A Service of Honor

Friday Evening, May 15th, at 8:15, a Special Late Sabbath Eve Service will be held in the Temple. (The usual 5:30 Vesper Services will also be held.) The late Service will be in honor of our Young Men now in Uniform, and also of Veterans of the First World War, whose names are recorded on the Bronze Tablet in the Temple Entrance. We trust also that families with sons or relatives in the armed forces of our country will make sure that we have the full information for which we have asked. They are especially invited to be present with us at these Patriotic Sabbath Eve Services. The new stars on our Temple Service Flag will be dedicated, and the Order of Music will include numbers of a patriotic character.
