outreach -- responsible for creating a welcoming atmosphere for mixed marned couples and for others who are developing a relationship with the Jewish religion.

Inreach -- responsible for creating a welcoming atmosphere for Temple members who are no longer as active in the Congregation as they once were.

Mitzvah -- responsible for mobilizing the Congregation when Temple members have special needs, for instance, when there has been a death in the family.

Ways and Means -- responsible for raising additional funds for the Congregation through fund raising activities and the seeking of grants.

Capital Funds -- responsible for the oversight of the Congregation's capital funds, assuring that the funds are invested in ways that make the most productive use of the Congregation's capital resources.

SHALOM FROM HASTINGS

Marsha had the privilege of writing the first column entitled "Shalom From Hastings", so it is only fair that I take the time and effort to author the second.

At the Annual Meeting I issued the challenge to the Temple Membership to attend at least one Friday night service each month, and we (Marsha and I) would do the same by making a 200 mile round trip. We kept this promise by attending services on June 18th. We missed having Cantor Michael, however, President Alan Frank and Joe Eisenberg did a fine job conducting services in the Cantor's absence.

During the Easter/Passover season, we read an article in the Hastings Tribune based on a sermon delivered by a local minister with the headline of "Jews Killed Jesus Christ". After thinking of what might be done, Bob contacted the Hastings Tribune editor and Rabbi Sidney Brooks of Omaha. Brooks arranged for an Omaha minister to contact the Hastings minister. Although we cannot rewrite 2000 years of history, we did manage to have explained the Jewish point of view by those who are professionals.




