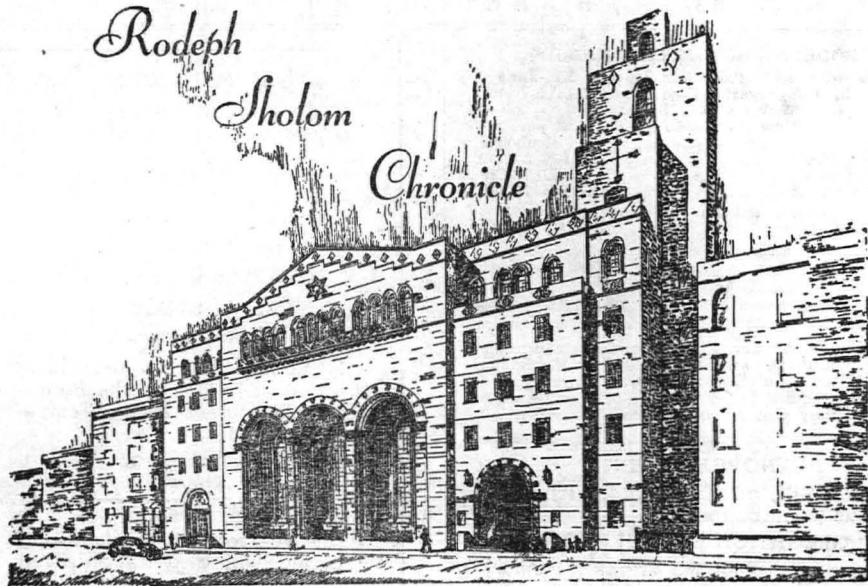

A letter has been received from the Rev. Dr. John Haynes Holmes of the Community Church, addressed to Mr. Joseph Pulvermacher, President of Congregation Rodeph Sholom, which reads, in part, as follows:
