# MEN IN SERVICE

During the course of the year, plans will be made to erect a Plaque in honor of the men and women in Rodeph Sholom families who have been enrolled in the Armed Forces of our country. Provision will also be made for commemoration of the fifteen young men in the orbit of our Temple who have given their life in Service. In order that our Rodeph Sholom Roster may be complete and accurate, we urge our Congregants to cooperate in submitting names of members of their family who have served in any branch of our republic's war effort, in the event that this information has not already been furnished us. These names can be given to Mrs. Philip M. Stern or Mr. Max Feder, our Executive Secretary, in the Temple Office. Rabbi Newman will be pleased to receive any information regarding awards, citations or other data which may be recorded in the War annals of the Congregation; letters dealing with experiences of Jewish and religious interest will also be most welcome, so that the already extensive files we now possess may be augmented.

# OUR THANKSGIVING SERVICES

Sunday Morning, August 19th, at 10:30 o'clock, Special Services of Thanksgiving in accordance with the proclamation of President Truman were held in the Temple. The sermon was preached by our Rabbi; Mr. Geller was at the organ, and the music was rendered by Mr. Igo Guttman, soloist. A great throng was present to offer prayers of gratitude to the Almighty for the victorious end of the Second World War. A special Order of Services was prepared by our Rabbi, copies of which are available in mimeographed form on written application. It is hoped that a later issue of our "Chronicle" will carry the text of the V-J prayer for the occasion.

### OUR RELIGIOUS SCHOOL

Mr. Benjamin Sellinger, head of the Department of Social Sciences at the New York School of Science has been chosen as the new Principal of our Religious School to succeed Mr. Julius C. Gluck, who, after twenty-five years of service, resigned last Spring. On the morning of Sunday, September 30th, formal Exercises will mark the opening of our School, in connection with our Sukkoth Services. Mr. Sellinger will then be introduced to the parents and the children. In the meantime, Mr. Sellinger can be seen at our School Office by any Temple families who wish to discuss school matters with him. New registrants for our Temple School may enroll daily through the Office of our Executive Secretary, Mr. Max Feder. Prospective pupils must be accompanied by a parent. Former students are asked to register on Sunday mornings, September 23rd and 30th, or before, if desired. Monday, September 17th, at 1:15 Yom Kippur Services for Religious School Pupils and young people will be held in the Marcus Loew Auditorium.

We deeply regret our inability to provide facilities for worship in the main Temple during the High Holydays for the multitudes who have applied to us in writing, by telephone and in person. The accommodations of our Temple auditorium are necessarily limited, and we have had a long waiting list since last Spring. As opportunity permits, we endeavor to take care of those who are registered on this waiting list, but such opportunities are infrequent. We are seeking to direct applicants to the Amplified Auxiliary Services in the Marcus Loew Auditorium pending the time when we can in the future make adequate provision at the High Holydays for all who wish to worship with us. We have sought to explain this condition to those who have communicated with us, and we trust that this statement will further clarify the matter. In the meantime we trust that our friends and well-wishers will identify themselves with Rodeph Sholom as Associate Congregants, that they will send their children to our Religious School, that they will attend our Sabbath and other Services throughout the year, that they will participate in our activities, and in every way regard themselves as adherents of Rodeph Sholom.
