RECEPTION TO NEW CONGREGANTS

The Sedrah "Noah" will be the text for the Sabbath Discourse this Saturday Morning. At the Friday Evening Services, October 26th, the Rabbi's theme will be a discussion of the Burning of the Reconstructionist Prayer Book, compiled by Rabbi Mordecai M. Kaplan and his colleagues, and his "Excommunication" by certain zealots. This event has created a sensation in Jewish life, and it is sitll being discussed in religious circles. On Sunday Morning, November 4th, at 10:45, the Sunday Morning Services will begin for the sixteenth successive year. The Rabbi's theme will be: "Is Hitler Really Dead?" On Friday Evening, November 2nd, a Welcome to Men and Women in Service who have returned to this country will be extended, and the Sabbath Eve Services will be in their honor. We trust that Service Men and Women will plan with their families to attend these Services of Welcome and Tribute in Congregation Rodeph Sholom. We urge also the observance by our Congregants of the Kiddush Service on Friday evenings in the home.

A MOTHER'S FORGIVENESS

Frau Mathilde Rathenau in a letter to the mother of Ernst Werner Techow, one of the murderers of her son, the illustrious Walther Rathenau in 1922, said:

"In grief unspeakable I give you my hand, you, of all women the most pitiable. Say to your son that in the name and spirit of him he has murdered, I forgive, even as God may forgive, if before an earthly judge he make a full and frank confession of his guilt and before a heavenly one repent. Had he known my son, the noblest man earth bore, he had rather turned the weapon on himself than on him. May these words give peace to your soul."

THE POWER OF FORGIVENESS

In 1940, Ernest Tessier, a member of the French Foreign Legion in North Africa, who proved to be Ernst Werner Techow, greeted Legionnaire Rathenau, a nephew of Walther Rathenau, showed him a sheet of paper turned slightly yellow on which Frau Rathenau's letter to his mother had been written, and said: "You see, Rathenau, my most precious possession is still that letter. It opened a new world to me. In prison I began to read the works of your uncle, one after the other. Later, in the Legion, I continued to study Jewish problems in my spare time. I learned Hebrew in Syria. I discovered that the Nazis had falsified all the facts about the Jews in order to get a pretext for committing excesses. I know how strong their barbarian impulses are, as I too was once obsessed by them. But for eighteen years now my whole life has

been a constant struggle to suppress the evil forces in my soul. Just as Frau Rathenau conquered herself when she wrote that letter of pardon, I have tried to master myself. I only wished I would get an opportunity to right the wrong I've done."

In February, 1941, George W. Herald, who tells the sequel to the history of Walther Rathenau's assassination and Frau Rathenau's noble letter, says: "My inquiries established that by that time Techow had already saved more than seven hundred persons. He was known in Marseilles refugee circles as the 'oneman relief committee." Wherever his name was mentioned it was in a tone of gratitude."

OUR MORTGAGE CAMPAIGN

This past Sunday Mr. Albert M.
