

Religious School Service

A special Rosh ha-Shanah Service for the children of the Religious School, their friends and parents, will be held in the Temple on Sunday Morning, September 14th, at 10:30 o'clock. We urge the children of the school to make every effort to attend. Rabbi Soltes will conduct the Services.

Registration of former pupils will take place on Sunday mornings, September 14th and 21st. The first complete session of the school will be held on Sunday morning September 28th. New registrants may enroll daily through the office of the Executive Secretary, Mr. Max Feder. Prospective pupils must be accompanied by a parent. Mr. Benjamin Sellinger, our Principal, will be in his office daily from 3:30 until 5:30 to discuss school matters with parents and pupils. Rabbi Soltes is at his Temple study daily to confer on Youth and other Temple activities.

Children's Services

Wednesday afternoon, September 24th at 1:15 promptly Children's Services will be held in the Marcus Loew Auditorium of the Temple House. A new Order of Service will be introduced. Children are asked to come at 1:10 and to return to their homes immediately at the close of the Children's Services about an hour later. The cooperation of the parents will be greatly appreciated.

Temple House Services

In the Marcus Loew Auditorium of our Temple House Auxiliary and Youth Services for the High Holydays will be conducted, commencing this Sunday Evening at 5:30. Rabbi Soltes will preach at the Erev Rosh ha-Shanah Services and on Monday Morning at the New Year Day Services which begin at 10 o'clock. Cantor Bernard Loth and a special Choir will conduct the Order of Holyday Music. The young people of our Congregation are joining with adults in these Auxiliary Services, and we trust that a large number of our youth will plan to worship with us in the Temple House.

To Our Parents

Mr. Sellinger, our School Principal, and the Education Committee trust that every child of religious school age will be enrolled as a pupil this year. We have an admirable faculty, and the curriculum of our School has been widely sought by other Synagogues of the country. We cannot lay too great emphasis upon the importance of religious education for the children, and regular and punctual attendance is urged. The cooperation of the fathers and mothers through the Parent-Teachers Association is also essential, and we look forward to a fine year of endeavor on behalf of the Jewish religious idealism of our boys and girls.

Sukkoth Pageant

Sunday morning, September 28th, at 10 o'clock, the pupils of the Religious School will hold their annual Sukkoth Pageant in the Temple. A new program explanatory of the symbols of the Tabernacles festival will be presented. There will be the Pilgrimage March, the Circuits (ha-Kafot) of the Temple with the Scrolls of the Law, and the ceremony of the handing down of the Law from grandfather to father to son.

Yom Kippur Services

Tuesday Evening, September 23rd at 7 o'clock, Kol Nidrei Services will be held in the Temple and Temple House. Day of Atonement Services begin at 9:45 o'clock on Wednesday Morning, September 24th. At 1:15 o'clock Children's Services will be held in the Marcus Loew Auditorium of the Temple House, and at 3 o'clock Yizkor (Memorial) Services will take place. Rabbi Newman's theme for Kol Nidrei Services will be: "Vows That Atone". On Yom Kippur Morning Rabbi Soltes will preach in the Temple, and Rabbi Newman will preach at the Auxiliary Services in the Temple House on the Topic: "The Fear and the Love of God." Rabbi Newman's theme for Yizkor Services will be: "The Kaddish and Its Meaning." Rabbi Soltes will preach in the Temple House Kol Nidrei and at Yizkor Services.
