

#### LEAGUE

The first open meeting of the Rodeph Sholom League will be held in the Marcus Loew Auditorium on Tuesday evening, October 26th. The Rev. Karl M. Chworowsky, Minister of the Flatbush Unitarian Church, will address the group on the subject, "A Christian Looks at Israel." Rev. Chworowsky is a native of Russia, the son of a Lutheran minister, and having served Lutheran churches for more than twenty years, is now a Unitarian parson. He has taught in American colleges and universities (German language and literature), has been a radio reader for years under the name of Don Carlos, the Poet Philosopher, and has spent most of his almost forty years in the ministry seeking to improve relations between white and black and between Jew and Christian. He is a member of the Executive Board of the American Christian Palestine Committee, a frequent contributor to liberal Christian and Jewish journals, and spends much of his time speaking for Israel.
