

A number of pupils of the Religious School will participate in the reading of the Services. It is hoped that a large gathering of parents will be present with the children. When the day comes that we have additional facilities for worship for children, young people and adults, it will be possible to hold our Children's Yom Kippur Service on the Day of Atonement itself, but for this year, at least, to our regret, we must hold it in the form of a pre-Atone-ment Day Service. Won't you bear this in mind when we turn to you for cooperation?
