CHANUKAH
The lighting of the menorah is a special family time, enjoyed by children of all ages. Excitement mounts as the family gathers, the colored candles are selected and the menorahs are set up. We can bring the beauty of Chanukah into our homes in a variety of ways.

*Make sure that we, as parents and grandparents, know enough about the holiday to pass on meaningful

information to the children.

*Tell the children the story of Chanukah with as much excitement as you would a new library book. Certainly it is an action-packed, suspense-filled drama--happy ending and all.

*Make sure that the time devoted to candle-lighting is really family time and not rushed.

*Learn and sing some of the simple, traditional Chanukah songs to sing after the candles are lit.

*Let the children choose the candles and place them in the correct places

in menorah.

*Consider a menorah for each person, including the children. Multiple menorahs make quite an impressive display when lit. Try using homemade menorahs.

*Involve the family in preparing latkes(potato pancakes). Anything cooked in oil is reminiscent of the miracle of the oil in the menorah in

the holy Temple in Jerusalem. Remember, the struggle to Jewish tradition alive amidst the presence of a larger, outside culture is as old as Chanukah itself. Were not the Maccabees trying to do the same thing? So you are in good company! Happy Chanukah!
