You may remember that the 33rd World Zionist Congress in 1997 was a complete success for our Reform Movement. We accomplished what we set out to do. ARZA stunned the Jewish world by receiving almost 50% of the total vote. Together the non-Orthodox movements reaped close to 75% of the entire American delegation. This constituted a huge victory for the forces of pluralism. Never before had the WZO voiced its support for pluralism in such vigorous terms. Moreover our Movement gained seats in key financial allocation areas, resulting in millions of dollars in increased funding for our Movement's programs in Israel. We need to continue to express the Reform Movement's permanent and powerful support for the people and the state of Israel. We need you because another smashing victory will ensure that the Israeli Reform Movement will have enough funds for future programs. We have earned and won a seat at the table. We assumed the heavy responsibilities of leadership. We have crafted a new Zionism for the new Zionist century.
