"Postmodern Jews & Our Premodern Past: What Do our Classical Sources still have to Teach us?" Dr. Alyssa Gray, Ph.D.

Judaism is a religion with a long history throughout which the texts of our tradition have been essential in determining what we believe and how we practice our faith. Can those texts still speak to us today? Or are they a relic of our distant past? Come meet one of the young, up and coming scholars in the field of Jewish textual study and one of the few women teaching in this field and hear what she thinks.

Alyssa Gray is Assistant Professor of Codes and Responsa Literature at the Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion in New York. She holds a Ph.D. in Talmud and Rabbinics from the Jewish Theological Seminary of America, from which she also received her M.Phil. and B.A. degrees. Dr. Gray also holds law degrees from Columbia University and the Hebrew University Faculty of Law, as well as a B.A. from Barnard College. The author of several articles on Talmud and Medieval Jewish Law, Dr. Gray is currently working on a book about the literary relationship between the Babylonian and Jerusalem Talmuds. She has lecture widely in the areas of Jewish law, legal thought and Talmud. RE: UAHC Israel Relief Fund

"What can I do, now, to help the people of Israel?"

That is the question is on everyone's lips as we watch the unfolding of events in the land of Israel. The continuing violence touches all of us, and, we feel an urgent need to find ways to respond, to reach out to our Israeli family, to help in this time of need.

Over the past few days we have been consulting with the leaders of Israel's social service, medical, and relief agencies as well as the leadership of the Israeli Reform Movement. We heard about the critical need to help the families of those personally affected by the violence as well as the wider circle of Israelis whose lives have been disrupted. We are therefore establishing the UAHC Israel Relief Fund to raise funds for the following purposes:

- Relief for the victims and their families: Tragically, the number of people directly affected by the suicide bombers and other terrorist attacks continues to increase. We have identified a number of Israeli organizations that are providing assistance to these families to which we will channel contributions.
- Emergency medical equipment and supplies: The violence has put an enormous burden on Israel's medical system, and Magen David Adom and other emergency response agencies are in dire need of sophisticated equipment supplies and additional ambulances.
- Support for children and the elderly: We know that children and the elderly are particularly
 vulnerable during this crisis and are in need of psychological counseling, assistance in getting
 food and other necessities, and other social services.

I ask your help in letting the members of your congregation know about this fund, and I thank you in advance for what you do to help. As was the case in the September 11 Disaster Relief Fund, we will give a detailed report as to how the funds donated to the UAHC Israel Relief Fund are distributed.
