RABBINIC REFLECTIONS

Last month, a news story appeared on CNN that was so shocking and unbelievable that I checked other news sources to see if it was correct. It was, to say the least, under reported in other news outlets; yet it was worthy of being decidedly more publicized. Unfortunately, the Paula Abdul scandal and the "Runaway Bride" were deemed more newsworthy and consequently received more press. This under reported story detailed disturbing events that transpired in a Baptist church located in North Carolina.

Chan Chandler, the minister of this church, declared to his congregation that anyone who was a Democrat and voted for John Kerry could not attend the church anymore. He publicly expelled a number of those in his congregation who were known Democrats and forty others left in protest. Furthermore, Minister Chandlef sanctioned guards to stand outside the church to keep out known Democrats.

The ludicrousness of this story belies all rational understanding not only of the separation between church and state but of the essence of our democracy. The minister justified his decision, which was astonishingly countenanced by various church officials, by stating that John Kerry and the Democratic Party were at odds with the basic belief system of this Baptist church, especially on the issue of abortion. Therefore, congregants who ascribe to political beliefs that are contrary to the theological tenets of this Baptist church cannot be members. The minister felt that the very presence of Democrats in the pews was disingenuous to the Church's teachings.

While one is initially shocked by reading such a story or seeing the video, in time the facts of the story become plausible. In retrospect, this event in North Carolina is a natural occurrence since our nation has one political party that makes no pretense about favoring one religious ideology above all others. In this theologically induced political climate, it follows that eventually the separation between church and state will become indistinct and then nonexistent.

How the Democratic Party could be antithetical to the basic theological rubrics of this Baptist church or any other church or place of worship eludes me. After all, the Democratic Party is a political entity, not a theological one; as such, it ascribes to many beliefs that are or are not in concert with one's personal religious beliefs. But then again, during the election many thousands of pamphlets were distributed throughout the South and Midwest that stated categorically that if John Kerry were elected he would ban the Bible. Even though you have to be quite naive or downright stupid to believe that John Kerry or anyone else in this nation would ban the Bible, still, according to recent polling, many throughout those areas did believe this scurrilous propaganda.

I often go back to our Jewish tradition to find some reference point when hearing such nonsense. Historically, the Jewish people have always abhorred dogma. Throughout the millennia, there have been many great rabbis and Jewish thinkers who have tried to set a formalized dogma for the belief system of Judaism. All attempts at this, including Maimonides' thirteen articles of faith, were rejected.

The Jewish community recognized that a formalized creed would hamper creative growth and the evolution of our basic belief system. Yet, when we read a story of a pastor expelling church members for their political beliefs, we conclude that pos-

sibly the Jewish people rejected a formalized doctrine because such an inflexible set of beliefs would ultimately segregate and ostracize those who had a different but acceptable understanding of the tradition.

Once you have a dogmatic system of spiritual principles, you limit the thinking of your constituents to the parameters of that creed and, therefore isolate those who do not accept it wholeheartedly. Therefore, it is a very small leap of logic to institute a dogma on a religious level and then measure it against political views. When the political and theological are intertwined, one does not know when a religious belief system ends and a political one begins.

Throughout the millennia, the Jewish people has been frightened of this worst case scenario. One of the reasons Spinoza was excommunicated was because he was so against the co-mingling of church and state. He saw the dangers that could ensue when religious and political beliefs coalesce on too many issues. Even though Judaism in the 17th century did not

have a set catechism, still Spinoza was concerned that an effort to form a steadfast dogma could finally arise within the Jewish community. He saw Medieval Europe as having a long history of blurring church and secular beliefs and the horrors that ensued from that development.

The minister of this Baptist church was eventually dismissed. Yet, we hope that what happened in North Carolina will not become paradigmatic for the rest of the country. Because, even though at first blush it does not affect the Jewish community, such inflexible and authoritarian actions affect us all in a pluralistic society.

We trust that this is an isolated event and that it does not become the norm for the evangelical community. We all live in the same country and must be tolerant of each other's political persuasions especially in a sacred community of worship. As Abraham Lincoln once remarked, "I am not concerned if God is on my side, I am concerned if I am on God's side."

I recently realized that this is my last Presidents Message in the Har Sinai Bulletin. The two years of my term have seemed to fly by.

There is the perception that serving as President of a temple is a thankless job. Nothing could be farther from the truth. I was able to serve alongside two gifted clergymen, Rabbi Pollack and Cantor Wisnia. They taught me a great deal and were always patient with me as I learned. They are both driven by the desire to enhance the Jewish experience of our members. Their positions are not just "jobs" to them, they are serving a higher purpose and we are fortunate to have them both as our spiritual leaders.

Our talented educator, Magda Reyes, keeps our religious school running smoothly, which made my job easier. She is always open to try new programs or ideas to keep our students interested and enhance their learning experience.

Our administrator, Laura Reiser, is always willing to share her knowledge of Temple operations, knows everybody, and helps us remember and learn from our past successes so our events are built on a stronger foundation. She and Peggy keep our office running efficiently.

Michael continually goes above and beyond the call of duty

to see that our events are set up properly, no matter how tight the schedule. Michael, along with his assistants John and Joe give a warm and sincere welcome to everyone who passes through our doors.

I am grateful to our hard working Executive Committee and Board of Trustees who, upon the recommendations of our dedicated committee participants, make the decisions that set the direction of our Temple and keep us on course.

In my acceptance address, I indicated that I would measure my success by your participation. I guess I set the bar pretty high. Not everyone got involved, but a lot of you did. That just means that even though I am stepping down as President, my work is not done. Do you remember the feeling you get when you read a great book and you want to share it with those you care about? That's how I feel about working at Har Sinai. It's just a matter of convincing those I care about (my fellow Temple members) that they would get gratification from volunteer work as I have. Participation in our Youth Groups is improving and Renaissance and Sisterhood produce one winning event after another. Gentlemen, I'll be calling on you soon to get our Men's Club back on track.

Personally, after marrying Laurie, raising two wonderful daughters and building a successful business, serving as President of Har Sinai has been one of the best things to happen to me. I couldn't have done it without you. Under Marilyn Weinstein's leadership we can look forward to continued growth and a thriving Har Sinai Jewish community together. Don't ever forget that "Everything at Har Sinai is better when you are here."
