### Our Rabbi Home

We are happy to welcome Rabbi Brickner home from his three and one-half months' absence from the city.

Rabbi Brickner visited France, Germany, Poland, Russia, Turkey, Greece, Egypt, Palestine, Italy and Switzerland. While abroad, he made an intensive study of conditions in Russia and Palestine. He promises shortly to report on his observations, which ought to prove exceedingly interesting to the congregation.

### Welcome Mr. Brilliant

The Board of Trustees beg to announce the appointment of Mr. Nathan Brilliant as Educational Director of our Temple, and we take pleasure in welcoming him into our midst.

Our new Educational Director, who is 33 years of age, is a graduate of the College of City of New York (1918), and for a number of years has taken postgraduate work in the field of education at Teachers College, Columbia University. He brings to his work in Cleveland, years of experience in the field of religious education, both as a teacher and executive. He has also taught in the high schools of New York, and for many years was Director of Club work and other social activities in the leading Jewish institutions of New York. For the past three years, Mr. Brilliant has been head counsellor of the Central Jewish Institute Camp, one of the largest camps in America.

We trust that he will find his work with us congenial. We are looking forward to his contribution to the educational and social life of the various branches of our temple activity, with high anticipation.

### Sabbath Services

Rabbi Brickner will conduct Sabbath Services this week on Friday at 5:30 P. M., and Saturday at 10:30 A. M. He will preach at the Saturday service.

The full choir will render the musical program.

It is anticipated that a large congregation will be present to welcome Rabbi Brickner back to his pulpit.

Miss Marjorie Fishel will preach the sermonette on Rosh Hashonah, and Melvin Loeb on Yom Kippur. A special children's service will also be read by members of the last confirmation class. Rabbi Brickner will deliver appropriate sermonettes.

All the children of the religious school are expected to attend. The Rabbi is particularly anxious that the older pupils shall be present. The children will occupy the center of the temple. Parents who accompany them are kindly requested to take seats in the rear or side sections of the temple.
