

THE RABBI'S COLUMN

The discussion regarding the establishment of the headquarters of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations in New York City deserves the attention of every Liberal Jew in the country. Unfortunately a controversy has arisen regarding the recommendation of the Union's Executive Board, and American Reform leaders are being circularized on the subject. It is the opinion of many of us that headquarters for the U.A.H.C. in New York City would in no way derogate from the prestige and centrality of Hebrew Union College in Cincinnati. The consolidation of H. U. C. with the lewish Institute of Religion founded by Rabbi Stephen S. Wise has placed at the disposal of the joint institution the excellent structure at 40 West 68th Street with its excellent facilities. A joint campaign is being conducted for the H.U.C.-J.I.R. whereby greater unity and cooperation in American Reform life is being achieved. The proponents of Union headquarters in New York City point to the fact that the areat domain of Tewry in this area,

numbering more than 2,000,000 persons, has been only superficially cultivated as yet. They declare that unless Reform Judaism ploughs the field deeply in the New York region, it will become the monopoly of Conservative and Orthodox Jewish institutions. The Metropolitan Federation of Reform Synagogues has already established a considerable number of new congregations in the Greater New York area; with the official headquarters of the Sisterhoods, Brotherhoods, Youth and other units of the Union in New York City, even greater strides can be made. Cincinnati, as always, will continue to be a shrine and center of American Reform Judaism, but any further indifference to the potentialities of the New York scene will slacken the progress and influence of American Reform Judaism. Untapped resources of substance and leadership are at hand in the East; shall New York Jewry be the stepchild of the Union? What do you think?
