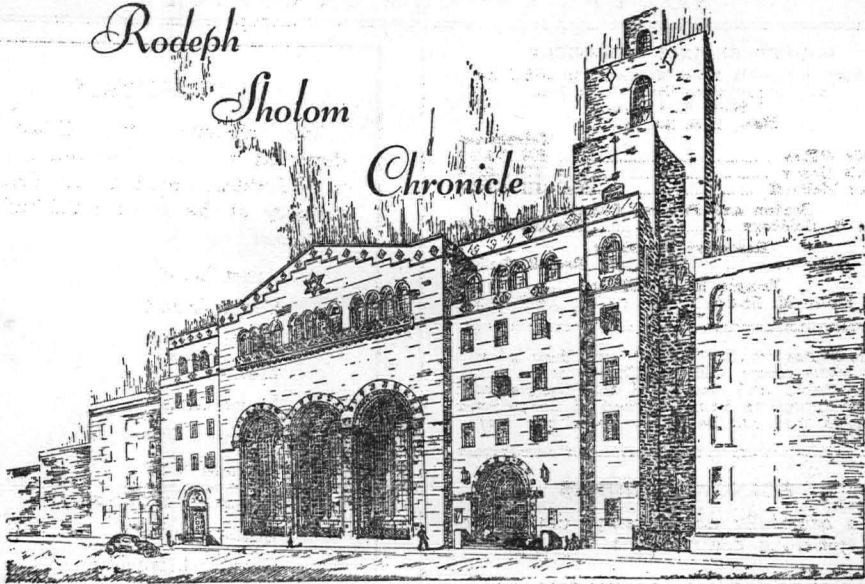

### MR. ALBERT KAHN

This Sunday morning, we will have the honor to welcome to our pulpit Mr. Albert E. Kahn, one of the authors of the widely-known book "Sabotage" in which the subversive elements during the War were made known. Mr. Kahn has written a book entitled: "The Great Conspiracy" in which he reveals the forces which are constantly at work to instigate a war against Russia. There will be an opportunity for written questions following the discourse — Friday Evening, Rabbi Newman will discuss the recent "Fortune" Poll on Anti-Semitism with special reference to "Brotherhood Week" now being observed throughout the country. He will ask whether or not the activities of the National Conference of Christians and Jews and similar interfaith groups are successful, or whether the movement for good-will between religious and racial groups is failing. Sabbath Morning, Rabbi Newman will discuss the moral issues in American life today: who is responsible for the paralysis of our economic order; why is there scarcity amid privation?

This group, known as the 65th Street Alumni Club, is composed of former hostesses who served at the Emanu-El Canteen, and men who have been discharged and who live in New York City. The group meets each Thursday night for a social evening, dancing and refreshments, and men in uniform are invited to attend.
