Lecture Course

The Lecture Course Committee wishes to announce that Mr. Lewis Browne, whose wit has made him one of the most popular speakers on the American lecture platform, and whose books have been among the best sellers during the past ten years, will occupy the place scheduled for Dr. Arthur E. Morgan, President of Antioch College, who was unexpectedly called to California and requested that he be released.

Sunday Services

"Is the Modern Woman a Failure?" will be Rabbi Brickner's subject next Sunday morning in the lecture service which will be broadcast over Station WEAR. The rabbi will answer some very fundamental questions which are arising in the minds of many, as to:

What have women done with their newly-won rights?

What are women doing with their increased leisure?

How is the independence of women affecting marriage and the home?

Should a woman follow her career after marriage?

Is woman likely to become the superior sex?

Is she, intellectually, man's equal?

A congregation that filled the temple listened last Sunday to Rabbi Brickner's fearless championship of the abolition of capital punishment.

He is in receipt of numerous letters of praise from the invisible congregation.

He held that "capital punishment had never acted as a deterrent to crime and advocated the indeterminate sentences with punishment to fit the criminal, not the crime. He urged that a criminal be sent to prison like a patient is sent to the hospital—to remain until cured. The sentencing power in criminal cases of homicide should be taken away from trial judges and juries, and placed in the hands of a state board of high salaried experts consisting of a physician, a psychologist, a lawyer and a social worker."

Sabbath Services

Next Saturday, Rabbi Brickner will conduct the services and preach a special sermonette for the children entitled "Children as Builders."

The first Sabbath of each month is set aside as a Children's Service for the Religious School. All pupils of the school, from the fourth grade up, are required to attend, and a record of such attendance is kept by the class teacher. Attendance at Children's Sabbath Services once a month, will count as an additional Sunday toward the pin record, and also to make up for an absence on a Sunday morning. Let your children bring you to the services.
