

Every Monday and Thursday a large number of women met in the Temple House to sew for the poor, the sick, the orphaned, the sufferers from the ravages of war, and beneficiaries of several rehabilitation groups. Work began again on September 9th; and all the women of the Congregation are urged to set aside some time to come with their friends for work with our Sisterhood ladies this season. The S.O.S. of the Joint Distribution Committee has already reached us, telling us that many thousands of warm garments and layettes will be needed throughout the world this coming winter. We are certain that our Rodeph Sholom women will answer this call to service, and will do their share in the continuing world crisis of hunger, cold and homelessness among hundreds of thousands of our people.

AUXILIARY SERVICES FOR THE HIGH HOLYDAYS WITH RABBI, CANTOR AND CHOIR IN MARCUS LOEW AUDITORIUM

Rabbi Saadia Gelb to be Officiating Preacher

Auxiliary High Holyday Services will be held in the Marcus Loew Auditorium Rosh ha-Shanah Eve. at 5:30; Rosh ha-Shanah Morning, at 10; Kol Nidrei Eve. at 7; Yom Kippur Morning at 9:30, and Yizkor Services at 3. Instead of receiving these Services by amplifier from the Temple proper, the Auxiliary Congregation will have the privilege of Services under the direction of Rabbi Saadia Gelb, with a Cantor and a Choir. These Services have been arranged this year in order to provide for the great number of persons who have applied for affiliation and whom we cannot accomodate in the Temple itself. These Overflow Services will be in addition to the Youth Services at the Universalist Community House on West 76th Street. Rabbi Newman will preach Yom Kippur Morning at the Overflow Services.



Information regarding provision for attendance at the Overflow Services can be secured through the Temple Office, ENdicott 2-8800, c/o Mr. Max Feder or Mr. Goldberg.

Rabbi Saadia Gelb, who will be the Officiating Preacher at the Overflow Services, is a graduate of the University of Minnesota, where he received his B.A. and M.A. degrees in Psychology and was elected a member of Phi Beta Kappa, and Delta Sigma Rho, the Debating fraternity. He is a graduate of the School for Jewish Social Work and in 1945 received his degree as Rabbi at the Jewish Institute of Religion. He is a graduate of the Minneapolis Talmud Torah, and was for a number of years Principal of the Bialik School of Hebrew Education in Los Angeles. He is one of the founders of the Ha-Bonim, or Labor Youth Group, and is now the National Educational Director of the Labor Zionist Organization. He was appointed a delegate to the World Youth Congress in London, and is soon to leave for Palestine with his family to pursue his studies for a higher degree at the Hebrew University in Jerusalem in association with the Jewish Institute of Religion.

Rabbi Gelb has been President of the Student Body at the Jewish Institute of Religion, and is one of the most brilliant and promising men of the new generation of American Rabbis. He is a seasoned and eloquent preacher and minister.

We are confident that the Auxiliary Services will prove most inspiring, and will provide admirable opportunities for High Holyday Worship for many hundreds of persons who wish to be under the roof of Rodeph Sholom as

RABBI AVRAHAM SOLTES, ASSOCIATE RABBI OF CONGREGATION RODEPH SHOLOM



Rabbi Newman, Cantor Meltzoff, the officials and Congregants of Rodeph Sholom are pleased and honored to welcome Rabbi Avraham Soltes as Associate Rabbi of our Temple. The selection of Rabbi Soltes was ratified by the Congregation after unanimous recommendation by the Board of Trustees at a special meeting, Tuesday, July 2nd. During the few weeks that he has been active in the duties of his new post Rabbi Soltes has made many friends among the young people and adults, and we wish him a long and happy association with our Congregation.

A native of this City, Rabbi Soltes holds degrees from City College, Columbia University and the Jewish Institute of Religion. He is the son of Dr. Mordecai Soltes, Executive Director of Yeshiva University, and for many years a leader of the work of the Jewish Welfare Board.

Rabbi Soltes was formerly Director of the Hillel Foundation at Cornell University, and also served as a member of the staff on the Cornell United Religious Work, the oldest permanent collegiate inter-religious organization in the country. His most recent post has been Director of the Hillel Foundation at McGill University, Montreal, Canada. During his administrations, Hillel Foundation homes were dedicated at both Cornell and McGill.

At Rodeph Sholom, Rabbi Soltes will supervise the extension work of the Religious School, the youth activities and the adult education program. He will be in charge of our Youth Services during the coming High Holydays. He will cooperate with Rabbi Newman in the preaching and ministry of our synagogue.

Rabbi Soltes will be formally inducted at Special Services to be held in late October after the High Holydays and the Sukkoth Festival. We are delighted to welcome Rabbi Soltes, Mrs. Soltes and their little son, Marnin, into the family of Rodeph Sholom.
