"Dr. Pritchett on Palestine"

Dr. Pritchett, of the Carnegie Founda-tion for the Endowment of Peace, has just published a report on Palestine, in which he charges that the work of the Zionists in Palestine is doomed to failure, that the attempt to establish a Jewish homeland is stirring up trouble in the Orient, that the Arabs will never be reconciled, etc., etc.

The Rabbi will deal with these charges at the Round Table next Monday, December 13, at twelve noon at the Statler Ho-tel, in Parlor 4. He will also continue the discussion on "Russian Bolshevism," for which there was not sufficient time last

week.

Proposed Constitutional Amendment

The following are proposed amendments to the Constitution and By-Laws of the Euclid Avenue Temple, to be voted on next Tuesday, December 14, at the Annual Meeting of the Congregation.

ARTICLE II, Section 2, A and B shall be amended so as to read as follows:

The Board of Trustees shall consist of thirty (30) men, to be elected as hereinafter set forth for terms of five years. and in addition thereto (a) one man to be elected for a term of one year selected by the Men's Club, whose name shall be submitted to the Board of Trustees at the first meeting of said Board in the month of October in each year, and when approved by the Board of Trustees shall be placed upon the ballot for election at the annual meeting of the congregation. Three (3) women shall be nominated by the organization known as the Sisterhood of the Euclid Avenue Temple, for a term of one (1) year, one (1) of said women to be the then president of the said Sisterhood; and the qualifications of said three (3) members shall be that they shall be members of the Euclid Avenue Temple, or be one of the privileged family of a member. The said nominations shall be submitted by the said Sisterhood to the Board of Trustees at the first meeting of said Board in the month of October in each year, and when approved by the Board of Trustees shall be placed upon the ballot for election at the annual meeting of the Congregation.
