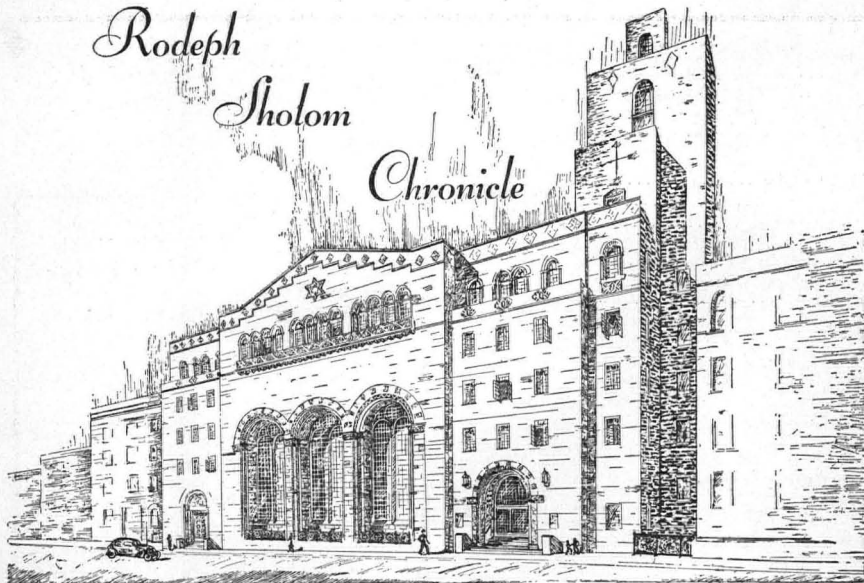

The purpose of USO was defined by the President when he said: "We must preserve for our men in the service, wherever they may be and without regard to race, creed or color, the moral and spiritual values of democratic ideals and freedoms for which they are now fighting."

Mr. Felix Greenhut and Mrs. Nathan Goldmann, Co-Chairmen of the USO Affairs trust that our Congregants and their friends will come in even larger numbers than last year. Make up your own tables and parties in the Marcus Loew Auditorium or other rooms of the Temple House.

The Committee consists of representatives of the Temple Auxiliaries, including the Sisterhood, Men's Association, Parent-Teachers Association, Temple Guild for Married Couples, the Rodeph Shalom League and the Rudolph Grossman Society.

Sisterhood Pledge Luncheon

The Sisterhood is again planning to hold a Pledge Luncheon early in December. This year there will be TWO awards, each being a \$25.00 United States Treasury Bond. Any woman filling a Seven-and-a-half Dollar Pledge Book (30 shares at 25 cents each) is entitled to come to the Luncheon, and the entire proceeds will be devoted to the Sisterhood's Social Service and Defense Activities.

Confirmation Party

This Saturday evening, May 23rd, the Party and Dance for the Confirmation Class and their friends, and for the Post-Graduate Department and their friends will be held in the Marcus Loew Auditorium. A Committee of the Parents are cooperating in arrangements for the Affair. The Board of Trustees has donated to each Confirmation a copy of the Bible, inscribed with the Confirmation's name.

A Citation

Brown University has conferred upon our Rabbi the Honorary Degree of Doctor of Divinity. The award was made at the 174th Commencement at the First Baptist Meeting House, Providence, Rhode Island, Monday, May 18th. President Henry M. Wriston, in awarding the Degree to Rabbi Newman, said in his citation:

"The world, richly endowed with material things, squanders even those in war for want of spiritual resources equal to its responsibilities. Because in a time of moral confusion you have been steadfast in faith, because you have uplifted the hearts of men and fortified their spirits, your Alma Mater delights to honor you."

Other recipients of Honorary Degrees on Monday were Vice-Admiral H. E. Yarnell, U.S.N., retired; Hamilton F. Armstrong, editor of "Foreign Affairs;" Quentin Reynolds, author and foreign correspondent; Simeon Strunsky, "New York Times" columnist; and Arthur F. Buddington of Princeton, geologist.
