A Reform Jew's Viewpoint Reception to New Congregants

This Saturday Morning, October 27th, at 10:15 NAVY SABBATH SERVICES LIEUT. SOLOMON N. BAZELL, Chaplain Corps, USNR will preach on "WILL PEACE FOLLOW VICTORY?"

This Friday Evening, at 8:15 the Late Sabbath Eve Services for the Synagogue year will begin, and the Rabbi's sermon will deal with the subject now agitating the Jewish religious community, namely, the burning last June of the Sab-bath Prayer Book, compiled by Rabbi Mordecai M. Kaplan and his collaborators. Conservative and Orthodox Rabbis have discussed this action by a few irresponsible fanatics, as well as the "excommunication' of Rabbi Kaplan. This Sat-urday Morning, Navy Sabbath will be observed at our Temple, and Chaplain Solomon N. Bazell of St. Albans' Naval Hospital will be our guest preacher. It is hoped that a large congregation will be present to greet Chaplain Bazell, to hear his message, and to honor our Navy. Children and young people are invited to be, present, and it is hoped that our men-folk will wish to commemorate this national observance by attendance at divine worship. Chaplain Bazell is a stimulating and inspiring preacher and we await his sermon with keen interest.

## COURSE IN JEWISH ART

Under our extended program of adult educational activities, we are planning a course in creative drawing and painting, with particular emphasis on Jewish subject matter. In addition to the creative aspects, each session will start with a discussion and demonstration of the contribution which Jewish artists have made and are making to present day life. There will be occasional exhibits of class room procedure and wider exhibits of the works of leading Jewish artists now in America. The course will be under the personal direction of Miss Eleanor Lust, owner of the Norlust Gallery, and a well-known artist in her own right, having won the Alger Prize in 1938. She is also on the faculty of the Little Red Schoolhouse. The subscription for the course will be nominal, possibly \$5.00, and interested Congregants are urged to enroll through the Temple Office.
