Pre-Slichot Concert and Service
On Saturday evening, September 7th, we will hold our Slichot Service in preparation for the High Holy Days. This beautiful service, which sets the mood for the penitential season, will be conducted by Rabbi Brickman and Cantor Leuchter, who will be accompanied on the organ by Mark Violette.

The service will be preceded by a social hour and a special musical program beginning at 8:30 p.m. The musical prelude to our Slichot Service will feature violinist Deborah Strauss and guitarist, mandolinist and singer Jeff Warschauer. Drawing from the rich repertoire of klezmer instrumental music and Yiddish song, they will present a program geared to the special mood of the High Holy Day Season. Deborah Strauss is one of the leading practitioners of traditional Jewish violin style today. Jeff Warschauer is known internationally as one of the foremost exponents of the klezmer mandolin, as a unique innovator in the development of an authentic klezmer guitar style and as an expressive Yiddish singer. Both performers were featured in the PBS documentary, Itzhak Perlman: In the Fiddler's House.

We are certain that you will not want to miss this special musical prelude to our Slichot Service and the service, itself, both of which are sure to help us prepare for the coming Days of Awe.
